

A MESSAGE FROM DEACON BACA /MENSAJE DEL DIÁCONO BACA

Dear Family of St. Faustina,

On this third Sunday of Easter, the beautiful episode of the two men walking to Emmaus is concluded with an explosion of signifi-

cance that is understated and easy to overlook it. The two unnamed disciples, still filled with the new oxygen of having seen the risen Lord, retell their story in the upper room. Close your eyes and imagine how their "hearts were still burning," beating with a child-heart intensity. After they recount what they witnessed -- not only seeing Jesus, risen from the dead, but Jesus the teacher, and Jesus the high priest -- in a moment transfigured --- a breaking forth of the Divine presence from the simplicity of a loaf of bread, a sharing of God's essence with His adopted sons and daughters. This episode belongs to you; it is personal; it is intimate; it is the Mass. The Mass belongs to your very essence-- your being. Afterall, "*it is <u>in</u> Him that we <u>live</u>, and <u>move</u>, and have our <u>being</u>. (Acts 17:28)*

My wife, Esther, and I have come from a faraway place in the desert sojourners on the way ever seeking to do His Divine Will. Of course, although not insignificant, we followed the innocence of the yearning of 4 grand children to experience the closeness of family in a confused world that separates us more than unites us. I have been a deacon, ordained in the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, New Mexico, for almost 17 years. The Lord has taken



me through deep valleys and high plateaus in my life. My dear wife served as a pharmacist for 25 years. Esther is the prayer warrior of my life...soft spoken and always out of the limelight. Since the year 2000, when St. Faustina was canonized by Saint Pope John Paul II, we developed a deep devotion to this "secretary of God's Mercy." Coming from St. Therese, Shrine of the Little Flower, in Albuquerque, N.M., it feels almost as though St. Therese, the little flower, and her love for simplicity and innocence pressed us to uproot us from the Land of Enchantment to transplant us into the rich but unknown soils of life in "La Florida," and finally, into the arms of our beloved St. Faustina. As we say in Spanish, "...que causalidad." There really are no coincidences.

There is so much more to reveal to you about our lives but that will come in time. I would like to know of your own desire to grow so that your "hearts burn" constantly. I imagine the church building of St. Faustina filled to the brim, as I witnessed this Easter ---- filled with the sound of burning hearts palpitating in synchrony with the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. I am thankful for your generous welcoming, for Bishop Noonan's trust in sending me to you, and for Fr. Carlos' acceptance of my unworthy service. I close with a phrase used by the "Cristeros" under persecution in Mexico in the early 1900'ds --- Viva Cristo Rey! And your response would be "Que Viva!" As Fr. Carlos says, "Animo!"

Querida Familia de Santa Faustina:

En este tercer domingo de Pascua, el hermoso episodio de los dos hombres caminando hacia Emaús concluye con una explosión de significado que es discreta y fácil de pasar por alto. Los dos discípulos anónimos, todavía llenos del nuevo oxígeno de haber visto al Señor resucitado, vuelven a contar su historia en el aposento alto. Cierra los ojos e imagina cómo sus "corazones seguían ardiendo", latiendo con la intensidad de un corazón de niño. Después de relatar lo que presenciaron, no solo ver a Jesús, resucitado de entre los muertos, sino a Jesús el maestro y a Jesús el sumo sacerdote, en un momento transfigurado --- una ruptura de la presencia divina de la sencillez de una hogaza de pan, un compartir la esencia de Dios con sus hijos e hijas adoptivos. Este episodio te pertenece; es personal; es íntimo; es la Misa. La Misa pertenece a tu propia esencia, a tu ser. Después de todo, *"es <u>en</u> Él que vivimos, nos <u>movemos</u> y somos. (Hechos 17:28.)*

Mi esposa, Esther, y yo hemos venido de un lugar lejano en el desierto, peregrinos en el camino siempre buscando hacer Su Divina Voluntad. Por supuesto, aunque no es insignificante, seguimos la inocencia del anhelo de 4 nietos de experimentar la cercanía de la familia en un mundo confuso que nos separa más de lo que nos une. He sido diácono, ordenado en la Arquidiócesis de Santa Fe, Nuevo México, durante casi 17 años. El Señor me ha llevado a través de valles profundos y mesetas altas en mi vida. Mi querida esposa trabajó como farmacéutica durante 25 años. Ester es la guerrera de oración de mi vida... De voz suave y siempre fuera del centro de atención. Desde el año 2000, cuando Santa Faustina fue canonizada por el Papa Juan Pablo II, desarrollamos una profunda devoción a esta "secretaria de la Misericordia de Dios". Viniendo de Santa Teresita, Santuario de la Pequeña Flor, en Albuquerque, Nuevo México, se siente casi como si Santa Teresita, la pequeña flor, y su amor por la simplicidad y la inocencia nos presionaran a desarraigarnos de la Tierra del Encanto para trasplantarnos a los ricos pero desconocidos suelos de la vida en "La Florida", y finalmente, en los brazos de nuestra amada Santa Faustina. Como decimos en español, "... que causalidad." Realmente no hay coincidencias.

