A Reflection of Our Journey

Where did the time go?

On September 30, 2006, Father Stephen Phillips celebrated the Sacrifice of the Mass in a conference room at, what was, Westgate Hotel, in front of 64 parishioners. That day St. Faustina Catholic Parish was born and a dream...and a journey...began.

On Saturday, February 4, 2023, Bishop John Noonan Blessed a new church building in honor of our patron saint, St. Faustina. More than 750 parishioners, family, friends, visitors, and surrounding community residents...many outside the church, some peeking in the windows... joined the Blessing Mass that saw the next step in the dream...and the journey...of St. Faustina Catholic Parish.

Shortly after Bishop Noonan's departure, Father Ramon celebrated the Sacrifice of the Mass at 4 pm, the parish's first regularly scheduled Mass, with 498 in attendance. Combined with the parish's four other scheduled Sunday Masses, a total of 2,239 were witness to the fact that Father Stephen's dream had become a reality.

Before the Blessing Mass, numerous photos were taken with the Bishop. However, the most meaningful photograph, at least to the parishioners who sat before Father Stephen in that conference room almost 16 and a half years ago, was when Michael Williamson from RD Michaels, the contractors that built our church building at 15551 N. Boggy Marsh Road, presented the keys to Father Ramon.

At the Blessing Mass, Bishop Noonan recalled the story of Exodus and the Jews' 40-year journey to the Promised Land. "Parishioners of St. Faustina maybe felt like the people of Israel," he said. "You have been wandering, searching for a home."

Like that journey, not all our parishioners made it to the Promised Land. No doubt those who have been on

the St. Faustina journey, who were present to realize the dream, shed a tear for loved ones who were watching from their Heavenly Home in God's Kingdom.

Bishop Noonan went on to thank and recognize the "dedication, participation, sacrifices, and steadfastness" that enabled St. Faustina Catholic Parish to finally obtain its own "spiritual home".

At the 4 o'clock Mass, Father Ramon, the fourth priest to lead the St. Faustina flock, gushed as he thanked all those who have contributed to the success and growth of the parish. He recognized those who were not with us physically, but in spirit, and he hinted at things to come now that the parish had its own permanent address.

This, however, is not the end of our St. Faustina parish journey. Plans are already underway to construct a larger church building to accommodate the rapidly growing communities that surround the parish. When will those plans become a reality?...only

God knows. However, our parishioners know, that through our parish's

more than 16-year experiences, the answer to the question will be found when God is ready to reveal it.

Until then, the new church building celebrates all those parishioners, visitors, family, and friends, who have been on the journey, and those who will join it, as St. Faustina Catholic Parish continues to build its legacy as a parish that serves God through service to His people.

Where did the time go?



Saints Francisco Marto and Jacinta Marto

Francisco de Jesus Marto was born on June 11, 1908 and his sister Jacinta de Jesus Marto was born on March 11, 1910 in Aljustrel, a small town near Fátima, Portugal, one hundred ten miles north of Lisbon.

They were the youngest children of Manuel and Olimpia Marto. Their cousin was Lúcia dos Santos. Together these three children witnessed three visions of the Angel of Peace in 1916 and several apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary at Cova da Iria in 1917. Their families were poor shepherds, with the children also tending the sheep. Both Francisco and Marta were illiterate. Francisco had a placid disposition, loved music and liked to be by himself to think. He preferred to pray alone, saying that this would "console Jesus for the sins of the world." Jacinta was an affectionate girl who loved to dance and sing.


When Francisco was eight years old and Jacinta was seven, they were in the fields with their cousin Lúcia when they saw the first apparition of Mary on May 13, 1917. They said that the "Lady more brilliant than the sun." At that time, Europe was involved in a war and Portugal was in a political turmoil because the monarchy was overthrown in 1910. Then the government dissolved religious organizations soon after.


When Mary appeared the first time on May 13, she asked the children to come back each thirteenth day of the month, where she appeared every month on that date until October. She also asked them to learn to read and write and to pray the Rosary "to obtain

peace for the world and the end of the war." Mary said to pray for sinners and for the conversion of Russia, which had recently overthrown Czar Nicholas II and would become an atheistic, communist country. Mary told them that "You are going to have much to suffer, but the grace of God will be your comfort."

Jacinta said she was deeply affected by a terrifying vision of hell which she saw at the third apparition and was convinced of the need to save sinners through penance and sacrifice as the Blessed Mother had told them to do. The three children, particularly Francisco and Jacinta, practiced severe self-mortifications until they died. More than ninety thousand people gathered for Mary's final apparition on October 13, 1917.

The siblings were victims of the great flu epidemic which swept through Europe in 1918. That October, Jacinta told Lúcia that Mary had appeared to her and promised to take them to heaven soon. Both Francisco and Jacinta lingered for many months, insisting on walking to church and kneeling in prayer for hours, with their heads on the





Their cousin Lúcia became a Carmelite nun. She was still alive when Jacinta and Francisco were beatified in 2000 by Pope John Paul II, dying five years later. Pope John Paul II called them the "privileged children of the Father." The Pope was shot on May 13, 1981. When Pope John Paul first went to Fátima in 1982, he said that he had come "because, on this exact date last year in St. Peter's Square, in Rome, there was an attempt on the life of your Pope, which mysteriously coincided with the anniversary of the first vision at Fátima, that of 13 May 1917. The coincidence of these dates was so great that it seemed to be a special invitation for me to come here."

Pope Francis canonized Francisco and Jacinta on his visit to Fátima to commemorate the hundredth anniversary of the first apparition at the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Fátima on May 13, 2017. Francisco and Jacinta are the youngest saints who did not die as martyrs, with Jacinta being the youngest. Their feast day is February 20 and they are the patron saints of bodily ills, Portuguese children, and sick children.

Lúcia died on February 13, 2005. She was given the title of Servant of God, as the first step toward her canonization.

The shrine of Our Lady of Fátima is visited by more than twenty million people a year.


