# Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. (Jn 10:2-4)

We all know we should follow Jesus. We have been told how he longs to lead us to the goodness for which we were created. But many of us struggle with the next part - actually hearing his voice and following. How do we recognize his voice? How do we quiet all of those voices of "strangers" that Jesus mentions? How do we learn to follow as we ought?



Just as sheep learn the voice of their shepherd - through time, proximity, and practice. The sheep hear the shepherd's voice every day, time and time again. Jesus Christ, our Good Shepherd, is calling us today. That is why we celebrate Mass. We take time to read and reflect on Scripture. And perhaps we intentionally seek out holy friends, and make the effort to speak about God and faith with them.

Even if, like sheep, we have gone astray, we gather together at Mass; we have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of our souls. May Christ, in the Eucharist, teach us to hear his voice more clearly, draw us closer to him, and protect us from all evil.

By his wounds you have been healed. For you had gone astray like sheep, but you have now returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls. (1Pet. 2:25)

Pero quien entra por la puerta es el pastor de las ovejas. El portero lo abre para él, y las ovejas oyen su voz, mientras el pastor llama a sus propias ovejas por su nombre y las conduce. Cuando ha expulsado a todos los suyos, camina delante de ellos, y las ovejas lo siguen, porque reconocen su voz. (Jn 10,2-4)

Todos sabemos que debemos seguir a Jesús. Se nos ha dicho cómo anhela llevarnos a la bondad para la cual fuimos creados. Pero muchos de nosotros luchamos con la siguiente parte: escuchar su voz y seguirlo. ¿Cómo reconocemos su voz? ¿Cómo acallamos todas esas voces de "extraños" que Jesús menciona? ¿Cómo aprendemos a seguir como debemos?

Así como las ovejas aprenden la voz de su pastor, a través del tiempo, la proximidad y la práctica. Las ovejas oyen la voz del pastor todos los días, una y otra vez. Jesucristo, nuestro Buen Pastor, nos llama hoy. Por eso celebramos la Misa. Nos tomamos el tiempo para leer y reflexionar sobre las Escrituras. Y tal vez intencionalmente buscamos amigos santos, y hacemos el esfuerzo de hablar acerca de Dios y la fe con ellos.

Incluso si, como ovejas, nos hemos extraviado, nos reunimos en la Misa; *Ahora hemos regresado al pastor y guardián de nuestras almas*. Que Cristo, en la Eucaristía, nos enseñe a escuchar su voz con mayor claridad, nos acerque a Él y nos proteja de todo mal.

Por sus heridas has sido sanado. Porque os habíais extraviado como ovejas, pero ahora habéis vuelto al pastor y guardián de vuestras almas. (1Pedro 2:25)

# Weekly Reflection

# **Good Shepherd Sunday**

Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd calls to us in every one of today's readings. We are the sheep, He is our Master, our Savior, and forgiver of sins.

The apostle Luke is quite direct in the First Reading from Acts. "...God has made both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." (Acts 2:14) Luke then reports that Peter called on all to repent and have their sins forgiven. He tells them to follow the call of our Lord God, Jesus Christ.

Follow the call of the Lord. This phrase reminded me of a fantastic animated short video about David the shepherd. A very young lamb is seen frolicing about and gets itself into a very precarious situation. David, an expert with a slingshot and a faith-filled youth, is able to rescue the lamb. The two wind up very far from the rest of the herd. The scene cuts to a late evening shot of the now sleeping herd while a very impatient ewe paces, stops, turns her ear and hears a familiar voice singing a song of praise and worship while carrying the lamb in his tunic.



I'm reminded how we are all the lambs and sheep. Some easily recognize the voice of the One who cares for them. There are many others, possibly even our youthful selves, our kids [pun intended] or a person with not as much wisdom or experience as I may have, who don't or can't recognize that there is danger or harm in their path.

The Gospel is clear: "I am the gate for the sheep... Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture." (John 10:7,9)

I have to be very intentional in all aspects of life; thoughts, words and deeds. It is up to me to be vigilant in my desire to hear the Master's voice in every situation throughout the day and night. I need to hear His voice in my mind so I am not



stolen away by a thief or robber, who would lead me astray and abandon or slaughter me. The Good Shepherd is there for me to turn to in every situation. He is there to forgive my erring way and to heal me. He is the Truth, the Way, the gate to everlasting life. Blessed be God in all His designs! Amen! Alleluia.



#### St. Dominic Savio

Domenico Savio was born on April 2, 1842 in Chieri, Sardinia Italy, one of ten children. His parents were Carlo and Brigitta Savio, both poor and pious hard workers. They returned to their native town, Murialdo near Castelnovo d'Asti when Dominic was two. He was very devout as a child, praying by age four, saying Grace at mealtimes and



helping with chores. When he was five, Dominic attended daily Mass and became an altar server. He made his First Communion at age seven when the norm at that time was age twelve and went to Confession often. He said that his of First Communion Day - "That was the happiest and most wonderful day of my life."

The following words are from Dominic's book for First Communion:

Resolutions made by me, Dominic Savio, in the year 1849, on the day of my First Communion, at the age of seven.

- 1. I will go to Confession often, and as frequently to Holy Communion as my confessor allows.
- 2. I wish to sanctify the Sundays and festivals in a special manner.
- 3. My friends shall be Jesus and Mary.
- 4. Death rather than sin

At age ten, Dominic went to a school three miles away. He was an outstanding student and was recommended to speak with Father John Bosco, meeting together in October of 1854. Dominic told Father John that he wanted to become a priest. Father gave him a copy of the Catho-

lic Readings and asked him to recite a certain page by heart and explain the meaning for the next day, but Dominic did this in the next ten minutes. John then realized that Dominic was remarkable and agreed to take him to Turin for studies at the Oratory. Dominic studied and obeyed the rules, listened to sermons and asked for more information on subjects he found challenging. He was respectful to his teachers and chose good friends, who were also diligent.

Dominic was always at prayer, making visits to Church and was noted for his good ways. Six months later, Dominic heard a speech about sainthood. He concluded "That it is God's will that each one should become a saint, that it is easy to become a saint and that there is a great reward waiting in heaven for those who try to become saints." Now he was inspired to become a saint but wasn't sure how to do this. John told Dominic to just be himself.

When he learned the words "belonging to God," Dominic increased his desire to achieve sainthood. His spiritual growth grew under John's guidance, showing him common sense and ordinary heroism.

Dominic wanted to do physical penances, but John told him to stop this for health reasons. He said the best penance would be to do his work with humility and perfection, doing everything for the glory of God. From that day, Dominic never complained, but did what was needed. Dominic knew that he would die young, so he started the Sodality of Mary Immaculate to obtain Mary's protection in life and at death.

When Dominic died on March 9, 1857, he was almost fifteen years old. Pope Pius XII beatified him on March 5, 1950 and he was canonized also by Pope Pius XII on June 12, 1954. Dominic was declared a saint because he lived a holy life. He was not a martyr but was noted for his devotion and piety. John Bosco, who would also become a saint, thought very highly of Dominic and wrote a biography about him. This book, *The Life of Dominic Savio*, was an important factor for Dominic's sainthood. Another student of St. John Bosco was Luigi Orione, who is also a canonized saint.

St. Dominic Savio is the patron saint of choir boys, juvenile delinquents & falsely accused people. His feast day is May 6.
