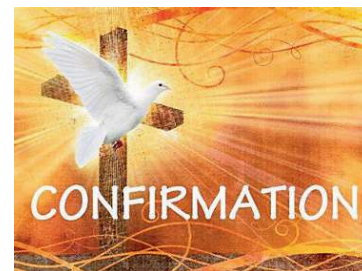

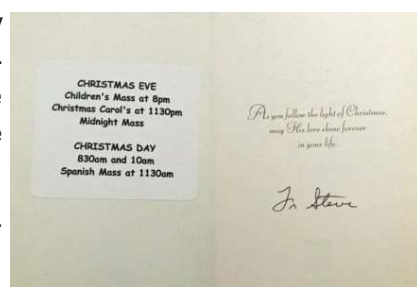


REMEMBERING OUR HISTORY—

THE IMAGE OF DIVINE MERCY

In 1931, our Lord appeared to St. Faustina in a vision. She saw Jesus clothed in a white garment with His right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching His garment in the area of the Heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale. She gazed intently at the Lord in silence, her soul filled with awe, but also with great joy. Jesus said to her:

Paint an image according to the pattern you see, with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You. I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over [its] enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I Myself will defend it as My own glory (Diary, 47, 48). I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: Jesus, I trust in You (327). I desire that this image be venerated, first in your chapel, and [then] throughout the world (47).

At the request of her spiritual director, St. Faustina asked the Lord about the meaning of the rays in the image. She heard these words in reply:

The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls. These two rays issued forth from the depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. Happy is the one who will dwell in their shelter, for the just hand of God shall not lay hold of him (299). By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works (742).

These words indicate that the Image represents the graces of Divine Mercy poured out upon the world, especially through Baptism and the Eucharist.

Many different versions of this image have been painted, but our Lord made it clear that the painting itself is not what is important. When St. Faustina first saw the original image that was being painted under her direction, she wept in disappointment and complained to Jesus: "Who will paint You as beautiful as You are?" (313).

In answer, she heard these words: **"Not in the beauty of the color, nor of the brush lies the greatness of this image, but in My grace" (313).**

So, no matter which version of the image we prefer, we can be assured that it is a vehicle of God's grace if it is revered with trust in His mercy.

HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY

ST. MATTHIAS THE APOSTLE

Matthias was born in Judea in the first century. He studied God's law under St. Simeon and his name means "gift of God."

Matthias was chosen by the Apostles to replace Judas Iscariot, who committed suicide after his betrayal. Matthias is unique in this fashion because all of the other Apostles were recruited by Christ, but he was a replacement after Jesus ascended into heaven and before the descent of the Holy Spirit. This is documented in the Acts of the Apostles.

One hundred and twenty people were gathered for prayer and reflection in the upper room. Then Peter stood up to propose a way to make the replacement choice. He had one condition which was that this person had to be a disciple from the beginning, one who witnessed the life of Jesus, his death, Resurrection and Ascension and was a follower of all of Christ's teachings.



He is not mentioned in the three Synoptic Gospels, which are from Matthew, Mark and Luke or the Gospels of John, but from the Acts where we learn that Matthias had followed Christ from his Baptism until his Ascension. He was one of the seventy two disciples of Jesus sent out to preach. Soon after Peter called the assembled disciples and said that he wanted to replace Judas. The two candidates chosen were Joseph Barsabbas and Matthias. The eleven Apostles prayed on this and cast lots to select the replacement. The winner was Matthias.

Acts of the Apostles 1: 21-26:

"Therefore, it is necessary that one of the men who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day on which he was taken up from us, become with us a witness to his resurrection."

So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias.

Then they prayed, "You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this apostolic ministry from which Judas turned away to go to his own place.

Then they gave lots to them, and the lot fell upon Matthias, and he was counted with the eleven apostles. "

Outside of knowing that he was the replacement Apostle, much of what we know about St. Matthias is vague and conflicting. Tradition says that he preached in Cappadocia and near the Caspian Sea, as well as in Judea and Jerusalem. He then went to Aethiopia, where he was stoned to death.

One story is in *The Synopsis of Dorotheus*, which contains this tradition: "Matthias preached the Gospel to barbarians and meat-eaters in the interior of Ethiopia, where the sea harbor of Hyssus is, at the mouth of the river Phasis. He died at Sebastopolis, and was buried there, near the Temple of the Sun."

Fourteenth-century historian Nicephorus said that Matthias died by crucifixion in Colchis, which is now in the modern nation of Georgia. Seventeenth-century historian Louis-Sébastien Le Nain de Tillemont stated that Matthias was stoned and then beheaded in Jerusalem, while another story was that he died of old age.

According to another legend there are claims that St. Matthias' remains were brought to Italy through Empress Helen, the mother of Emperor Constantine the Great, also known as St. Helena of the Cross because she found the True Cross on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Some of the relics were interred in the Abbey of Santa Giustina in Padua and the remaining relics were placed in the Abbey of St. Matthias in Trier, Germany.

There was some evidence that Matthias wrote a gospel, but Pope Gelasius declared this unverified, while some people knew about the writing and spoke about it.

Matthias taught about self-control where people should put their spiritual desires above their physical wishes, giving them joy and peace. He said that the physical body is temporary, but the spiritual soul is permanent and spoke about the Holy Spirit who empowers this in everyone.

St. Matthias is the patron saint of recovered alcoholics, carpenters, tailors, people who need hope for overcoming addictions and caregivers of addicts. His feast day was included in the Roman Calendar in the eleventh century and is celebrated on May 14.
