# PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."(Lk 10:37).

The Good Samaritan is one of those parables that has gained almost universal recognition even outside of Christian circles. This is understandable. The notion of radical generosity is one of those ideals that many religious traditions would propose to its followers. But that familiarity can dilute an even greater lesson Jesus is teaching here. Jesus is calling his followers not simply to radical generosity, but to love.

And who are we to love? Jesus emphasizes those "other" than our friends, families, and communities; those who have, by that "otherness," been deemed "enemies." To appreciate that, we have to remember that Jews and Samaritans didn't get along and hadn't for almost a thousand years. Disputes over how they worshipped, to what was the proper relationship with pagans, had intensified over the centuries to the point that each side ended up doing appalling things to the other.

When Jesus describes a Samaritan selflessly serving and, in fact, saving a Jewish man, he is calling us not simply to radical generosity, but radical love. For Jesus, this means not simply extending a helping hand to, but giving preference to our enemies - loving in a way that transforms the other... into brother and sister.

Sadly, there are people in our own neighborhoods who fall into groups whose labels could just as easily be swapped for the Jew and the Samaritan in today's story. Jesus makes it clear: The path to eternal life begins when we decide not to cross the street, not to continue to ignore and disengage from the "others" in our midst, but to imitate his selfless sacrificial love.

"For this command that I enjoin on you today is not too mysterious and remote for you.... No, it is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out." (Dt. 30:11

¿Cuál de estos tres, en su opinión, era vecino de la víctima de los ladrones?" Él respondió: "El que lo trató con misericordia". Jesús le dijo: "Ve y haz lo mismo". (Lc 10,37).

El Buen Samaritano es una de esas parábolas que ha ganado reconocimiento casi universal incluso fuera de los círculos cristianos. Esto es comprensible. La noción de generosidad radical es uno de esos ideales que muchas tradiciones religiosas propondrían a sus seguidores. Pero esa familiaridad puede diluir una lección aún mayor que Jesús está enseñando aquí. Jesús está llamando a sus seguidores no sólo a la generosidad radical, sino al amor.

¿Y quiénes somos nosotros para amar? Jesús enfatiza a aquellos "otros" que no son nuestros amigos, familias y comunidades; aquellos que, por esa "alteridad", han sido considerados "enemigos". Para apreciar eso, tenemos que recordar que los judíos y los samaritanos no se llevaban bien y no lo habían hecho durante casi mil años. Las disputas sobre cómo adoraban, cuál era la relación adecuada con los paganos, se habían intensificado a lo largo de los siglos hasta el punto de que cada lado terminó haciendo cosas espantosas al otro.

Cuando Jesús describe a un samaritano sirviendo desinteresadamente y, de hecho, salvando a un hombre judío, nos está llamando no simplemente a la generosidad radical, sino al amor radical. Para Jesús, esto significa no simplemente extender una mano amiga, sino dar preferencia a nuestros enemigos, amar de una manera que transforme al otro. en hermano y hermana.

Lamentablemente, hay personas en nuestros propios vecindarios que caen en grupos cuyas etiquetas podrían cambiarse fácilmente por el judío y el samaritano en la historia de hoy. Jesús lo deja claro: El camino hacia la vida eterna comienza cuando decidimos no cruzar la calle, no seguir ignorando y desvinculándonos de los "otros" en medio de nosotros, sino imitar su amor sacrificial desinteresado.

"Porque este mandato que hoy les ordeno no es demasiado misterioso y remoto para ustedes ... No, es algo muy cercano a ti, ya en tus bocas y en tus corazones; solo tienes que llevarlo a cabo". (Dt. 30:11

# ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

Tekakwitha was born in 1656 in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon. Her mother was a Catholic Algonquin, who was captured by the Mohawks and married a Mohawk chief. She spent most of her life in Fonda, an area near Auriesville, New York.



When Tekakwitha was four years old, she contracted smallpox, which scarred her skin and left her partially blind. The scars were humiliating for her, causing her to wear a blanket to hide her face. Tekakwitha lost her parents and younger brother to smallpox, so she was raised by her uncle, a Mohawk chief who detested Christianity.

As she grew older, Tekakwitha became a skilled worker with great patience. She was diligent and intelligent but didn't want to marry. Her adopted parents gave her more work as a punishment for not accepting a suitor that they recommended. She did the extra work, but still would not marry. She liked to walk in the woods to pray and listen to God and was always punished for her ways, including being denied food on Sundays because she would not work on that day. Tekakwitha was often threatened with torture or death to renounce her faith, but she kept her Christian ways.

At age nineteen, Tekakwitha converted to Catholicism. She was baptized on Easter Sunday in 1676 and took the name Catherine, for St. Catherine of Siena.

Kateri is the Mohawk form of Catherine. On this day she took a vow of chastity, causing her family and friends great anguish. Some of the neighbors started speaking about her as a sorceress, so Kateri left the tribe and traveled to a Christian native community south of Montreal, walking the two hundred mile journey alone.

She was very devout and would put thorns on her sleeping mat. Kateri always prayed for the conversion of her fellow Mohawks and

often fasted. When she did eat, she would ruin her food to minimize the flavor. On at least one occasion, she burned herself. Self-mortification was common among the Mohawks. She was devoted but also in bad health. Kateri died on April 17, 1680, at the age of twenty four. Her last words were "lesos konoronkwa," which means Jesus, I love you.


At her death, witnesses said that her scars had vanished minutes later and her face was beautiful.

St. Kateri Tekakwitha was beatified by Pope John Paul II on June 22, 1980. In 2002, Pope John Paul II named her as a patroness of World Youth Day. She was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 21, 2012.

She is the patron saint of ecology, orphans, the environment, people in exile, those who are ridiculed for their piety and Native Americans. St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American to be declared a saint. Her relics are sealed in a marble tomb at the St. Francis Xavier Mission in Kahnawake, Canada. She is also known as the Lily of the Mohawks for her devotion and kindness.

There are many statues and icons for St. Kateri Tekakwitha, including a bronze figure on the bronze front doors of St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. In St. Augustine, Florida, there is a statue of St. Kateri at the altar in the Church of Our Lady of La Leche. Her feast day is July 14.
