# Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were wise. (Matt 25:1-2)

The Lord Jesus calls us to wisdom by using the example of the wise virgins in the Gospel. Since we don't want to be like the foolish virgins who missed entry into the Reign of God, how, then, do we become wise? The Scriptures tell us that wisdom is a gift from God. In fact, we are taught that *fear of the Lord* is the beginning of wisdom (Prov 9:10). Wisdom is one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. If we want to be truly wise, we must seek to follow the lead of the Holy Spirit even when it is difficult. Wisdom is that deeper knowledge that helps us to see the path of God in our lives.

Wisdom seeks what God wants, and not simply what we want. It is a great gift, especially for those in leadership. In the parable of the ten virgins, Jesus demonstrates the difference between the foolish and the wise. While all the virgins are invited to the wedding, only five planned to be patient and wait for the Master to arrive.

The foolish virgins did not have the wisdom to plan ahead. They lived in the moment and did not consider the will of the Master. They did not have the patience to wait longer, or the willingness to invest in more oil. Their selfishness and lack of wisdom caused them to miss the feast and be locked out of the Master's celebration. The Lord Jesus calls us to embrace the gift of wisdom and to ask for that gift from the Holy Spirit. As long as we have the humility and patience to trust in the Lord's plan, we will receive all the wisdom we need.

Resplendent and unfading is wisdom, and she is readily perceived by those who love her, and found by those who seek her. (Wisdom 6:12)

Jesús dijo a sus discípulos esta parábola: "El reino de los cielos será semejante a diez vírgenes que tomaron sus lámparas y salieron al encuentro del novio. Cinco de ellos eran necios y cinco eran sabios. (Mateo 25:1-2)

El Señor Jesús nos llama a la sabiduría usando el ejemplo de las vírgenes prudentes en el Evangelio. Puesto que no queremos ser como las vírgenes insensatas que perdieron la entrada en el Reino de Dios, ¿cómo, entonces, llegamos a ser sabios? Las Escrituras nos dicen que la sabiduría es un don de Dios. De hecho, se nos enseña que el temor del Señor es el principio de la sabiduría (Proverbios 9:10). La sabiduría es uno de los dones del Espíritu Santo. Si queremos ser verdaderamente sabios, debemos tratar de seguir la guía del Espíritu Santo incluso cuando sea difícil. La sabiduría es ese conocimiento más profundo que nos ayuda a ver el camino de Dios en nuestras vidas.

La sabiduría busca lo que Dios quiere, y no simplemente lo que nosotros queremos. Es un gran regalo, especialmente para aquellos que están en el liderazgo. En la parábola de las diez vírgenes, Jesús demuestra la diferencia entre los necios y los sabios. Si bien todas las vírgenes están invitadas a la boda, solo cinco planearon ser pacientes y esperar a que llegara el Maestro.

Las vírgenes insensatas no tenían la sabiduría para planear con anticipación. Vivían el momento y no consideraban la voluntad del Maestro. No tuvieron la paciencia para esperar más, ni la voluntad de invertir en más petróleo. Su egoísmo y falta de sabiduría hicieron que se perdieran la fiesta y quedaran excluidos de la celebración del Maestro. El Señor Jesús nos llama a abrazar el don de la sabiduría y a pedir ese don del Espíritu Santo. Mientras tengamos la humildad y la paciencia para confiar en el plan del Señor, recibiremos toda la sabiduría que necesitamos.

Resplandeciente e inmarcesible es la sabiduría, y es fácilmente percibida por aquellos que la aman, y encontrada por aquellos que la buscan. (Sabiduría 6:12.)





**OUR NEXT BLOOD DRIVE IS SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 26!** It is hard to imagine that Thanksgiving is less than two weeks away. The Sunday immediately following that special day, Sunday, November 26, will be our bi-monthly blood drive, from 7:30 am to 1:30 pm. The Big Red Bus will be parked right outside our front entrance. Since the drive began in June of 2019, you have contributed 475 pints of blood while saving over 1,425 lives as each dona-



has met its OneBlood assigned goal in all but once and has surpassed 25 donors six times (including the 29 donations we received at our September drive) with our record being 33 pints contributed.

While walk-ups make up 90% of our donations, you can reserve your spot by making an appointment at: OneBlood

This month's theme is: "Be Thankful for all the Lord has done for you by giving a half-hour of your time and a pint of your blood."

Besides your ability to help those with medical needs, you will receive a wellness check-up which includes: a COVID-19 antibody test, blood pressure, temperature, iron count, pulse, and cholesterol screening. OneBlood is also offering a \$20 e-card and a blanket for this drive.

