PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

But rather, love your enemies and do good to them, and lend expecting nothing back; then your reward will be great and you will be children of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful. (Lk 6:35-36)

Our Gospel reading for today comes from Jesus' Sermon on the Plain. Jesus commands his disciples to love their enemies, concluding that they are to be merciful, just as the Father is merciful. In the next, much shorter, section of the reading, Jesus tells them to stop judging and condemning, and to be forgiving and generous. As much as they forgive, they will be forgiven, and as much as they give, they will receive.

Jesus is asking his disciples, and us, to rise above our base human natures. In our sinfulness we come to hate our enemies and we fight back when we are wronged, to keep what is ours and to give only when expecting something in return. It is natural to be self-interested because we are sinners: Even sinners love those who love them. But Jesus asks us to be merciful as our Father is merciful.

We are to be merciful because we have been shown mercy. We are to treat others not as we would want them to treat us, but to show them the same kindness that God has shown us. When we meet Jesus on that final day, let us hope that he recognizes us and welcomes us home. May our hope in this final reward be our motivation to overcome selfishness and greed, to look beyond our own self-interest, and to be as generous and forgiving as Christ.

Just as we have borne the image of the earthly one, we shall also bear the image of the heavenly one.

(1Cor 15:49)

Mas bien, amad a vuestros enemigos; haced el bien, y prestad sin esperar nada a cambio; y vuestra recompensa será grande, y seréis hijos del Altísimo, porque el es bueno con los ingratos y los perversos. "Sed compasivos, como vuestro Padre es compasivo". (Lc. 6:35-36)

Nuestra lectura del Evangelio de hoy proviene del Sermón de la Llanura de Jesús. Jesús ordena a sus discípulos que amen a sus enemigos, concluyendo que deben ser misericordiosos, así como el Padre es misericordioso. En la siguiente sección de la lectura, mucho más corta, Jesús les dice que dejen de juzgar y condenar, y que sean indulgentes y generosos. Así como perdonen, serán perdonados, y así como den, recibirán.

Jesús está pidiendo a sus discípulos, y a nosotros, que nos elevemos por encima de nuestra baja naturaleza humana. En nuestra iniquidad llegamos a odiar a nuestros enemigos y nos defendemos cuando somos agraviados, para mantener lo que es nuestro y dar solo cuando esperamos algo a cambio. Es natural interesarnos en nosotros mismos porque somos pecadores: incluso los pecadores aman a quienes los aman. Pero Jesús nos pide que seamos misericordiosos como nuestro Padre es misericordioso.

Debemos ser misericordiosos porque se nos ha mostrado misericordia. Debemos tratar a los demás no como quisiéramos que nos trataran a nosotros, sino mostrar la misma bondad que Dios nos ha mostrado. Cuando nos encontremos con Jesús en ese último día, esperemos que nos reconozca y nos dé la bienvenida a casa. Que nuestra esperanza en esta recompensa final sea nuestra motivación para superar el egoísmo y la codicia, para mirar más allá de nuestro propio interés y ser tan generosos y compasivos como Cristo.

Y del mismo modo que hemos llevado la imagen del hombre terreno, llevaremos también la imagen del Celeste. (1Cor 15:49)



PARISH MINISTRIES & UPCOMING EVENTS



ASH WEDNESDAY is March 2. Ashes will be distributed at the 8 am Mass and the 7 pm Bilingual Mass. They will also be distributed at noon during a service. Ash Wednesday is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation, however, it is a day that the Catholic Church recommends Fasting and Abstinence.

According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, *Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday.* On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintaining strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals in not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On the days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or the ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fasting and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence and it is recommended that abstinence be observed every Friday during Lent.

El MIÉRCOLES DE CENIZA es el 2 de marzo. Las cenizas se distribuirán en la misa de las 8 am y la misa bilingüe de las 7 pm. También se distribuirán al mediodía durante un servicio. El Miércoles de Ceniza NO es un Día Santo de Obligación, sin embargo, es un día en que la Iglesia Católica recomienda el ayuno y la abstinencia.

Según la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos, el ayuno debe ser observado por todos los mayores de 18 años que aún no han celebrado su cumpleaños número 59. En un día de ayuno, se permite una comida completa. Otras dos comidas, suficientes para mantener la fuerza, se pueden tomar de acuerdo con las necesidades de cada una, pero juntas no deben ser iguales a otra comida completa. No se permite comer entre comidas, pero se permiten líquidos, incluyendo leche y jugos.

