PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." (John 21:15)

Jesus loves us unconditionally. When people speak of unconditional love, they usually mean a love that is without limits or conditions, one that is changeless, no matter what happens. Given the ups and downs of life, such a love can seem challenging, if not impossible. And yet as we see in today's Gospel, this is the love that Jesus offers to Peter, who once denied and deserted him.

After all that has happened, Jesus loves Peter unconditionally. Yes, the three denials must be acknowledged and recognized, but they are never to be the final word. In a moment full of tenderness and compassion, Jesus erases those denials with declarations of love. What else can erase betrayal but love? Here in this powerful moment, not only does Jesus forgive and heal the broken Peter, but he allows Peter to forgive himself. This is truly a moment of healing and reconciliation for Peter.

As we hear this Gospel, we are invited to put ourselves in Peter's shoes and be recipients of this unconditional love, especially where we have been broken or injured by life's events. As with Peter, Jesus never gives up on us, for his love for us is equally without limits or conditions, no matter what happens. So as we celebrate the Easter season and its promise of new life and abundant mercy, let us give thanks for that unconditional love.

Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. Amen, amen, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." He said this signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when he had said this, he said to him, "Follow me." (John 21:18-19)

Cuando terminaron de desayunar, Jesús le dijo a Simón Pedro: "Simón, hijo de Juan, ¿me amas más a mí que estos?" Simón Pedro le respondió: "Sí, Señor, sabes que te amo". Jesús le dijo: "Alimenta mi corderos". (Juan 21:15)

Jesús nos ama incondicionalmente. Cuando las personas hablan de amor incondicional, por lo general, significa un amor que no tiene límites ni condiciones, uno que es inmutable, no pase lo que pase. Dados los altibajos de la vida, tal amor puede parecer desafiante, si no imposible. Y, sin embargo, como vemos en el Evangelio de hoy', este es el amor que Jesús ofrece a Pedro, quien una vez lo negó y lo abandonó.

Después de todo lo que ha sucedido, Jesús ama a Pedro incondicionalmente. Sí, las tres negaciones deben ser reconocidas y conocidas, pero nunca deben ser la última palabra. En un momento lleno de ternura y compasión, Jesús borra esas negaciones con declaraciones de amor. ¿Qué otra cosa puede borrar la traición sino el amor? Aquí en este poderoso Momento, Jesús no sólo perdona y sana al Pedro quebrantado, sino que permite a Pedro para perdonarse a sí mismo. Este es verdaderamente un momento de sanación y reconciliación para Pedro.

Al escuchar este Evangelio, estamos invitados a ponernos en los zapatos de Pedro y ser destinatarios de este amor incondicional, especialmente donde hemos sido rotos o herido por eventos de vida. Al igual que con Pedro, Jesús nunca se da por vencido con nosotros, por su amor por nosotros. es igualmente sin límites ni condiciones, pase lo que pase. Así que mientras celebramos el tiempo de Pascua y su promesa de vida nueva y misericordia abundante, demos gracias por ese amor incondicional.

Jesús le dijo: "Apacienta mis ovejas. Amén, amén, te digo, cuando eras más joven, solías vestirte e ir a donde quieras; pero cuando envejezcas, extenderás las manos y alguien más se vestirá tú y te llevas a donde no quieres ir". Dijo esto significando qué tipo de muerte glorificaría. Dios. Y cuando dijo esto, le dijo: "Sígueme". (Juan 21:18-19)



ST. PEREGRINE

Peregrine Laziosi was born in Forli, Italy in 1265, the only son of well off parents. His name means pilgrim. The people of Forli were strongly opposed to the Pope. Peregrine became a rebel as a teenager by joining a group called the "Enemies of the Pope" and then becoming their leader.

Pope Martin IV closed the churches in Forli, trying to correct the situation, which failed. Then he sent Philip Benazi, of the Order of Servites, as his personal ambassador to bring peace to the angry mob. As Philip addressed the people, they dragged him off the rostrum, beating him with clubs and rocks. Peregrine hit him with a vicious blow to the face. But then Peregrine was full of regret, bowed to Philip and asked for his for-



giveness, which Philip gave with a smile. This moment led Peregrine to deep worship and prayer, helping him to abandon his anti-church activities and to follow the Pope. He would later become ordained as a priest.

Peregrine then became a devout follower of Philip Benazi, listening to all Philip had to say. He also prayed in Our Lady's chapel in the Cathedral. One day, while kneeling there, he had a vision of the Blessed Mother holding a black habit like the one the Servites wore. Mary told Peregrine to "Go to Siena. There you will find devout men who call themselves my servants. Attach yourself to them."

Peregrine became a Servite, clothed in his religious habit by Philip, who was the Abbot in Siena. The Servite order is particularly devoted to the worship of the Blessed Mother. Each day Peregrine became more fervent. He atoned for his sins by treating himself severely and working hard for the poor and downtrodden. He became known as the "Angel of Good Counsel." Peregrine would always stand instead of sitting, which he considered a penance.

He went to back Forli to start a Servite monastery. A few years later a cancerous growth appeared on his right foot. It was so bad that he agreed to an amputation. The night before the surgery he spent hours in prayer. He fell asleep and had a dream that Christ was touching him and healing his foot. When he woke up he found that his foot was cured. Word spread about this and people came to see Peregrine for prayers and petitions. Some of the people were cured when Pere-

grine whispered "Jesus" into their ears.

Peregrine died on May 1, 1345. He was beatified by Pope Paul V in 1609 and was canonized by Pope Benedict XIII in 1726.

His feast day is May 1 and he is the patron saint of people with cancer, foot ailments, AIDS and all incurable diseases. He is buried in a chapel in Forli in a glass case behind the altar. The chapel walls are covered with hearts of thanksgiving. A basilica was built in St. Peregrine's hometown of Forli, Italy. In the US, there are shrines in Chicago, Illinois, Mesa, Arizona, San Mateo, California and Portland, Oregon. There is also a shrine in the Philippines at Tunasan, Muntinlupa City which displays a rib from St. Peregrine's body.

Prayer to St. Peregrine

Saint Peregrine, as a humble Servant of Mary, you experienced human weakness and the pain and suffering of sickness. Knowing that medicine and human knowledge have limits, we pray for all those involved with the medical profession that they will be a true source of healing and comfort to all people.

Like you, we also turn to God in our suffering, just as Jesus reached out and touched you with His healing hand, we pray that the following sick person(s) will be strengthened in body and spirit and cured of their illness by Jesus Christ through your intercession: (here mention the name(s) of your sick relatives and friends).

In gratitude we pray for all the people in the world that they will come to know you, St. Peregrine, and the love that God has for each of them. Amen.


