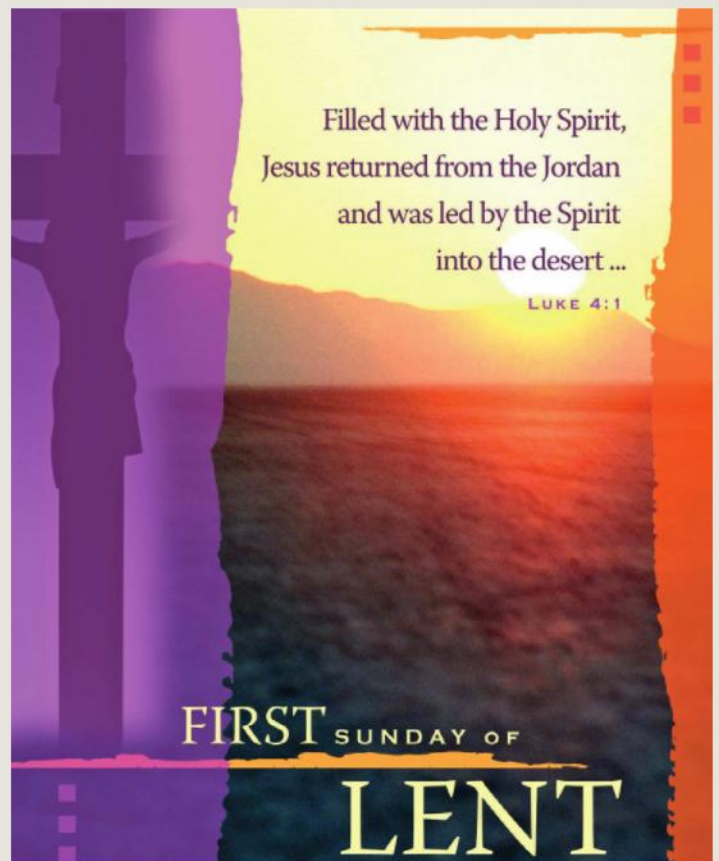

# Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

*"You have heard that it was said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you...(Matthew 5:43-44)*



Today's Scriptures contain several challenges that deserve our attention as we grow in our identity as faithful disciples. Key among them must be the call to love our neighbor and to be perfect and holy as God is perfect and holy. As Christians, we glimpse the very nature of God in Christ. He brings us the gifts of perfection, mercy, and holiness.

To share in his life is to share in those gifts and to make a public statement that God's standards are our standards; his goals are our goals. Therefore, if he comes with these divine attributes, they should be part of our lives too. If we truly believe in the kingdom of God, then all that Jesus teaches should be visible in our lives.

As we move into Lent this week, our common task is to see if we really do reflect Christ's Gospel. Remember that holiness and mercy are not simply pious words that fade like incense or that come and go like a summer breeze. True holiness and mercy are witnessed in serving those in need - those who suffer or who need that extra help through the obstacles of life, having a true heart for all who find life burdensome, and seeing the potential in others rather than their past.

*Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for the temple of God, which you are, is holy. (1 Cor. 3:16)*

Por lo tanto, si él viene con estos atributos divinos, también deberían ser parte de nuestras vidas. Si realmente creemos en el reino de Dios, entonces todo lo que Jesús enseña debe ser visible en nuestras vidas.

A medida que avanzamos hacia la Cuaresma esta semana, nuestra tarea común es ver si realmente reflejamos el Evangelio de Cristo. Recuerda que la santidad y la misericordia no son simplemente palabras piadosas que se desvanecen como incienso o que van y vienen como una brisa de verano. La verdadera santidad y misericordia se atestiguan al servir a los necesitados, aquellos que sufren o que necesitan esa ayuda adicional a través de los obstáculos de la vida, tener un corazón verdadero para todos los que encuentran la vida pesada y ver el potencial en los demás en lugar de su pasado.

bus Memorial Monument commemorating the Unborn was installed last week on the south side (parking lot side) of our new church building, as were many of the bricks that have been ordered.