Hay mucho más que revelarles sobre nuestras vidas, pero eso vendrá con el tiempo. Me gustaría saber de su propio deseo de crecer para que sus "corazones ardan" constantemente. Me imagino el edificio de la iglesia de Santa Faustina lleno hasta los bordes, como fui testigo de esta Pascua --- lleno del sonido de corazones ardientes palpitando en sincronía con el Sagrado Corazón de Jesús y el Inmaculado Corazón de María. Agradezco su generosa acogida, la confianza del Obispo Noonan al enviarme a usted y la aceptación del P. Carlos de mi indigno servicio. Termino con una frase usada por los "cristeros" bajo persecución en México a principios de 1900 --- ¡Viva Cristo Rey! Y tu respuesta sería "¡Que Viva!" Como dice el P. Carlos, "¡Animo!"

Santa Faustina... Ruega por nosotros.





BLESSED KATARZÝNA CELESTÝNA FARON By Marylu Mariniello

Katarzyna Stanislawa Faron was born in Zabrzez, Malopolskie, Poland on April 24, 1913. Her parents died when she was five years. Then she was raised by pious, childless relatives. From childhood she was devoted to Christ, the Blessed Mother and St. Thérèse, the Little Flower.

Katarzyna wanted to dedicate her life to God, entering the Congregation of the Sisters Servants of Mary Immacu-

late in 1930, serving as a kindergarten teacher and catechist. There she took the name of Celestyna. Before her first profession, she wrote "Through my vows I long to belong entirely to Jesus Christ as a total sacrificial offering. I always desire to walk the way of love and devotion so that I can approach the Immaculate Lamb." Her perpetual vows were professed in 1938.

When World War II began, Sister became the leader of her religious house, running an orphanage and helping the poor, while also looking after the elderly.

Eventually Sister Celestyna was arrested by the Gestapo, charged with conspiracy against the Nazis and for her association with the Armia Krajowa, a Catholic resistance movement. Initially she was imprisoned in Jaslo, then sent to Tarnów, Poland and finally was transported to Auschwitz-Birkenau extermination camp in Nazi-



occupied Poland with the infamous sign at the entrance: "Arbeit macht frei, " which means "Work sets you free." She arrived at the camp on the feast day of the Epiphany in 1943.

Here Sister became Prisoner 27989. She was given a striped uniform with the letter "P" stitched on it for Polish and wooden shoes. She was assigned to hard labor digging ditches, often standing in icy water for hours at a time, with little food given to her. The camp was disgusting with fleas, bed bugs and rats. Sister Celestyna developed tuberculosis and typhoid fever. She offered her sufferings to God and resigned herself to following his will. While she was sick, she also taught math to the other inmates.

Sister completed the nine First Friday devotions to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. From this, she knew that she wouldn't die without receiving Communion. On the feast day of the Immaculate Conception on December 8, 1943, Sister Celestyna received Holy Communion from a prisoner priest, who smuggled the hosts into the camp. At her deathbed, Sister prayed for various intentions on a rosary made out of bread, which she made. Witnesses said that she offered her sufferings for the conversion of a priest who had fallen away from the Church, but later returned.

Sister prayed for sinners, for her country, her congregation and especially for the priests who were treated horribly in the concentration camps. She also prayed for Hitler, hoping he would change his ways.

Sister Celestyna finally died from her illnesses on Easter morning on April 9, 1944.

Pope John Paul declared her Venerable on March 26, 1999. She is one of the One Hundred Eight Polish Catholic Martyrs killed during World War II by the Nazis who were beatified by Pope John Paul II on June 13, 1999 in Warsaw. Her feast day is April 9.

This is her prayer:

Heavenly Father, thank You for the gift of courage and perseverance in love which You granted to Blessed Katherine Celestyna, who amidst tortures, hunger, and debasement in the concentration camp, persevered under the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, remaining faithful to the Christian and religious vocation unto martyrdom. Through her intercession, grant me the grace... which I humbly implore, through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.