La abstinencia es observada por todos los mayores de 14 años. En los días de abstinencia, no se permite la carne. Tenga en cuenta que cuando la salud o la capacidad de trabajar se verían seriamente afectadas, la ley no obliga. En caso de duda sobre el ayuno y la abstinencia, se debe consultar al párroco. El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días de ayuno y abstinencia y se recomienda que la abstinencia se observe todos los viernes durante la Cuaresma.



Lent Readings 2022

Lent books will be available after all Masses next weekend. The books, which available in both English and Spanish, are free, but to make sure every family that wants one is able to get one, we ask that you only take one per family. Father Ramon and the St. Faustina Parish Staff wish you a very Blessed and Holy Lent season.

Our parish bi-monthly blood drive will be held on Sunday, February 27 from 7:30 am until 12:30 pm. Since the ministry began on June 30, 2019, St. Faustina's parishioners have donated 251 pints of blood, thus saving up to 753 lives, over the course of 14 drives. We have hit our goal in all but one drive and we boast two drives in which at least 25 parishioners donated. Your donation, which takes less than one-half hour, can save up to three lives.



Our community and our state are currently suffering a blood shortage, so please consider donating.


ST. PETER DAMIAN

Pietro was born in Ravenna, Italy in 1007, the youngest of a noble, but poor family. His parents died while he was a young child. First an older brother assumed responsibility, but abused and mistreated Pietro. Then another brother, who was a priest, took on his care and sent him to school. Pietro added this brother's

name, Damianus to his. He attended schools in Ravenna and Parma, studying Canon Law and theology, obtaining a degree from the University of Parma where he also taught. By the year 1035, he wanted a different life so he entered the Fonte Avellana Hermitage in Serra Sant'Abbondio as a novice and monk. The hermits there mainly prayed, read and lived in austerity. Pietro had massive insomnia due to his extreme actions in self-mortification, but recovered and became the monks' teacher for a few years. In 1043, he became the Assistant and later the Prior of Fonte Avellana, a position which he held until his death.

He was a stern, but kind man, strict with his guidelines for penance who created a nap time to offset the nightly working schedule, built a cloister, purchased silver chalices and a processional cross and added many books to the library. He was living a cloistered life, but was also a reformer who abhored political and social scandals. He wrote to the new Pope, Gregory VI, urging him to deal with the disgraceful occurences in the Church. He also communicated with Emporer Henry III, attending Henry's coronation in Rome as well as a Synod in 1047, where rulings were passed against simony, which is the buying or selling of ecclesiastical privileges or benefices, such as pardons or funds received in exchange for services rendered.



Then he returned home to the hermitage where he published letters on different theological controversies. In 1050, he wrote to Pope Leo IX about sexual acts occurring in the clergy. A few years later, Pope Benedict XVI said that Peter was "one of the most significant figures in the 11th century, ... a love of solitude and and at the same time a fearless man of the Church, committed personally to the task of reform."

Peter condemned philosophy, claiming that the first teacher of this subject was the devil. His argument was that monks should not have to study philosophy because Christ did not choose philosophers as disciples, making philosophy unnecessary for salvation. But years later St. Thomas Aquinas thought that "philosophy should serve theology as a servant serves her mistress," writing extensively about this field and becoming a Doctor of the Church.

In 1057, Pope Stephen IX wanted Peter to become a cardinal, but Peter resisted, wanting his hermit life. He was forced to accept and became the Cardinal of Ostia and the Administrator of the Gubbio Diocese on November 20, 1057.

He was given many obligations, which ended when Pope Stephen died. The replacement was the antipope, Benedict X, whom Peter opposed, so he went back to Fonte Avellana. Due to his great rhetorical skills and an in depth knowledge of Canon Law, Peter was sent as a legate to Milan in 1059 by the new Pope Nicholas II to clean up the simony and to end the marriages of priests. The clergy of Milan opposed the authority of Rome, so Peter told them that the Pope had the final right, giving penances to the guilty and reinstating celibacy, which took seven years to fully be accepted. In those years, Peter wanted to leave this office, but the Pope wouldn't let him. In 1063, he was appointed as the legate for a dispute in France, then was sent to Florence to settle a quarrel there, but was unsuccessful, so he resigned and went home. In 1069, he was sent to resolve a disagreement in Germany, soon returning home again. He wrote many liturgical works, but his most famous one was, *De Divina Omnipotentia*, a long letter in which he discusses God's power.

Peter died in Faenza, Italy on February 22, 1073. No formal canonization occurred, but he is venerated as a saint and became a Doctor of the Church in 1828 by Pope Leo XII. St. Peter Damian's feast day is February 21.
