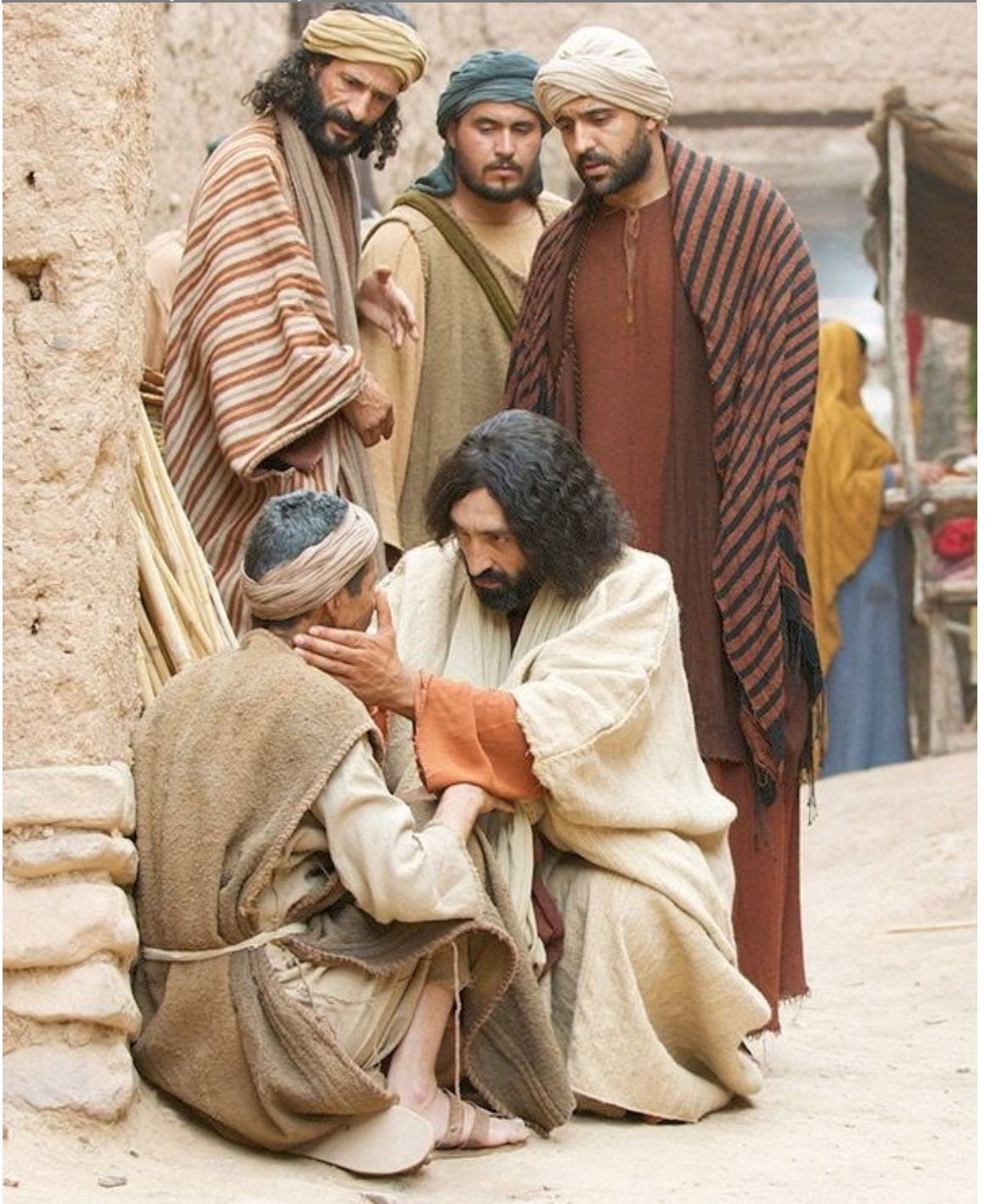

Pastor's Point of View...*On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." (Mk 10:47)*

The prospect of losing one's sight due to cataract, illness or accident is scary. Was Bartimaeus' blindness inborn or acquired? No matter what happened, blindness shuts the 'window of the soul' in everyone. Bartimaeus regained his sight through his persistence in calling out for Jesus' mercy. He addressed Jesus as the son of David from what he perhaps learned from Timaeus, his father. And who is Jesus for us today? We can talk of spiritual blindness as the individual's inability to discern and act according to the kingdom values that Jesus taught and lived. This can be blindness to someone else's point of view; someone else's needs; someone else's positive qualities, etc... We can also acquire communal blindness in our inability to address those areas that need healing or growth and transformation. It takes faith-filled parishioners, strong and consistent in their belief and conviction to see that on-going study and growth in the faith is needed and that we need to think bigger and see further than the ordinary, mundane existence we may be getting used to. Let us then keep affirming and appreciating those we see in our parish family as role models and leaders in moving the parish forward according to our vision, mission and goals to accomplish. The first and only step towards healing though, is to recognize that we are blind, considering all the metaphorical usage of the word. This is like someone suffering from addiction who finally admits the addiction and decides to change.

Furthermore, when Bartimaeus was healed and restored, he did not go home but rather followed Jesus on the way, with a new way of seeing the world, doing the works of Jesus as a missionary disciple. When we are enlightened from a productive gathering, meeting or assembly, our vision and mission to the world as an individual and as a faith community somehow gets refreshed and renewed. Enlivened to move forward with our church building project from the meetings with the diocesan representatives and the parish family, we now can truly serve and love Jesus Christ in one another. St. Faustina, pray for us!
