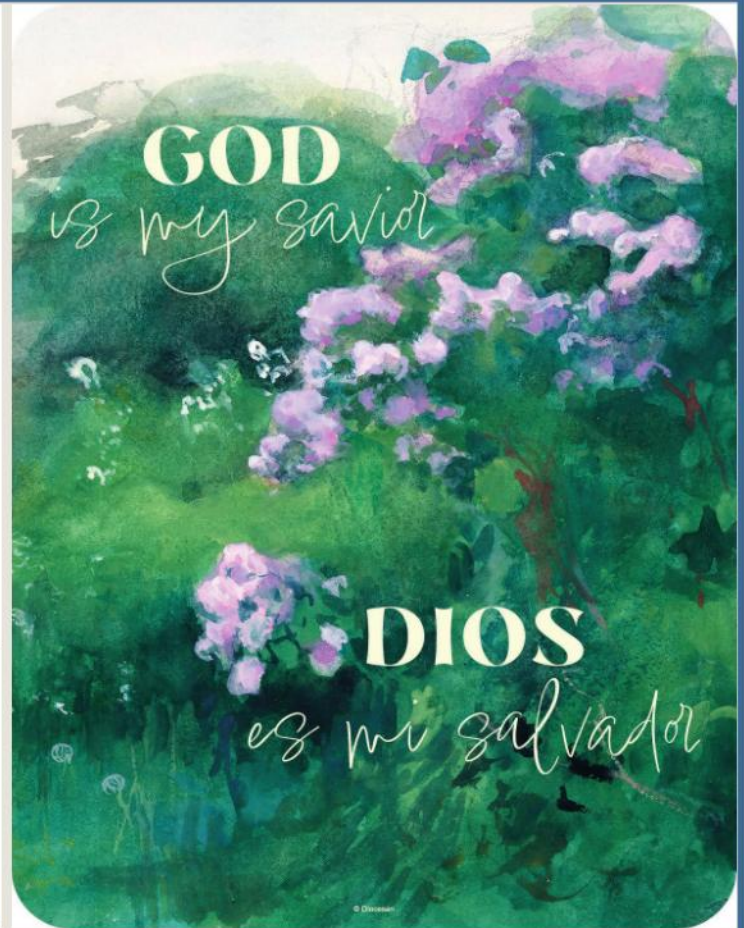

A Message From Father Carlos / Un Mensaje de Padre Carlos

My dear family of St. Faustina,

We are on the 14th Sunday of Ordinary Time. The word of God this weekend speaks to us of Faith and suggests that we dare to trust in Jesus our Savior. May we dare to go to Jesus. It reminds us that we are created in his Image, that he is synonymous with Life, not death. It also invites us to be generous.

The First Reading from the Book of Wisdom reminds us how God creates the human being. He makes him for Life, and with the idea of the eternal, his Image, he establishes him: "So that he may never die." "But through the envy of the evil one comes death and is experienced by those who belong to him ." "We know that by one person, sin enters through one man, Jesus, and salvation comes to us. In the Second Reading, Paul praised the Corinthian community for doing well. They are coming the message of Jesus as it should be. This time, he definitely encourages them to distinguish themselves through generosity. It is about sharing all that God has given them. The blessings received. We have to examine our consciences in this regard and a big one. We are regularly accustomed to being given to asking. Even with God, we are like that only when we need it.

Two miracles in the Gospel: Jairus' daughter and the woman's healing with a flow of blood for 12 years. We are sometimes like that girl, DORMANT, almost dead, negative, pessimistic, hopeless, without illusion. And Jesus is willing to sound us, to bring us out of where we are. He is ready to give us back the Life for which we are created. Jesus says to us: "Talita kum." Are we willing to move towards Jesus, as Jairus and the hemorrhage did? Are we willing to take the step? We come to mass every week and come in contact with Jesus in his word, body, and blood. Much more than touching his cloak. So much more healing-saving power.

"It is enough that we have Faith." Courage!

