## PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

Rejoice and leap for joy on that day! Behold, your reward will be great in heaven. For their ancestors treated the prophets in the same way. (Lk 6:23)

Today's Gospel is a bit of a small treatise on hope, at least in the sense of shining light on how our hope can become misplaced. We so often think to ourselves that if we place our hope in this person or that thing, then we will avoid suffering. But the Christian life is not about avoiding suffering. The Christian life includes finding meaning in suffering through the hope we have in Christ Jesus.

The redemption found in Christ turns cultural norms on their head. Those who are suffering - the poor, the hungry, the weeping, and the persecuted - are much higher spiritually because they have nothing left other than the Lord. In a certain sense, the more we have stripped away from us in this life, the richer we become as we rely more and more on the Lord.

As we pray with the readings today, let us ask ourselves, "Where am I placing my hope? Am I placing my hope solely in the Lord or is my hope being placed in people or things?"

Rejoice and leap for joy on that day! Behold, your reward will be great in heaven. For their ancestors treated the prophets in the same way. (Ps 1:6)

El Evangelio de hoy es un pequeño tratado sobre la esperanza, al menos en el sentido de iluminar cómo nuestra esperanza puede perder su lugar. A menudo pensamos para nosotros mismos que si ponemos nuestra esperanza en esta persona o cosa, entonces evitaremos el sufrimiento. Pero la vida cristiana no se trata de evitar el sufrimiento. La vida cristiana incluye encontrar sentido en el sufrimiento a través de la esperanza que tenemos en Cristo Jesús.

La redención que se encuentra en Cristo le da la vuelta a las normas culturales. Aquellos que sufren - los pobres, los hambrientos, los que lloran y los perseguidos - son espiritualmente más elevados porque no les queda nada más que el Señor. En cierto sentido, cuanto más nos hemos despojado de nosotros en esta vida, más ricos nos volvemos a medida que confiamos más y más en el Señor.

Al orar con las lecturas de hoy, preguntémonos: "¿Dónde estoy poniendo mi esperanza? ¿Estoy poniendo mi esperanza únicamente en el Señor o mi esperanza está puesta en las personas o en las cosas?"

Porque Yahveh conoce el camino de los justos, pero el camino de los impíos se pierde. (Sal 1:6)





## ST. JULIANA OF NICOMEDIA

Juliana was born in Izmit, Turkey in 285. She was the daughter of Africanus, a pagan who hated Christians. When she was a child, Juliana was betrothed to one of the emperor's advisors, Eleusius of Antioch. As she grew older, she wanted to become a Christian and was secretly baptized. Juliana was an obedient daughter, but when her wedding was approaching, she refused to be married, causing her father to beat her. Eleusius was now the governor who still wanted to marry her, allowing her to keep her faith, but Juliana refused. His



ego was beaten and he wanted revenge, so he monitored Juliana and found out that she was a Christian, but her parents still didn't know this. Eleusius betrayed her to the Roman governor and had her arrested.

Even though she was in jail, Eleusius continued to ask her to marry him, but she would not so on the orders of the Roman Governor, Eleusius ordered her to be beaten and then burnt her face with a hot iron. He said to her "Go now at the mirror to see your beauty". Her reaction was to say "At the resurrection of the righteous, there won't exist burnings and wounds but only the soul. So Eleusius, I prefer to have now the wounds of the body which are temporary, rather than the wounds of the soul which torture eternal." At this prison, Juliana saw a demon pretending to be an angel, who

wanted her to offer sacrifice to pagan gods. Juliana prayed to the Lord for help and the demon went away, first admitting that devils suffer when Catholics attend Mass. She was severely beaten in front of large crowds but was healed and given new strength by God. This caused many of the witnesses to become Christians, who were all beheaded for their faith.

Eleusius sentenced Juliana to death. She accepted this fate with joy and was martyred in 304 by being beheaded after suffering torture. Sometime later, Eleusius was eaten by a lion, while he was shipwrecked on an island.

Another Christian women named Barbara was tortured with Juliana. They were forced to walk throughout the city without clothing. Barbara prayed and an angel came and covered the pair with robes. Barbara was killed and also became a saint.

St. Juliana is the subject of an Anglo-Saxon poem, believed to have been written by Cynewulf in the eighth century. She was popular in the Middle Ages, especially in the Netherlands, as the patron saint of sickness.

Saint Gregory the Great wrote a letter, testifying to the special veneration of St. Juliana in an area of Naples, Italy. A pious woman named Januaria built a church on one of her estates for Saints Severin and Juliana. St. Gregory wrote to Fortunatus II, Bishop of Naples, telling him to let Januaria build the church. After her death, a noble lady named Sephonia came through Nicomedia and took the saint's body with her to Italy and buried it in Campania, near Naples.

Saint Juliana has traditionally been invoked for the safe delivery of women in labor and for protection from fever and contagious diseases.

Her feast day is February 16.


