La semilla está en la tierra, pero no todos somos capaces de escucharle a Jesús y unir nuestras vidas a su estilo. Hermanos y hermanas, ser DISCIPULO de Jesús, es escuchar y acoger su palabra, pero sobre todo ponerla en práctica y dejar que de fruto. Y es esta mi mejor motivación para todos los que hicieron su Confirmación este fin de semana. Muchas felicidades a ustedes, sus padrinos, su familia y a toda nuestra comunidad. ¡Animo!

And this is my best motivation for all those who made their Confirmation this weekend. Congratulations to you, your godparents, your family, and our whole community. Cheer up!

St. Norbert

Norbert was born in 1080 at Xanten in the Duchy of Cleves. His father was Heribert, the Count of Gennep, who was related to the emperor. His mother was also of the aristocracy, belonging to the House of Lorraine. Besides his pedigree, Norbert was extremely bright and athletic. He was educated at the Church of St. Victor in Xanten and became a canon there. An accomplished scholar, he enjoyed the life of his stature. He also became a sub-deacon but still was more concerned with worldly pleasures. As a canon, he prayed the Divine Office every day with the other canons, receiving a salary for this, which was the main reason he accepted the position. Then, he discovered a way to increase his income by paying someone to take his place to say the prayers every day.

Norbert moved on to the court of the Prince-Archbishop of Cologne and then became a member of the court of Holy Roman Emperor Henry V, who appointed Norbert as his almoner, the person in charge of distributing the royal charities. The income from his two positions gave Norbert a very comfortable lifestyle. At the court, he witnessed an ongoing feud between the Pope and the emperor. In 1111, Henry V traveled to Rome to address a



disagreement called "the lay investiture controversy." He wanted to keep the spiritual authority to appoint and invest bishops, but the Pope was did not agree so Henry captured the Pope and held him hostage until the emperor received his terms. The Pope agreed but then excommunicated Henry. Norbert sympathized with the Pope and was disturbed by this controversy, giving him a moral awakening. Soon after, while riding to Freton in Westphalia with his servant, a violent storm ensued. Suddenly a ball of fire and thunder occurred and his horse threw Norbert to the ground, where he stayed for about an hour. When he woke up, he said, "Lord, what wouldst thou have me to do?" God replied "Turn away from evil, and do good: seek after peace, and pursue it."

This caused Norbert to repent at that spot. He never returned to court, leaving for the canonry at Xanten to live in silence. He wore a hair shirt, spending time praying and meditating and reviewing his past life, grateful that he was spared from an eternity in hell. He made a retreat to St. Sigebert's monastery near Cologne, where he began studying for the priesthood and was ordained. Then he went on a forty-day retreat to pray and fast, saying his first Mass. His sermons converted many.

In 1118, Norbert sold his estate, gave away his belongings and began a new adventure. He kept a small amount of funds, vestments, altar cloths and a mule, traveling to St. Giles in Languedoc while barefoot to see Pope Gelasius II. There he bowed to the Pope and confessed all of his sins. Then he became a preacher, reaching out to many regarding repentance, drawing large crowds.

Pope Calixtus II was now reigning and met with Norbert, who told him to start a religious order. Father chose a small chapel in Premontre, located in a valley in the forest. There, the Bishop built a monastery where men started to join in 1121. They wore a white habit, following the Rule of St. Augustine and living an austere life, called the Canons Regular of Prémontré or the Premonstratensians. Later, the name was changed to the Norbertines after their founder. After a few years, women's branches were established, with more than dozens of monasteries built in France, Germany and Belgium.

Father continued to travel and preach. While in Antwerp, he discovered a heretical itinerant preacher named Tanchelm, who denied the true presence of Christ in the Eucharist. He had a large following who believed him and they confiscated, desecrated and discarded the Eucharist to secret areas. Father Norbert preached against this and won over many of the followers, telling to gather up the desecrated hosts, which were unsoiled despite being thrown into the dirt. The hosts were gathered, and Father carried them back to the local church. Because of this, he is often depicted carrying a monstrance or ciborium containing the Blessed Sacrament.

In 1126, Father Norbert and his companions traveled to Rome for the final papal approval for his new order from Pope Honorius II. Coming home, they traveled through Würzburg, where Father cured a blind woman while also casting out demons and restoring peace between feuding noble families. The people from Magdeburg wanted him to be appointed as their bishop. The Pope appointed Father as the Archbishop of Magdeburg, which Norbert reluctantly accepted. He served in this position for about eight years until his death. During this time, he worked on reforming the immoralities among the clergy, resolving schisms, helping his Order to grow, preaching to the people, converting many and securing the right of the self-governing of the Church to without the civil interference.

Norbert is the patron saint of expectant mothers and Bohemia. His feast day is June 6.
