## Weekly Reflection

## **Share the Good News**

How exciting, that we are called to share in the inheritance of God, being chosen to spread His message of love and



hope! The word "Catholic" comes from a Greek word meaning "universal" or "spreading widely in the whole world". First coined by St. Ignatius, the Church is universal because Christ is continuously present in her. As Catholics, we are called to have Christ within us, being filled with the Holy Spirit and being "not people of the book, but people of the living word." We are not to live in passive reflection but active service amongst one another.

Who can you lead to Christ through sharing the Gospel? Make a goal of picking a person or group every year to speak to. Someday, when face to face with God after this life, He will ask us, who did you bring with you to heaven?

Today, let us pray: "Lord, help us to go and make disciples. May others see Christ in each of us." Amen!

## **Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Without Cost**

Part of being a believer is knowing that God keeps his promises. And how do we know that? Because he has

kept them in the past. If we lose hope or begin to doubt whether he will help us, we remember what he has already done. That's what Paul is talking about in the second reading. Christ died for us when we were sinners, so Paul concludes that now that we have been saved from sin, we will also be saved from death. So now we are free from sin and death. Isn't that enough?

Jesus shows that there is still more that God can do. When he saw the crowds in today's gospel, he pitied them because they were "like sheep without a shepherd." They seemed to need leaders, someone who could show them the way to God. So Jesus responds in two ways.

First, he teaches his disciples to pray for more leaders. What he means is that if people are to lead the Church, they must be sent by God. They are not elected by popular vote. They are "elected" or called by God to serve. Jesus is teaching us to pray for Church leaders today. We



can pray for all who have leadership roles, that they are filled with wisdom and strength. Jesus also teaches us to pray for vocations to religious life.

The second thing Jesus does is to send the twelve apostles out to proclaim the kingdom and cure diseases. He



shows us that along with prayer, we need to take action. This may mean offering our help to parish leaders, serving a term on the parish council, or encouraging our children to consider a religious vocation.

Why should we do these things? Remember what Paul said about God saving us from sin and death. God gives these gifts without cost. He simply asks us to pass on that

good news of salvation. That is what leadership in the Church is all about.

## St. Aloysius Gonzaga

Aloysius de Gonzaga was born on March 9, 1568 in Castiglione, Italy in the Republic of Venice. He was the eldest of eight children born to a well off family. His father was Ferrante de Gonzaga, the Marquis of Castiglione and his mother was Dona Marta de Santena, a lady-in-waiting to Isabel, the wife of King Philip II of Spain. His first spoken words spoken were "Jesus and Mary."

Aloysius was the first born son so he was in line to inherit his father's title and become a Marquis. Since his father

was also in the military service to Philip II, he expected Aloysius to follow this path, giving his son a set of miniature guns at the age of four. By the age of seven Aloysius began strict religious practices, but he did accompany his father on training expeditions so he could learn the military life. When Aloysius was eight, he and his brother Rodolfo were sent to Florence to serve at the court of the Grand Duke of Medici. He was to receive further education there, but became sick with kidney disease, which would continue for the rest of his life.

At nine years old, he thought about a religious life and when he was thirteen he knew he wanted to be a Jesuit, making a vow of perpetual virginity. He would keep his eyes lowered in the presence of women to avoid temptation. Aloysius received his First Communion from Cardinal Charles Borromeo, who would also become a saint.

Aloysius avoided a social life and spent time in prayer and reading about the lives of the saints. He was appointed a page in Spain, but he still kept up his devotions and austerities. His family brought him back to Italy, where he taught catechism to the poor. He considered joining the Capuchins, but then decided to join the Jesuits.

His mother agreed to a religious life for him, but wanted him to become a priest and ultimately a bishop. If he became a Jesuit, he would have to renounce his inheritance and status, but Aloysius was never interested in position or wealth, dreaming of becoming a missionary. His father was furious and tried to prevent him from being a Jesuit, but finally Aloysius joined the Jesuits at the age of eighteen after convincing his father. He soon discovered that the novitiate was not as strict as he was.

He loved the angels. His own guardian angel was very dear and real to Aloysius, leading him ask for aid three times during each day. His health issues were now further compromised by a skin disease, bad headaches and insomnia.

Aloysius took his vows of chastity, poverty and obedience on November 25, 1587 and was noted for his asceticism.

While he was a student at the Roman College, Aloysius served in a hospital in Milan during the plague of 1587 and received his minor orders in 1588, studying theology. In 1590, he had a vision of the Archangel Gabriel who told Aloysius that he would die within the year. He eventually contacted the disease and died on June 21, 1591 at the age of twenty three.

Aloysius received his last rites from another priest who would become a saint, Robert Bellarmine, who was also his spiritual director. The last word Aloysius said was "Jesus." This prompted Robert to write a biography of Aloysius.

Aloysius was beatified in 1605 by Pope Paul V and canonized on December 31, 1726 by Pope Benedict XIII.

Pope Benedict XIII named St. Aloysius the patron of youth in 1729, an action that was confirmed by Pope Pius XI in 1926. St. Aloysius Gonzaga is also the patron saint of students, plague victims, AIDS sufferers and their caregivers and the town of Valmontone. His feast day is June 21.
