A Message From Father Carlos / Un Mensaje de Padre Carlos

Mi querida familia de Santa Faustina,

En la palabra de Dios de este Quinto domingo de Pascua vemos como Pablo proclama el Señorío de Jesús, Se nos recuerda como el *"Amarlos los unos a los otros"* son manifestación de nuestra Fe en Jesucristo y que Él es la vid de la cual nosotros las ramas tenemos que mantener nos siempre unidos para verdaderamente tener Vida. La primera lectura, presenta las dificultades con que se encontró Pablo cuando intentó incorporarse a la comunidad cristiana de Jerusalén. La razón principal de estas dificultades se hallaba en que los miembros de la comunidad dudaban de su conversión. Las primeras comunidades cristianas sintieron la tentación de encerrarse en sí mismas y a poner obstáculos a la incorporación de los que no pensaban igual.



Este peligro es constante en la Iglesia. A menudo confundimos la Iglesia con una sociedad meramente humana, en la que sólo cuentan las afinidades humanas. Para pertenecer a la Iglesia no es preciso pertenecer a un pueblo, a una civilización, a una clase social, o a un partido político determinado. Como dice al final de la lectura, la única realidad capaz de vivificar, multiplicar y construir la Iglesia, es el Espíritu Santo, que supera todas las diferencias humanas.

Por otro lado, es bueno ver cómo Juan, nos insiste en la necesidad de las obras para seguir el mandamiento del Señor: *"amaos unos a otros como yo os he amado"*. Debemos saber que una fe sin obras es una fe muerta, como nos dice el apóstol Santiago. Claro que es Dios el que nos salva, no nuestras obras, porque la salvación excede nuestras solas fuerzas. Pero debemos tener siempre en cuenta que *"creer"* en Cristo supone querer cumplir sus mandamientos.

Por el evangelio de hoy nos damos cuenta de que, de Jesús, brota la savia que mantiene unidos a los sarmientos en vistas a una misma función: *"dar fruto"*. *"Yo soy la vid, vosotros los sarmientos; el que permanece en mí y yo en él, ese da fruto abundante."* Todos los que creemos en Cristo y queremos ser sus discípulos somos sarmientos del mismo Cristo. La pregunta es: si todos somos sarmientos de la misma Vid, ¿por qué entre nosotros hay tantas divisiones? Si todos somos miembros del mismo cuerpo, ¿por qué unos miembros del cuerpo luchan contra otros, en perjuicio del mismo cuerpo?

"Al sarmiento que no da fruto en mí, él lo arranca, y al que da fruto lo poda para que dé más fruto." Todos necesitamos ser podados por Dios, el mejor labrador, porque es el que mejor nos conoce y el que más nos quiere. Pero hay que colaborar en la poda. El principal fruto, son las obras que manan de nuestro amor cristiano al prójimo con el que convivimos y a cualquier prójimo que pueda necesitar nuestra ayuda. Nadie nace tan perfecto que no necesite poda alguna a lo largo de su vida. Todos somos imperfectos mientras vivimos en este mundo, por eso necesitamos estar continuamente podándonos y dejando que Dios nos pode. Mientras más unidos a la Vid mejor. **¡Animo!**

My dear family of St. Faustina,

In the Word of God for this Fifth Sunday of Easter, we see how Paul proclaims the Lordship of Jesus. He reminds us that "Love one another" is a manifestation of our Faith in Jesus Christ and that He is the Vine from which we, the branches, must always keep ourselves united to truly have Life. The first reading presents the difficulties Paul encountered when he tried to join the Christian community in Jerusalem. The main reason for these difficulties was that the community members doubted his conversion. The first Christian communities faced the temptation to close in on themselves and to put obstacles in the way of incorporating those who did not think the same way.

This danger is constant in the Church. We often confuse the Church with a merely human society where only human affinities count. To belong to the Church, one does not need to belong to a particular people, civilization, social class, or political party. St. Paul says at the end of the reading that the only reality capable of vivifying, multiplying, and building the Church is the Holy Spirit, who overcomes all human differences.

On the other hand, it is good to see how John insists on the necessity of works to follow the Lord's commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you." As the apostle James tells us, a faith without works is a dead faith. Of course, it is God who saves us, not our works, because salvation is beyond our strength alone. But we must always remember that "believing" in Christ means wanting to keep his commandments.

From today's Gospel, we realize that Jesus is the sap that keeps the branches united, "to bear fruit." "I am the vine; you are the branches; he who abides in me and I in him, he bears abundant fruit." All of us who believe in Christ and want to be his disciples are branches of Christ himself. The question is: if we are all branches of the same Vine, why are there so many divisions among us? If we are all members of the same body, why do some members of the body fight against others to the detriment of the same body?

"The branch that bears no fruit in me he plucks up, and the branch that bears fruit he prunes so that it may bear more fruit." We all need to be pruned by God, the best tiller because he is the one who knows us best and loves us most. But we must collaborate in the pruning. The primary fruit is the works that flow from our Christian love for the neighbor with whom we live and for any neighbor who may need our help. No one is born so perfect that they do not require any pruning. We are all imperfect as long as we live in this world, so we must continually prune ourselves and let God prune us. The more we united with the Vine, the better. Courage!

