

Deacon Cris Stout, formerly of Corpus Christi in Celebration, will be joining St. Faustina the weekend of August 5-6. When you see him, please extend him and his wife, Sharon, the warm Christian "Welcome and Love" that is the tradition and reputation of our parish.

Deacon Cris was born in Miami, Florida on October 20, 1952.

He attended the University of Florida, graduating with a BS degree in Business Management and the MBA program at Pennsylvania State University. After Penn State, Deacon Cris worked for Ford Motor Company at their world headquarters in Dearborn, Michigan, and then for Champion Home Builders in Dryden, Michigan.

Deacon Cris returned to Miami to work for a John Deere construction equipment dealer and then acquired partial ownership in the John Deere

dealership in Tampa. The dealership was sold in 1994 and Deacon Cris entered the commercial real estate market and served as a banker.

In 2007, Deacon Cris joined St. Lawrence in Tampa as parish manager and retired from there in 2020. He served an additional two years as parish manager of St. Jerome in Largo, Florida, after retirement.

JOIN US FOR HOSPITALITY WEEKEND



St. Peter Chrysologus

Peter was born in the Province of Bologna in Imola, Italy in the year 380. He was baptized, educated and ordained a deacon by Cornelius, Bishop of Imola.

There is little information about his younger years, but Peter became well known as an adult.

Ravenna was the center of the Roman Empire at this time. In 433, Peter was a deacon who accompanied the Bishop of Ravenna to Rome, who was to be appointed Archbishop. However, when Pope Sixtus III saw Peter, he chose him instead. Peter was now the Archbishop of Ravenna, which was a powerful position, but he was a humble man, bent on removing paganism and heresy and not looking for praises and influence. Peter succeeded in these areas while also working on ecclesiastical abuses from the Diocese. His hard work was appreciated by Emperor Valentian III, a Ravenna resident.



Peter worked with the poor of the city to improve their lives. He was a gifted speaker who gave profound and eloquent sermons, but kept them short, keeping people from daydreaming. He spoke of complex theological truths using plain language so everyone could understand. This earned him the name 'Chrysologus' meaning "the man of golden speech" or "golden word" as well as being known as the "Doctor of Homilies" because of his concise and strong reflections which he delivered as the Bishop. He also practiced many corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

Peter condemned Arianism and Monophysitism as heresies and explained the Apostles' Creed.

Monophysitism is a view of the nature of Christ, saying that Christ only had a divine nature and was not human. This is a compound word using monos meaning "one" and physis meaning "nature." Arian theology says that Christ is the Son of God, but was created by God and not coeternal with God the Father.

Peter cautioned the people against indecent dancing, saying that "Anyone who wishes to frolic with the devil cannot rejoice with Christ." He spoke about Biblical texts, the mystery of the Incarnation and other areas in simple and clear language. He dedicated a series of homilies to St. John the Baptist and the Blessed Mother and advocated daily Communion, also urging his listeners to confess often.

He wrote works about the Catholic Church's traditional beliefs about Mary's perpetual virginity, the value of Lent, Christ's Eucharistic presence and the importance of St. Peter and his successors as Popes. He and Pope Leo I the Great (440-461), another Doctor of the Church, were great friends.

A synod was held in 448 in Constantinople which condemned Monophysitism, which was started by Eutyches. He lived in the city and was the Archimandrite, also known as an abbot of a monastery with three hundred monks. Eutyches wanted Peter to help him with support for his theory, but at the Council of Chalcedon in 451, Peter scolded Eutyches for this heresy and told him to follow the teachings of the Church and obey the Pope, whose position comes from St. Peter. The *Acts of the Council of Chalcedon* written in 451, contains the letter that Peter Chrysologus wrote regarding his admonishment of the writings of Eutyches.

All of Peter's homilies were collected by Archbishop Felix of Ravenna in the early eighth century to be preserved and translated into different languages.

Peter died in Imola on July 31, 450 and was considered a saint.

In 1729, Pope Benedict XIII declared him a Doctor of the Church. The feast day of St. Peter Chrysologus is July 30.
