

## Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven; and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven." (Matthew 16:18-19)

The papacy has elicited controversies lately, given the delicate position of the Pope over relevant issues affecting the church and the world we live in. All I pray is for the Pope and us Christians to "give to Cesar what belongs to Cesar and to God what belongs to God." Easier said than done but here we are today remembering the call of St. Peter to be the first Pope and representative of Jesus Christ here on earth.

Peter was truly human and is called to a lofty, spiritual role that no one on earth can imagine or ever dream to have. In the end, it is only the Holy Spirit, through the conclave, that 'elects' the Pope. Do we see Christ through the present pope that we have? Do we believe the Pope's

encyclicals and statements to be coming from the Lord Jesus? Is the present Pope humbly declaring Jesus as "...the

Christ, the Son of the living God?"

We pray for the faith and trust that Peter had in facing life's pressing and oftentimes, stressful issues!

Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How inscrutable are his judgments and how unsearcha*ble his ways! (Rom 11:33)*

#### The Passion of St. John the Baptist


King Herod Antipas divorced his wife to marry Herodias, his sister-in-law, who was still married to his half-brother Philip. John the Baptist told him that this was wrong and was killed for saying this.

Herod Antipas was a tetrarch, one of four rulers who co-governed ancient Palestine under the oversight of a Roman governor. He was a cruel man, having learned this behavior from his father, Herod the Great, who had two of his own sons strangled to

death, murdered his favorite wife and ordered the deaths of all the male babies in Bethlehem at the time of Christ's birth.

Jesus called Herod Antipas a "fox" when some pharisees told Christ that Herod was planning to kill him. After interrogating Christ, Pontius Pilate thought that the complaints of the Jewish people regarding Jesus fell more under Herod's jurisdiction. When Christ met Herod, it was Good Friday. Herod wanted Jesus to perform a miracle for him, but Christ wouldn't speak to the man who killed his cousin, so Herod had Jesus sent back to Pilate for death.

Herod was to choose John the Baptist's fate just like Pilate did to Jesus. Neither one wanted to execute John or Jesus, but cowardice and fear overshadowed them until commanding the death of an innocent man was more convenient than defying the ridicule and threats of subordinates. Herod knew that John was a holy man and liked to hear him speak, although Herod didn't take the lessons to heart. He knew that he had to get control of him because of John's popularity, but Herod was afraid to kill him, so he had John put in prison.



St. Mark said that "Herod feared John, knowing him to be a righteous and holy man, and kept him in custody. When he heard him speak he was very much perplexed, yet he liked to listen to him." (Mark 6:20)

Per the Gospels, John was imprisoned because he spoke about the marriage to Herodias. At Herod's birth-day party, his stepdaughter Salome danced for him. Herod was so pleased, he told her that he would give her whatever she wanted. She asked her mother for what she could want and was told to get the head of John the Baptist on a platter.

Herod was appalled by the request but agreed and had John killed in prison in 30 AD. John was beheaded and his head was placed on a platter and given to Herod's stepdaughter. Herod was upset because he had to order John's death.

"The king was deeply distressed, but because of his oaths and the guests he did not wish to break his word to her." (Mark 6:26)

Herod didn't actually have to order John's death. If he were truly grieved, he could have said "I made a stupid promise which I now regret," and granted Salome some other gift instead of a blood-splattered plate, but he beheaded John to avoid embarrassment and to say "I made a mistake." Soon Herod suffered a military disaster at the hands of Aretas his father-in-law, causing many to believe that this was God's punishment for his wickedness.

The Passion or Beheading of St. John the Baptist is one of the very oldest liturgical feasts on the Church's calendar, with his birth record being the oldest feast day. It was likely that the event of John's death was remembered along with the activities of Holy Week as soon as the Church started commemorating holy days. In addition to the feast of the birth of St. John the Baptist on June 24, the feast day of John's death has been celebrated since the fourth century. His body was buried in Samaria. In 362 AD pagans desecrated his grave and burned his remains. Only a small portion of his relics were saved by monks who sent them to St. Athanasius at Alexandria, Egypt.

Besides Jesus and the Blessed Mother, St. John the Baptist is the only other person whose birth and death are celebrated by the Church. The feast day of the Passion of St. John the Baptist is commemorated on August 29.
