Pastor's Point of View...

Jesus said, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers...for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers...with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come."(Mk 10:30)

The above gospel verse presents to us the irony of giving up everything for the gospel. There is a hundred times more blessings, wholeness and restoration to follow!