St. Faustina, Pray for us.

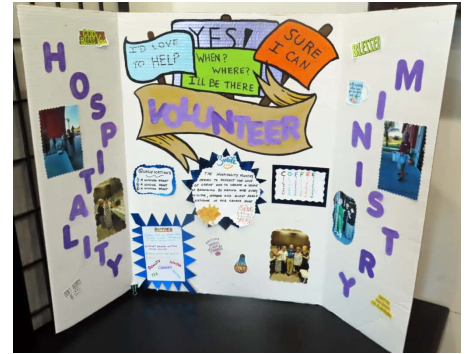

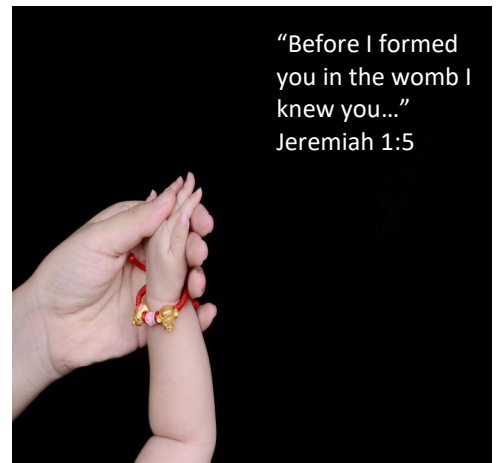

Blessed Franz Jägerstätter

Franz Huber was born on May 20, 1907 in St. Radegund, Upper Austria. His mother Rosalia Huber was unmarried. His father was Franz Bachmeier, killed during World War I. Later on Rosalia married Heinrich Jägerstätter in 1917, who adopted Franz and gave him his last name.



Franz had a general education in his village's one-room schoolhouse, with his step-grandfather also helping with his studies. He was an avid reader but was also a bit of a rebel in his formative years. Franze was the first person in his village to own a motorcycle, but was down to earth and a humble Catholic who kept to himself. He married Franziska Schwaninger in 1936. They went to Rome for their honeymoon where they made a pilgrimage and had a blessing from Pope Pius XI. Upon their return, Franz began farming for his living and became the sexton at church. There he attended daily Mass and received Communion. When he assisted at funerals, he always refused monetary offerings, keeping his work as spiritual and corporal works of mercy.

Soon much of Austria was beginning to follow the wave of Nazism, but Franz became more devout in his Catholic faith and placed his complete trust in God. He now had three daughters and worked to take care of his family, but he started thinking more about obedience to the legitimate authority of God. He reflected on mortal versus eternal life and Jesus' suffering and passion. He was not a part of a resistance movement but in 1938 he was the only local to vote against the "Anschluss" (annexation of Austria by Germany) because he couldn't accept this. Even so, he was drafted into the military in 1940, sworn in on June 17. The mayor of the town intervened, allowing Franz to return to his family and the farm. He was in active service again from October 1940 to April 1941, with the mayor's efforts allowing Franz to come home.

At this time Franz was convinced that participation in the war was a serious sin and decided that he would refuse to fight. He wrote, "It is very sad to hear again and again from Catholics that this war waged by Germany is perhaps not so unjust because it will wipe out Bolshevism.... But now a question: what are they fighting in this Country - Bolshevism or the Russian People? When our Catholic missionaries went to a pagan country to make them Christians, did they advance with machine guns and bombs in order to convert and improve them? If adversaries wage war on another nation, they have usually invaded the country not to improve people or even perhaps to give them something, but usually to get something for themselves.... If we were merely fighting Bolshevism, these other things - minerals, oil wells, or good farmland - would not be a factor."

Many Austrian people knelt when Hitler came to Vienna. Catholic Churches were forced to fly the swastika flag and were also subjected to other abusive laws.

Franz was called up again for military service in February of 1943. He went to the induction center on March 1 and announced his refusal to fight, offering to carry out non-violent services, which was denied. He was held in custody at Linz in March and April. Then, he was transferred to Berlin-Tegel in May and was put on trial on July 6, 1943. He was condemned to death for sedition but was inspiring with his tranquility. When Franz was offered the New Testament, he replied: "I am completely bound in inner union with the Lord, and any reading would only interrupt my communication with my God."

Right before his death, Franz was given a document to sign to support the Nazi party, which would have vindicated him, but he refused. He wrote, "If I must write... with my hands in chains, I find that much better than if my will were in chains. Neither prison nor chains nor sentence of death can rob a man of the Faith and his free will. God gives so much strength that it is possible to bear any suffering.... People worry about the obligations of conscience as they concern my wife and children. But I cannot believe that, just because one has a wife and children, a man is free to offend God." He did this on August 9 before being executed by guillotine.

Franz would never bow his head to Hitler, but he bowed his head to God. In June of 2007, Pope Benedict XVI declared Franz a martyr. Cardinal Jose Saraiva Martins beatified Franz Jägerstätter at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on October 26, 2007. His feast day is May 21, the date of his baptism.
