# PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

*You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. (Mk. 12:30)*

What does it mean to love God in this way? Surely it means that God should be our "center." Our life should revolve around him. He should be first in our thoughts, in our actions, and in our hearts. It means we must nurture our spiritual relationship with God through daily prayer, by learning all we can about him, by reading Scripture, and through participation in the sacraments.

In the same way, we must love others. This is, after all, not merely a suggestion. It is a command. Loving our neighbor is not passive. It requires action. It calls us to reach out and provide for the needs of others; to share our time, our talents, and our resources with our neighbor; to invite them into God's embrace and give comfort and love freely to those who need it.

Clearly, following this command is not always easy, but it is expected of us, nonetheless. Sometimes it requires forgiveness and putting aside judgment. Fortunately, when we ask, God will provide all the grace and strength we need to put his command in action.

*For the law appoints men subject to weakness to be high priests, but the word of the oath, which was taken after the law, appoints a son, who has been made perfect forever. (Heb 7:28)*

Amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma, con toda tu mente y con todas tus fuerzas. El segundo es éste: Amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo (Marcos 12:30).

¿Qué significa amar a Dios de esta manera? Seguramente significa que Dios debería ser nuestro "centro". Nuestra vida debe girar en torno a él. Él debe ser el primero en nuestros pensamientos, acciones y corazones. Significa que debemos nutrir nuestra relación espiritual con Dios a través de la oración diaria, aprendiendo todo lo que podamos sobre él, leyendo las Escrituras y participando en los sacramentos.

De la misma manera, debemos amar a los demás. Después de todo, esto no es simplemente una sugerencia. Es una orden. Amar al prójimo no es pasivo. Requiere acción. Nos llama a tender la mano y satisfacer las necesidades de los demás; compartir nuestro tiempo, nuestros talentos y nuestros recursos con nuestro vecino; para invitarlos al abrazo de Dios y dar consuelo y amor gratuitamente a quienes lo necesitan.

Claramente, seguir este mandato no siempre es fácil, pero de todos modos se espera de nosotros. A veces requiere perdón y dejar de lado el juicio. Afortunadamente, cuando le pedimos, Dios proporcionará toda la gracia y la fuerza que necesitamos para poner en práctica su mandato.

Porque la ley nombra sumos sacerdotes a los hombres débiles, pero la palabra del juramento, que fue hecho conforme a la ley, designa a un hijo, que ha sido perfeccionado para siempre. (Hebreos 7:28)





# ST. MARTIN DE PORRES

Juan Martin de Porres Velazquez was born in Lima, Peru on December 9, 1579, the illegitimate son of a Spaniard and a freed slave from Panama, of African or maybe Native Indian descent. A short time later his father abandoned Martin, his mother and his younger sister, leaving them in poverty. Martin left school to apprentice with a barber/surgeon where he would learn to cut hair and the medical arts. As he grew older, Martin experienced a lot of bias for being of mixed race. At that time in Peru, a law was established stating that all descendants of Africans or Indians were not permitted to become members of any religious order.



Martin prayed for his vocation and became a volunteer with the Dominicans of the Holy Rosary Priory in Lima performing menial tasks in the monastery. He was allowed to wear their habit and live in the religious community, eventually moving up as the church officer in charge of distributing money to the poor. During his time in the Community, Martin did barbering and healing and also worked in the kitchen, doing laundry and cleaning. After eight more years, Martin was allowed to take his vows as a member of the Third Order of Saint Dominic by the Prior Juan de Lorenzana, who disregarded the law restricting Martin based on race. However, many members in the Holy Rosary Order called Martin horrible names and mocked him for being illegitimate and descending from slaves.


Martin became a Dominican lay brother in 1603 at the age of 24. Ten years later, he was assigned to the infirmary where he would remain in charge until his death. He was famous for how he took care of the sick, even in the most difficult situations. He was praised for his unconditional protection of all people, regardless of race or wealth, be it Spanish nobles or African slaves. He didn't care if the person was dirty or diseased and would welcome them into his own home.

Martin had great love for God and all of God's gifts. He had many extraordinary abilities, including aerial flights, bilocation, instant cures, miraculous knowledge, spiritual knowledge and an excellent relationship with animals. He also founded an orphanage for abandoned children and slaves, was known for raising dowries for young girls in a short amount of time and created a hospital for cats and dogs. During an epidemic in Lima, he took care of the many friars who had become ill. They were isolated in a distant section of the priory, being kept away from the healthy friars and left unattended. Martin ignored the rules and gave them medical attention, for which he was disciplined.

Martin was a great friend of both St. Juan Macías, a fellow Dominican lay brother and St. Rose of Lima, a lay Dominican.

In January of 1639, Martin became very sick with chills, fevers and tremors causing him agonizing pain. He suffered almost a year with this illness until he passed away on November 3, 1639. Now he was widely known and accepted by people speaking of his medical skills and caring for the sick. After his death, he performed many miracles. When he was exhumed twenty five years later, his body had a pleasant fragrance and he was still intact.

St. Martin de Porres was beatified by Pope Gregory XVI on October 29, 1837 and canonized by Pope John XXIII on May 6, 1962. He is the patron saint of people of mixed race, innkeepers, barbers, public health workers and all those seeking racial harmony. His feast day is November 3.