Mi querida familia de Santa Faustina,

Estamos en el Domingo 14 del Tiempo Ordinario. Y la palabra de Dios de este fin de semana nos habla de Fe y nos sugiere que nos atrevamos a confiar en Jesús nuestro Salvador. Está dispuesto a devolvernos la vida, esa vida para la que fuimos creados. Jesús nos dice: "Talita kum" ¿Estamos dispuestos a movernos hacia Jesús, así como lo hizo Jairus y la hemorroisa? ¿Estamos dispuestos a dar le paso? Nosotros venimos a misa cada semana y entramos en contacto con Jesús, en su palabra y en su cuerpo y su sangre. Mucho más que tocar su manto. Cuanto más poder sanador-salvador.

His love for reading, particularly in the genres of our Catholic Faith, and in the areas of leadership, and psychology, reflects his intellectual curiosity and his commitment to personal growth.

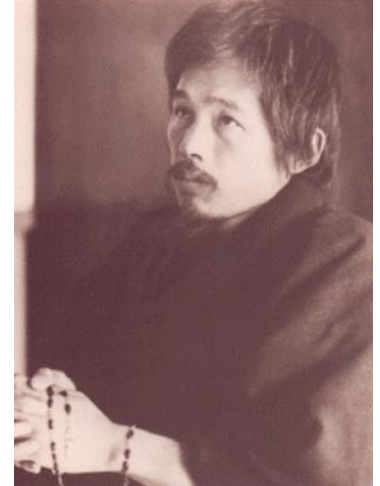
Step away to the quiet for a weekend to rest in the graces of God This August

Servant of God Dr. Takashi Nagai

We remember the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki as the end of World War II and a victory for the US, but this story is about a Japanese man who lived through the horror.

The first bomb fell on Hiroshima on August 5, and then the second one on Nagasaki on August 9.

On August 9, 1945, Dr. Takashi Nagai walked through the debris of his home in Urakami in the Catholic district of Nagasaki, Japan. His wife Midori was home at the time when the bomb fell while he was at the hospital. He found her body in the ruins. She was holding a rosary in her hand, which had melted. Midori was one of eight thousand Japanese Catholics who died that day.

Takashi Nagai was born in rural Japan on February 3, 1908. His father was a Western-educated doctor. Both his parents were from Samurai families. Takashi was raised in the Shinto religion but drifted into atheism when he started medical school in 1928.

His mother died in 1930. Then, the writings of French scientist Blaise Pascal led him to question his atheism. He soon met the Moriyama family, who were descended from the “hidden Christians.” These were people who passed on the faith in Japan during the centuries of persecution.

As he got to know them, Takashi began to learn about the everyday life of Catholics. He listened to the bells of the Cathedral and attended Christmas Midnight Mass with the family. Their daughter Midori promised to pray for him while he was in the army during the war with Manchuria and sent a Catechism book to him while he was away. The Moriyama family was a positive influence as the negative war waged on.

Takashi was baptized on June 9, 1934, taking the Christian name of Paul and proposed to Midori. They were married later that year. He joined the Society of St. Vincent de Paul at his parish, organized teams of doctors to serve remote villages where there was no medical care, and met Maximilian Kolbe, who lived in Japan at that time and would one day be canonized a saint.

He was a doctor and professor at the University of Nagasaki, but Takashi was also a specialist in radiology, which caused his body to be weakened while he was already suffering from leukemia. When the bomb was dropped, he was badly wounded, and the radiation worsened his cancer.

Despite losing his wife and home and suffering with the devastation in the area, Takashi was never bitter or vengeful. Instead he worked to save the wounded and suffering people. He dedicated the rest of his life to use what he learned from Midori which was the love of God is greater than the violence in the world, hoping and praying for peace. Takashi restored the bell of the destroyed Cathedral of Nagasaki so that it rang out over the city again. He planted cherry trees and founded a library for children.

Then he began to write of forgiveness, healing, hope and the value of Nagasaki’s sacrifice. He wrote of God’s tremendous love shining through dark moments, writing thirteen books and many essays. “*The Bells of Nagasaki*” was his most famous work, which became a bestseller.

For the last three years of his life, Takashi was bedridden. He lived in a hut that he named the “As Yourself Hermitage,” meaning “Love your neighbor as yourself.” His two children were safely evacuated before the bombing. They now spent time with him as he studied, sketched, wrote, and received many visitors.

Dr. Takashi Nagai died on May 1, 1951. The first steps towards sainthood have been bestowed on him, being awarded the title “Servant of God.”

He is known as the “Saint of Urakami.” This is the location of the first Cathedral built in Japan in 1895, called Ōura Church.
