Pastor's Message/Mensaje del Pastor

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary/Asuncion de la Santisima Virgen Maria

And Mary said: "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor in his lowly servant." (Lk 1:4-5)

Today we celebrate the fact that Mary was assumed, body and soul, into heaven. Christians in both the East and the West have a long tradition of celebrating the dormition ("falling asleep") of Mary. In large parts because of these long-standing liturgical traditions, Pope Pius XII defined the doctrine of the Assumption of Mary on November 1, 1950. In his encyclical *Munificentissimus Deus* (Generous God), he also cited Mary's intimate connection with her Son—the new Adam—and his victory over sin and death.

To understand the end of Mary's life, one will have to fully appreciate the beginning of it. From the moment of her conception by Saint Anne and Saint Joachim, Mary was free from sin... Years later, when the Angel Gabriel approached this young maiden from Nazareth, her obedient "yes" was made possible by her deep faith.

Our life of faith, too, must be sustained in prayer—both personal and communal prayer. Our participation in the liturgy both expresses and nourishes our faith (Catechism, 1123). Making time in our day for personal prayer, too, enables us to appreciate God's abiding presence and places us in deeper communion with him. If we follow Mary's example—a routine of prayer, a habit of praise, and total submission to God's will—we will join in her heavenly rewards.

Y María dijo: "Mi alma proclama la grandeza del Señor; mi espíritu se regocija en Dios mi Salvador, porque ha mirado con gracia a su humilde sierva". (Lc 1, 45)

Hoy celebramos el hecho de que María fué asunta, en cuerpo y alma, al cielo. Los cristianos tanto de Oriente como de Occidente tienen una larga tradición de celebrar la dormición ("dormirse") de María. En gran parte debido a estas tradiciones litúrgicas de larga data, el Papa Pío XII definió la doctrina de la Asunción de María el 1 de noviembre de 1950. En su encíclica *Munificentissimus Deus* (Dios generoso), también citó la conexión íntima de María con su Hijo: el nuevo Adán, y su victoria sobre el pecado y la muerte.

Para comprender el final de la vida de María, habrá que apreciar plenamente el comienzo. Desde el momento de su concepción por Santa Ana y San Joaquín, María estaba libre de pecado ... Años más tarde, cuando el ángel Gabriel se acercó a esta joven doncella de Nazaret, su "sí" obediente fue posible gracias a su profunda fé.

Nuestra vida de fé también debe sustentarse en la oración, tanto personal como comunitaria. Nuestra participación en la liturgia expresa y nutre nuestra fé (Catecismo, 1123). Hacer tiempo en nuestro día para la oración personal también nos permite apreciar la presencia permanente de Dios y nos coloca en una comunión más profunda con Él. Si seguimos el ejemplo de María, una rutina de oración, un hábito de alabanza y una total sumisión a la voluntad de Dios, nos uniremos a su recompensa celestial.

Él respondió: "Más bien, bienaventurados los que oyen la palabra de Dios y la guardan". (Lc 11, 28)

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary & Our Lady of Knock

This week we celebrate two feast days for Our Blessed Mother.

On August 15, the feast of the Assumption commemorates Mary going to Heaven, which is a Holy Day of Obligation. Mary was born without original sin, so she did not suffer its consequences, which is death and burial.

Our Lady of Knock happened in Ireland in the evening of August 21, 1879, in County Mayo, which occurred six days after the feast of the Assumption.

Mary McLoughlin, who was the rectory housekeeper, saw a light on the south wall of the Church and three figures. She thought that they were replacement statues for the ones which were destroyed in a storm. She then went to her friend Margaret's house. A half hour later, Mary decided to leave and Margaret's sister, Mary, agreed to walk home with her. As they were passing the Church, they saw a vision very clearly. Standing outside from the gable, the Blessed Mother, St. Joseph and St. John appeared. The Blessed Mother's figure was life-size, while the others were smaller. They stood a little away from the gable wall, about two feet from the ground. Behind St. John was an altar with a lamb and a cross and Angels nearby. Mary stood with her eyes toward Heaven, wearing a white cloak and a large Crown. It was a rainy night, but the figures and the Church wall were dry.

While Mary McLoughlin stared at the apparition, Mary Byrne ran home to her family. Soon a crowd gathered and everyone saw the apparition, from ages five to seventy-five. But the parish priest, the Very Reverend Bartholomew Aloysius Cavanagh who was also the Archdeacon of the Diocese did not come out. His absence was a disappointment to the devout villagers. Patrick Hill and John Curry were witnesses. Patrick said that "The figures were fully rounded, as if they had a body and life. They did not speak, but as we drew near, they retreated a little towards the wall." He said that he was close enough to see the words in the book held by the figure of St. John. An older woman named Bridget Trench drew closer to hug Mary's feet, but the figure seemed always beyond reach. Others out in the field and some distance away saw a strange light around the church. This vision lasted for three hours and then faded. The next day a group of villagers went to see the priest, who accepted their sightings and wrote to the diocesan Bishop of Tuam. The Church set up a commission to interview several of the people claiming to witness the apparition, but the diocese was not convinced, with some members of the commission ridiculing the visionaries. The ordinary people were not so skeptical and the pilgrimages to Knock began in 1880.

Two years later, Archbishop John Joseph Lynch of Toronto made a visit to the parish and claimed he had been healed by the Virgin of Knock. Mary Byrne married, raised six children and lived her entire life in Knock. When she was interviewed again in 1936 at the age of eighty-six, her account was the same as the first report that she gave in 1879.

The village of Knock was transformed because thousands came to commemorate the vision and to ask for healing for others and themselves. In 1976 a new church, Our Lady Queen of Ireland, was built to accommodate the crowds. Over two thousand people can fit in the new Church because each year more than half million visitors come to pray to the Blessed Mother. The Church approved the apparition in 1971 as being quite probable, although it was never formally stated. The Shrine of Knock is opened year-round. In 1994 three life-sized statues were erected of Our Lady, St. Joseph and St. John.

On November 1, 1945, All Saints' Day, Pope Pius XII blessed the banner of Knock and decorated it with a special medal. On Candlemas Day in 1960, Pope John XXIII gave a special candle to Knock. Pope Paul VI blessed the foundation stone for the Basilica of Our Lady, Queen of Ireland, at Knock on June 6, 1974/ Pope John Paul II visited the shrine on September 30, 1979, to commemorate the 100th year anniversary of the apparition. During that visit, the Pope spoke to the sick and nursing staff, celebrated Mass, established the Shrine church as a Basilica, presented the candle and the Golden Rose to the shrine and knelt in prayer at the apparition wall. Pope Francis visited the shrine at Knock on August 26, 2018, as part of a visit to Ireland for the Ninth World Meeting of families. On March 19, 2021, Pope Francis designated the Knock Shrine in Ireland as an International Marian and Eucharistic shrine. Mother Teresa of Calcutta visited the Shrine in June 1993.

This feast Day is celebrated on August 17.
