

# The Message of Christ the King El Mensaje de Cristo Rey

Jesus said to his disciples: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his

glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. (Matt 25:31-32)

Today we celebrate the reign of our servant king. The Gospel tells us how to belong to Christ. Jesus' parable of the sheep and the goats continues the theme of the messianic king who will judge justly. In the Roman Empire, honor was everything and money was able to buy you that. Money also bought what could only roughly be called "justice."

It is not money or power or worldly honor that gains one admittance to Jesus' kingdom, however - it is acting like God, the Good Shepherd, who binds up the injured and heals the sick. To be with him and in him, Christ the King chooses quite simply those who give food, drink, clothing, and comfort to those most neglected.



It is a topsy-turvy kingdom, this reign of Christ, compared to the values of the wider society, both in ancient times and in our time. Choosing Christ's kingdom is an act of both exceptional bravery and extreme humility. Let these thoughts be with us as together we receive the body and blood of Christ, our king.

Brothers and sisters: Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through man, the resurrection of the dead came also through man. (1Cor 15:20)

Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: "Cuando el Hijo del Hombre venga en su gloria, y todos los ángeles con él, se sentará en su trono glorioso, y todas las naciones se reunirán delante de él. Y los separará los unos de los otros, como el pastor separa las ovejas de las cabras. (Mateo 25:31-32)

Hoy celebramos el reinado de nuestro rey siervo. El Evangelio nos dice cómo pertenecer a Cristo. La parábola de Jesús de las ovejas y las cabras continúa el tema del rey mesiánico que juzgará con justicia. En el Imperio Romano, el honor lo era todo y el dinero era capaz de comprarlo. El dinero también compró lo que sólo podía llamarse a grandes rasgos "justicia".

Sin embargo, no es el dinero, el poder o el honor mundano lo que le permite a uno ser admitido en el reino de Jesús, sino actuar como Dios, el Buen Pastor, que venda a los heridos y sana a los enfermos. Para estar con él y en él, Cristo Rey elige con toda sencillez a los que dan de comer, de beber, de vestir y de consuelo a los más abandonados.

Es un reino patas arriba, este reino de Cristo, comparado con los valores de la sociedad en general, tanto en la antigüedad como en nuestro tiempo. Elegir el reino de Cristo es un acto de valentía excepcional y humildad extrema. Que estos pensamientos nos acompañen mientras juntos recibimos el cuerpo y la sangre de Cristo, nuestro rey.

Hermanos y hermanas: Cristo ha resucitado de entre los muertos, primicias de los que durmieron. Porque así como la muerte vino por medio del hombre, la resurrección de los muertos vino también por el hombre" (1 Corintios 15:20).



Join us in praying the "First Saturday Rosary", (Saturday, December 2, after the FIRST SATURDAY 8:00 am Mass, until 8:30 am) to pray for peace, understanding, comfort, and the healing of all people. Reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on First Saturday is for peace in the world, and peace in the Church. The promise attached to the First Saturday of five consecutive months is for the individual. Our Lady promised to Sister Lucia to assist with the graces necessary for salvation, those who, on the First Saturday of five consecutive months, shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep her company



for fifteen minutes on the Mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to her. The fifteen minutes meditation is done individually on your private time with Our Lady.

# St. Catherine Labouré

St. Catherine Labouré was a Marian visionary and a member of the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul. In 1830 the Blessed Mother appeared to Catherine and requested the creation of a medal.



Zoe Labouré was born on was May 2, 1806 in the Burgundy region of France. Her parents were Madeleine Louise Gontard and Pierre Labouré, a farmer. She was the nineth of eleven living children. Even though her baptismal name was Zoe, her family rarely used that name. Her mother died on October 9, 1815, when Catherine was nine years old. She picked up a statue of the Blessed Mother at her mother's funeral, kissed it and said "Now, dear Lady, you are to be my mother."

Her aunt offered to care for she and her sister Marie Antoinette. They moved to Saint-Rémy, a village five and half miles from their home. There Catherine had a dream of a priest, whom she later recognized as Vincent de Paul. He said to her "My daughter, it is good to care for the sick. For now, you flee from me, but one day you will be glad to approach me. God has plans for you. Don't forget it!"

When she was twelve, Catherine returned to her father's farm to help care for her family. Later, her father sent her to Paris to try to stop her from a religious vocation. Now she worked at her uncle's cafe for poor workers, where she saw their suffering which pushed her to enter the nursing order of Saint Vincent de Paul Daughters of Charity. She began her novitiate on April 21, 1830 at the convent on the Rue du Bac in Paris and took her vows on January 30, 1831. It was in this Convent where she would see the Blessed Mother, leading her to establish the Miraculous Medal

Vincent de Paul died on September 27, 1660, but his remains were sent to the Vincentian church in April of 1830, where a novena occurred. Catherine returned to the convent chapel. For three successive evenings, she experienced a vision of the heart of Vincent de Paul, above a shrine containing a relic of a bone from his right arm. Each time the heart appeared, it was in a different color of white, red and black. Catherine interpreted this to mean that the Vincentian communities would prosper and that there would be a change of government, but the convent chaplain advised her to forget the vision.

On July 19, 1830, the eve of the feast of St. Vincent de Paul, Catherine woke up hearing the voice of a child calling her to the chapel.

Then she heard the Blessed Mother say to her, "God wishes to charge you with a mission. You will be contradicted, but do not fear; you will have the grace to do what is necessary. Tell your spiritual director all that passes within you. Times are evil in France and in the world."

On November 27, 1830, while Sister Catherine was saying her evening meditations, Mary returned displaying herself inside an oval frame, standing upon a globe with rays of light coming out of her hands in the direction of the globe. Around the margin of the frame appeared the words "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee."

While Catherine was watching, the frame seemed to rotate, showing a circle of twelve stars, a large letter M surmounted by a cross and a stylized Sacred Heart of Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary underneath.

She asked why some of the rays of light did not reach the earth and Mary replied, "Those are the graces for which people forget to ask." Then Mary asked Catherine to take these images to her priest and tell him that they should be put on medallions. "All who wear them will receive great graces."

Catherine did this. After two years of investigation and observation of her normal daily behavior, the priest took the information to his archbishop without revealing her identity. The request was approved. The design of the medallions was commissioned through the French goldsmith Adrien Vachette, which proved to be exceedingly popular. The Miraculous Medal was quickly adopted by millions of the Catholics, eventually playing an important role in the proclamation by Pope Pius IX of the Immaculate Conception on December 8, 1854. The dogma of the Immaculate Conception was not officially declared, but the medal, with its "conceived without sin" slogan was influential in the popular approval of the idea. Alphonse Ratisbonne converted to Catholicism because of the medal and asked if he could meet the sister who had seen the Blessed Mother, but nobody knew which sister it was. That was the way Sister Catherine wanted it. She only wished to humbly perform her daily duties and devote herself to the care of the needy.

After her convent stay, Catherine was sent to the Hospice d'Enghien in the village of Reuilly where she spent the next forty years caring for the elderly and sick. During this time, she also worked on the hospice's farm, looking after the poultry and cleaning the stables.

Sister Catherine died in the hospice on December 31, 1876, at the age of seventy. Her body was later moved to the Chapel of Our Lady of Graces of the Miraculous Medal in 140 Rue du Bac in Paris. She is now encased in glass beneath the side altar.

Her cause for sainthood was declared when it was discovered that her body was incorrupt. She was beatified on May 28, 1933 by Pope Pius XI and canonized on July 27, 1947 by Pope Pius XII. St. Catherine Labouré's feast day is observed on November 28 and she is the patron saint of the elderly.
