


Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

Then he said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." (Lk. 12:15)

For first-century Jews, there was no consensus and no defined doctrine of resurrection - no accepted understanding of how God would punish evil or reward good. Instead, many looked for God's approval or disapproval in this life: Those who lived long lives, and had material blessings and lots of children, were seen as favored by God, while those who had little were seen as less favored.

From the very beginning, we see the rich man as misled by the accumulation of wealth. Far from living in God's favor, he is actually deaf to God's voice; in fact, the only voice he hears is his own and it is full of self-concern and materialism. See how he refers to himself eight

times - six times in the first person, and twice in the second - clearly his heart lies with his possessions.



Brothers and sisters: If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. (Col 3:1-3)

Luego dijo a la multitud: "Cuídense de protegerse contra toda codicia, porque, aunque uno pueda ser rico, su vida no consiste en posesiones". (Lc. 12:15)

Para los judíos del primer siglo, no había consenso ni doctrina definida de la resurrección, ni comprensión aceptada de cómo Dios castigaría el mal o recompensaría el bien. En cambio, muchos buscaron la aprobación o desaprobación de Dios en esta vida: Aquellos que vivieron largas vidas, y tuvieron bendiciones materiales y muchos hijos, fueron vistos como favorecidos por Dios, mientras que aquellos que tenían poco fueron vistos como menos favorecidos.

Desde el principio, vemos al hombre rico como engañado por la acumulación de riqueza. Lejos de vivir en el favor de Dios, en realidad es sordo a la voz de Dios; de hecho, la única voz que escucha es la suya y está llena de preocupación y materialismo. Vea cómo se refiere a sí mismo ocho veces, seis veces en primera persona y dos veces en la segunda, claramente su corazón está en sus posesiones.

No podemos comprometernos a vivir como Dios quiere y luego tratar de cubrir nuestras apuestas en el altar del materialismo. En cambio, ante la realidad de la muerte se nos pide que pongamos nuestra confianza firmemente en Dios. Estamos llamados, en las palabras del salmo de hoy, a escuchar la voz de Dios para que su cuidado misericordioso sea nuestro a lo largo de nuestras vidas.

Hermanos y hermanas: Si fueron criados con Cristo, busquen lo que está arriba, donde Cristo está sentado a la diestra de Dios. Piensa en lo que está arriba, no en lo que hay en la tierra. Porque has muerto, y tu vida está escondida con Cristo en Dios. (Col 3:1-3)

of Holy Matrimony

The sacrament of Holy Matrimony is a serious commitment not to be taken lightly or unadvisedly. It typically takes 6-12 months to complete the required and proper preparation for marriage. Therefore, if this sacrament is a consideration, please contact our office approximately one year in advance and before wedding plans and a date are set.

Convalidations: If you are Catholic and married civilly and would like your marriage recognized by the Catholic Church, the process of receiving the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony is approximately a 6 -month process. Please plan ahead and contact our office for more information.

FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION—As is the custom here at St. Faustina, the First Friday Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will be held on Friday, August 5 following the 8 a.m. Mass (from 8:30 a.m. until 9:30 a.m.). ST. IGNATIUS of LOYOLA

Inigo Lopez de Loyola was born in Castile Spain on October 23, 1491, the youngest of thirteen children of an aristocratic family. When he was seven, his mother died and he was raised by a neighbor as an noble, dreaming of becoming famous. At the age of eighteen, he became a soldier, now calling himself Ignatius, then became a duelist and killed a Moor with whom he argued about the divinity of Jesus. He fought in several battles, with a talent for surviving, which earned



him promotions to command troops, In 1521 he and his men were defending the town of Pamplona against a French attack when Ignatius' legs were hit by a cannonball. One leg was broken, but the other was badly wounded. Many surgeries were done to save his life and his legs using no anesthesia and causing great pain. His condition worsened and the doctors told him to prepare for death. On June 29, 1521, the feast day of Saints Peter and Paul, Ignatius began to improve. Eventually part of one leg was amputated which sped up his recovery.

While healing, Ignatius began to read books about Jesus and the lives of the saints. These stories had a profound impact on him, causing him to become more devout. The book which influenced him the most was "De Vita Christi", which tells about life of Christ asking a person to visualize himself or herself in the presence of Jesus during the episodes

of His life. This biography inspired Ignatius' own spiritual exercises and started him thinking about becoming a servant of Christ. He realized that sometimes he was happy and other times sorrowful, recognizing that God brought him happiness while the sadness was brought by evil. After his recovery, he entered the Benedictine monastery, Santa Maria de Montserrat. on March 25, 1522. Kneeling before a statue of the Black Madonna, Ignatius laid down his military uniform and gave his other clothes away to a poor man. Then he walked to a hospital in the town of Manresa and worked around the hospital in exchange for a room, begging for food. He would also go into a cave and practice spiritual exercises, which gave him a better understanding of himself, God and God's plan for him.

Life was difficult for Ignatius causing him to suffer with doubts, anxiety and depression, but this also made him recognize that these negative ways were not from God. He began writing his thoughts and experiences in a journal, which he would use later for developing new spiritual exercises for the thousands of people who would follow him, which are still widely practiced by religious and laity alike. Ignatius realized that he needed to obtain an education to convert people.

He returned to Barcelona, attending a grammar school with children to learn Latin and other beginning subjects. Then he studied at universities and had lengthy conversations about spiritual matters with other people. This attracted the attention of the Inquisition, who accused Ignatius of preaching without a formal degree in theology. They felt that he could introduce heresy by way of conversation and misunderstanding. He was questioned three times by the Inquisition, but he was always exonerated. This inspired him to further his education, attending the Collège Sainte-Barbe of the University of Paris at age thirty eight and earning a master's degree at the age of forty four. He was denied a doctorate because of his age and health issues.

He roomed with Peter Faber, who was French and Francis Xavier, who was a Basque. They became friends with Ignatius leading them in his spiritual exercises. Soon other men joined them and became followers, referring to themselves as "Friends in the Lord". They went to Rome in 1540, meeting with Pope Paul III who approved their official religious order. The men wanted to elect Ignatius as their first leader, but he declined, saying he was not worthy and thought that others were more experienced theologically, but the group insisted and Ignatius accepted the role as their first leader. They called themselves the Society of Jesus, causing some to call them "Jesuits" to disparage them. The name stuck but their good works overcame the negative connotation.

Ignatius imposed a strict, militaristic rule on his order from his training and yet the order grew, soon finding its niche in education. Ignatius died in 1556, but before his death, his order established thirty five schools and boasted one thousand members doing much of the work of stopping the spread of the Protestant Reformation. Prerequisites and class levels would stem from the Jesuit schools, which were heavily inspired by Ignatius' experience in Paris. Today, the Society of Jesus is known for its work in education around the world, with several universities founded in the name of Ignatius and in the traditional Jesuit spirit. They also perform many other important works around the globe.

Ignatius died on July 31, 1556, at the age of 64. He was beatified by Pope Paul V on July 27, 1609 and canonized by Pope Gregory XV on March 12, 1622. His feast day is July 31. He is the patron saint of the Society of Jesus, soldiers, educators, education and the Dioceses of San Sebastian and Bilbao, Biscay & Gipuzkoa and the Basque Country and for the Military Ordinariate of the Philippines.