To date we have received orders for 165 bricks and 27 replicas. If you do not see your brick don't worry as once an order is placed, it takes 5 to 7 weeks for production. If you ordered a replica brick, please contact Bill Mattingly to receive it. If you have not yet ordered your brick and would like to be part of this historic event, don't worry, there is still plenty of room for you to remember a loved one with your participation. The highlight of the Knights' February meeting was when Father Ramon received a **\$4,000** check from Grand Knight, Ed Rabelas, for the Joint Engraved Brick Fundraising program by the Parish and Knights of Columbus Council 14217. The funds were raised from the brick sales that will be placed along the walkway to the memorial monument. The donation, will be used for Liturgical needs such as Altar and Sanctuary dressings and requirements, and building needs around the church.

"We never can thank everyone who has supported this program enough. # St. Casimir

Casimir Jagiellon Kazimierz was born on October 3, 1458 in Kraków, Poland. He was a member of the Jagiellon dynasty, the third child and the second son of the King of Poland and Grand Duke of Lithuania Casimir IV and Queen Elisabeth Hamsburg of Austria. Elisabeth was a pious woman and the loving mother of thirteen who took an active interest in her children's upbringing, often bring them to accompany the King on his many trips to the Grand Duchy of Lithuania.

From the age of nine, Casimir and his brother Vladislaus were educated by the Polish priest Father Jan Długosz. They were taught Latin and German, law, history, rhetoric and classical literature, with an emphasis on ethics, morality, oratory skills and religious devotion. They were also subject to corporal punishment if they were out of line. Casimir became the heir apparent after his elder brother Vladislaus was elected as King of Bohemia in 1471.

When he was thirteen, Casimir participated in the failed military campaign to install him as King of Hungary. He felt that the expedition was wrong but was convinced to go out of obedience his father. Yet when soldiers started deserting, he was only too glad to listen to the advice of his officers and return home. Casimir's feelings were confirmed when he discovered that Pope Sixtus IV had also opposed the battle. However his father was furious at this situation and banished Casimir to a castle in Dobzki, hoping that the imprisonment would change his son's mind. This caused Casimir to further commit to what he believed was right, causing him to grow stronger in his exile. He refused to cooperate with his father's plans despite the pressure to give in and rejected a marriage alliance which his father tried to form. He now wholeheartedly prayed, studied and helped the poor.

Soon, Casimir became known for his piety, devotion to God and generosity towards the sick and poor, being religiously affected by Father Dlugosz. He knew that his life was not his own because as a prince of Poland he was supposed to cement his father's authority and increase Poland's power, but he also knew that his life really belonged to the Lord. Despite pressure, humiliation and rejection, he stood by his loyalty to God throughout his whole life.

The riches that surrounded him were temptations to forget his true loyalties, but he rebelled against them. He rejected ordinary comforts, wearing plain clothes, sleeping little and spending nights in prayer. When he did sleep, he slept on the floor and not on a royal bed. Many of those who were around him laughed and joked at his choices, but Casimir was always friendly and calm. He was known for his exceptional intellect, education, humility and politeness, one who strove for justice and fairness.

Casimir died on March 4, 1484 and was buried with his favorite song, a Latin hymn to the Blessed Mother called "Omni die dic Mariae" which is known as "Daily, Daily Sing to Mary." Because of his love for the song, it is known as the Hymn of St. Casimir even though he didn't write it. Soon many were in awe of Casimir. His canonization was initiated by his brother King Sigismund I the Old in 1514 and he was canonized in 1521. St. Casimir is patron saint of Lithuania and Lithuanian youth and is buried at the Chapel of St. Casimir in the Vilnius Cathedral.

The veneration of St. Casimir saw a resurgence in the seventeenth century when his feast day was confirmed by the Pope in 1602 who the dedicated the Chapel of St. Casimir. In Vilnius, his feast day is celebrated annually with Kaziuko mugė, a trade fair held on the Sunday nearest to March 4, the anniversary of his death. There are more than fifty churches named after St. Casimir in Lithuania and Poland, including the Church of St. Casimir in Vilnius and St. Kazimierz Church in Warsaw. There are also many churches in the Lithuanian and Polish communities in the US named after St. Casimir. The congregation of the Sisters of St. Casimir was established in 1908 and remains active in the United States.

This is his Prayer: *Saint Casimir, help us to remember that our true King is Jesus Christ and always serve him with joy and love. Help us to turn to our true Father for guidance and protection. Amen.*
