

Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. (Mt. 16:23-24)

God calls us to follow him to the fullness of life. To think with the mind of God requires us to reject so much of what the world proclaims. Not that the world is bad - after all the Lord created it and all that is in it, and declared it good. But the goodness of the world is still marred by sin and temptation, and those are what call to us.



For example, we are surrounded by a desire to make all things comfortable and without suffering: "Buy this and your life will be easier," we are told. We are encouraged to "do what makes you feel good, take care of you." This kind of "idolatry of comfort" makes loving another look like it is simply doing whatever helps others to be comfortable. If I care about you, I won't do anything that might make you feel uncomfortable.

In the face of the lure of comfort, Jesus calls us to seek the goodness we long for by taking up our cross, denying ourselves, and losing our lives for Christ. The cross is our hope, not the false god of comfort. God, who enters into all of our suffering, who meets us in the pain of authentic love, who held nothing back but offered himself completely for our salvation, is the only good that will ever satisfy our deepest longings.

Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect. (Rom. 12:2)

Entonces Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: "El que quiera venir en pos de mí, niéguese a sí mismo, tome su cruz y sígame. Porque quien quiera salvar su vida la perderá, pero quien pierda su vida por mi causa la encontrará. (Mt 16:23-24)

Dios nos llama a seguirlo hasta la plenitud de la vida. Pensar con la mente de Dios requiere que rechacemos mucho de lo que el mundo proclama. No es que el mundo sea malo, después de todo, el Señor lo creó y todo lo que hay en él, y lo declaró bueno. Pero la bondad del mundo todavía está estropeada por el pecado y la tentación, y eso es lo que nos llama.

Por ejemplo, estamos rodeados de un deseo de hacer que todas las cosas sean cómodas y sin sufrimiento: "Compra esto y tu vida será más fácil", nos dicen. Se nos anima a "hacer lo que te hace sentir bien, cuidarte". Este tipo de "idolatría de la comodidad" hace que amar a otro parezca que simplemente está haciendo lo que ayuda a otros a sentirse cómodos. Si me preocupo por ti, no haré nada que pueda hacerte sentir incómodo.

Ante el atractivo del consuelo, Jesús nos llama a buscar la bondad que anhelamos tomando nuestra cruz, negándonos a nosotros mismos y perdiendo nuestras vidas por Cristo. La cruz es nuestra esperanza, no el falso dios del consuelo. Dios, que entra en todo nuestro sufrimiento, que se encuentra con nosotros en el dolor del amor auténtico, que no retuvo nada sino que se ofreció completamente por nuestra salvación, es el único bien que satisfará nuestros anhelos más profundos.

No os conforméis a esta época, sino transformaos por la renovación de vuestra mente, para que podáis discernir cuál es la voluntad de Dios, qué es bueno, agradable y perfecto. (Romanos 12:2)

ST. PETER CLAVER

Pedro Claver y Corberó was born on June 26, 1580 in Verdú, Urgell, in the Province of Lleida, Spain. His family was very devout and had a prosperous farming business. Years later he was a student at the University of Barcelona, where he was noted for his intelligence and piety. After two years of study, Pedro wrote "I must dedicate myself to the service of God until death, on the understanding that I am like a slave." He wrote this in the notebook which he kept throughout his life.

When he had completed his studies, Pedro became a Jesuit in Tarragona at the age of twenty. After he completed the novitiate, he was sent to study philosophy at Palma, Mallorca. He then met the porter there, Alphonsus Rodriguez, a lay brother known for his



holiness and gift of prophecy, who told Pedro that he should spend his life in service in the colonies of New Spain and urged the young student to accept that calling. Soon Pedro volunteered to go to the New Kingdom of Granada, where he arrived in the port city of Cartagena in 1610. Today this is the country of Colombia. Years later, Alphonsus Rodriguez also became a saint.

Pedro prepared for six years to become a priest, living in Jesuit houses at Tunja and Bogotá. There he met Alonso de Sandoval, who would become his mentor, and inspiration. Alonso devoted himself to serving the slaves for forty years before Pedro arrived to continue his work. Alonso learned a lot about the slaves, writing a book in 1627 regarding the language, nature, customs and beliefs of the Africans. Pedro was an eager pupil of Alonso. When Pedro was solemnly professed in 1622, he signed his final profession document in Latin as *Petrus Claver, aethiopum semper servus* (Peter Claver, servant of the Ethiopians [i.e. Africans] forever). Father Pedro was deeply disturbed by the harsh treatment and living conditions of the slaves who were brought from Africa. Seventy years before Pedro was born, King Ferdinand of Spain authorized the purchase of two hundred African slaves to be sent to the territories in New Spain.

Alonso had always visited the slaves where they worked, but Pedro preferred to head for the wharf as soon as a slave ship entered the port. He would board the ship and enter the filthy and diseased holds to care for and minister to their badly treated and terrified hu-

man cargo. The slaves survived a voyage of several months under horrible conditions, having difficulty to move around on the ships because the slave traffickers filled them to capacity. They were often told they were being taken to a land where they would be eaten. Then they were herded from the ship and penned in nearby yards to be scrutinized by the crowds of buyers.

Father Pedro would join them with medicine, food, bread and lemons. Interpreters would help him speak to the slaves as he gave basic instructions to them. "We must speak to them with our hands," he once said, "before we try to speak to them with our lips." He saw the slaves as fellow Christians, encouraging others to do so the same. Father Pedro often visited plantations to give spiritual consolation to the people.

During his forty years of ministry it is estimated that he personally catechized and baptized 300,000 slaves. He would follow up to ensure that they received their Christian and civil rights. He extended his work by preaching to sailors and traders in the city square and conducted country missions, returning every spring to visit those he had baptized, making sure that they were treated humanely. He avoided the hospitality of planters and overseers and would stay in the slave quarters. Father Pedro also ministered to the well-to do members of society, traders and visitors to Cartagena, including Muslims and English Protestants. He condemned criminals, many of whom he spiritually prepared for death. He was also a frequent visitor at the city's hospitals. Through years of constant work and the force of his strong personality, the slaves' situation slowly improved. In time he became a moral force, known as the Apostle of Cartagena.

In the last years of his life Father Pedro was too sick to leave his room. He lingered for four years, largely forgotten and neglected, also being physically abused and starved by an ex-slave who had been hired by the Superior of the house to care for him. Father never complained about his treatment, just accepting it as a just punishment for his sins. He died on September 8, 1654.

Many people came to pay their last respects when the news of his death spread throughout Cartagena. They stripped his room for relics because they knew of his reputation for holiness. The city magistrates always considered Father Pedro to be a nuisance for his persistent advocacy on behalf of the slaves, but now ordered a public funeral. Father was buried with pomp and ceremony. Only after his death was the scope of his ministry revealed regarding the astronomical number of people whom he baptized.

Pedro was canonized in 1888 by Pope Leo XIII, along with the Jesuit porter, Alphonsus Rodriguez. In 1896 Pope Leo also declared St. Peter Claver the patron saint of missionary work among all African peoples. His body is preserved and venerated in the church of the Jesuit residence, now renamed in his honor. St. Peter Claver is the patron saint of Colombia, slaves and seafarers. His feast day is September 9.