# St. Rose Philippine Duchesne

Rose Philippine Duchesne was born in Grenoble, France, the second of seven daughters, along with one son. Her father was Pierre-François Duchesne, a prominent lawyer. Her mother was Rose-Euphrosine Périer, the sister of Claude Périer, a wealthy



businessman who helped finance Napoleon to power. Her family shared a home with her uncle Claude and his wife. Claude's son would go onto the Prime Minister of France and the grandfather of Jean Casimir Périer, a French President. Their family home was huge and located across from the Parliament building and Palace of Justice in Grenoble.

As a child, Rose survived a bout of smallpox which left her slightly scarred. In 1781, she and her cousin Josephine were sent to the Monastery of Saint-Marie d'en-Haut, a socially prominent school located on a mountainside near Grenoble. They were educated there by the Visitandine nuns. When Rose began to show a strong attraction to the monastic life, her father removed her from the convent and had her tutored with other cousins in the family home. However, in 1788 Rose decided to enter the Visitation of Holy Mary religious order, despite her family's opposition. She asked an aunt to go with her on a visit to the monastery. Then she requested admission, leaving her aunt to return home without her and explain everything to her father.

In 1792, insurgents shut down the monastery during the French Revolution, which dispersed the nuns. Rose returned to her family, living at their country home along with two aunts, who also had been nuns. She tried to continue living the Rule of Life of her Order during this time. When Napoleon came to power, the Catholic Church was once again able to operate openly in France. In 1801, Rose attempted to re-establish the Visitation Monastery, acquiring the buildings from the new owner, but the buildings were in sham-

bles because they were previously used as military barracks and a prison. A few of the nuns returned, but they could not adapt to the austere living conditions since most of them were elderly. Sister Rose was now the mother superior of the house, with only three other nuns.

While this was occurring, a new order was founded by Madeleine-Sophie Barat in northern France called the Society of the Sacred Heart. Madeleine wanted to begin a new chapter in Grenoble and met with Sister Rose in 1804, merging their orders. The new congregation was not an enclosed religious order, meaning that they were not cloistered and could work within the world.

In 1815, Sister Rose established a Convent of the Sacred Heart in Paris where she opened a school and became the Mistress of Novices.

During her childhood, Rose heard many stories about missionary priests in Louisiana, a colony of New France. She always wanted to serve the Native Americans who lived there. In 1817, Bishop William Dubourg of the Diocese of Louisiana and the Two Floridas, went to Paris to find teachers for the French and Indian children of the Diocese. When Sister Rose met him, she asked permission from Sister Madeleine to go to the new country to serve.

The following year, Sister Rose left for the United States with four other nuns. They were at sea for ten weeks, finally arriving in New Orleans, but no provisions were made for them. They stayed with the Ursuline nuns for a time and then took a steamboat to St. Louis, settling in St. Charles in the Missouri Territory. This took another seven weeks. She called her new home "the remotest village in the U.S." But even with this feeling, Sister Rose established a new Sacred Heart convent in a log cabin there, called the Duquette Mansion. This was the first house of the Society ever built outside France and the first in St. Charles. It was a free school west of the Mississippi. Sister wrote of the site, saying the "Poverty and Christian heroism are here" and "trials are the riches of priests in this land". The following year the community was moved across the river to the town of Florissant, Missouri, opening a school and a novitiate.

Their new organization faced many issues, including lack of money, inadequate housing, hunger and freezing weather. Also the Sisters struggled to learn English. By 1828, the Society's first five members in America had grown to six communities, operating several schools. Soon other foundations occurred in Grand Coteau in Natchitoches, Baton Rouge and New Orleans. Pope Leo XII recognized their work and formally approved the Society of the Sacred Heart in 1826. In 1828, the Jesuits bought the property in St. Charles and asked the sisters to return and start a parish school. In 1841 the Jesuits asked the Sisters to join them in a new mission to teach the Potawatomi Tribe in eastern Kansas.

Sister Rose was now seventy-one. She was not able to learn their language, but spent many hours in prayer for the success of the mission. For this, she was called the "Quahkahkanumad," which meant "Woman Who Prays Always." She continued her work, helping Native Americans as far as the Rocky Mountains.

Sister Rose died on November 18, 1852 at the age of 83. The cause for her canonization began in 1895. She was declared Venerable in 1909 by Pope Pius X, beatified by Pope Pius XII in 1940 and canonized by Pope John Paul II on July 3, 1988. Her feastday is November 18. She is the patron saint of perseverance amid adversity.


