Pastor's Point of View...*For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." (Mk 12:44)*

Two widows in today's set of readings (first and the gospel) manifested an outstanding faith and trust in God's providence. Such stellar display of faith in feeding a stranger with one's last ounce of food and in giving to the temple treasury everything one had sets the standard for us today concerning the way we give: giving is not giving until it hurts! Individually, we can ask ourselves questions like: When have I made that leap of faith in the face of utter want and deprivation? Have I ever given more than I could afford? As a parish family we may ask: Who among us have been regular contributors and are considered the backbone of the parish finances? Are they recognized and appreciated enough for such a regular, sometimes sacrificial gift? As parishioners of St. Faustina each one of us may have evolved in our understanding of giving. A deeper look would help us conclude that true giving is simply a manifestation of one's deep love and trust in God. Hence, giving can be sacrificial at times when we give more than we can afford. There are many angles to giving that is worthwhile considering here: charitable giving which ideally begins at home; giving comes from a responsible stewardship of material resources entrusted to one's care; giving with an openness to the Holy Spirit in planning for future needs; etc... So I thank everyone who's been giving regularly and sacrificially to St. Faustina's parish for her daily maintenance and most especially for the donations given to St. Faustina's church construction fund. Once the mechanics are in place we will launch a major capital campaign or fundraising to add on to what we already have so that future expenses towards mortgage and maintenance will be manageable and easier to handle. On behalf of the parish, our administrative ministries will have to be in full, honest and transparent collaboration with the Foundation of the Orlando Diocese. Seeing all these as a labor of love for God's church and Christ's mission on earth, we will strive to have the needed resources and the corresponding will to move forward.

November is a month of remembrance for all our loved ones who gave up their lives for freedom, family and country. But also, this month is a "welcome back" month to all winter parishioners here at St. Faustina's. If you happen to be a winter parishioner please alert the office and contact person(s) in charge for the liturgical and administrative ministries so we can incorporate you in the schedule as you serve in any of those. Your return to us also signals the fact that the weather has just begun to 'chill' a bit allowing us to do more outdoor gardening and manual projects. It's indeed heartwarming to know that our parish membership is increasing in number, but more inspiringly so as our communal prayer and ministry gatherings multiply. Bible study begins this month and so will our hospitality gatherings after Sunday masses at the back office hall. No matter how little space we may have, we will create even more space for welcome and growth in the parish of our hearts! St. Faustina, pray for us...Jesus, I trust in You!
