

Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." (Jn. 11:24-25)

Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days when Jesus arrives in Bethany. Martha and Mary take turns confronting Jesus: Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died, they cry out. Martha is not just speaking from her grief. She also makes a profession of faith: Even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you.

As upset as Martha may have been both about her brother's death and Jesus' absence, she believes there is still reason to hope. Somehow, Martha knows that Jesus can shine a light into her darkness. I see Martha's face in the parishioners we minister to who are dealing with grief and pain over the loss of a loved one. Behind the grief is the light of hope that someday we shall all be reunited with our deceased loved ones who believed in the resurrection.

Jesus wept at the death of his friend Lazarus. We see his humanity and pain over the loss of a loved one, and for any of us, members of his Body, who may undergo physical death. Jesus weeps with the grieving in our parish family. May our prayers and masses offered for our departed loved ones become an authentic sign of our being a faith family at St. Faustina's.

If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit dwelling in you. (Rom 8:11)

Marta le dijo: "Sé que resucitará en la resurrección del último día". Jesús le dijo: "Yo soy la resurrección y la vida; Quien cree en mí, incluso si muere, vivirá, y todos los que viven y creen en mí nunca morirán. ¿Crees esto?" Ella le dijo: "Sí, Señor. Lázaro había estado en la tumba durante cuatro días cuando Jesús llega a Betania. Marta y María se turnan para confrontar a Jesús: Señor, si hubieras estado aquí, mi hermano no habría muerto, claman. Marta no solo habla desde su dolor. Ella también hace una profesión de fe: Incluso ahora sé que todo lo que pidas a Dios, Dios te lo dará.

Tan molesta como Marta pudo haber estado tanto por la muerte de su hermano como por la ausencia de Jesús, ella cree que todavía hay razones para tener esperanza. De alguna manera, Marta sabe que Jesús puede hacer brillar una luz en su oscuridad. Veo la cara de Martha en los feligreses a los que ministramos y que están lidiando con la pena y el dolor por la pérdida de un ser querido. Detrás del dolor está la luz de la esperanza de que algún día todos nos reuniremos con nuestros seres queridos fallecidos que creyeron en la resurrección.

Jesús lloró por la muerte de su amigo Lázaro. Vemos su humanidad y dolor por la pérdida de un ser querido, y para cualquiera de nosotros, miembros de su Cuerpo, que pueden sufrir la muerte física. Jesús llora con el duelo en nuestra familia parroquial. Que nuestras oraciones y misas ofrecidas por nuestros seres queridos difuntos se conviertan en un signo auténtico de que somos una familia de fe en Santa Faustina.

Si el Espíritu del que resucitó a Jesús de entre los muertos mora en vosotros, el que resucitó a Cristo de entre los muertos dará vida a vuestros cuerpos mortales también, a través de su Espíritu morando en vosotros. (Romanos 8:11)

The Feast of the Annunciation

The Feast of the Annunciation, which is celebrated on March 25 every year, goes by many names. It is known as the Solemnity of the Annunciation, the Feast of the Incarnation, Conceptio Christi, or Lady Day. It is a Christian holiday commemorating the visit of the angel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary, where he announced that she would give birth to Jesus Christ.

The Feast of the Annunciation cuts across many factions of Christianity, but it is specially celebrated in Catholic, Orthodox, Anglican, and Lutheran churches. The holiday is counted as one of the eight great feasts of God in Orthodox Christianity, and it is a major Marian feast.

HISTORY OF FEAST OF THE ANNUNCIATION

The Feast of the Annunciation was celebrated as far back as the 4th or 5th century, but the first certain mention of the feast was in the "Canons of the Councils of Toledo" and Constantinople. In 656 A.C., the Feast of the Annunciation was said to have been celebrated throughout the church in Toledo.

The Feast of the Annunciation is celebrated on March 25 every year in the Roman Catholic Church, except when the day falls during the Easter Triduum – Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday – in which case the feast is transferred to the most suitable day during Easterside. However, the date never changes in Eastern Orthodoxy and Eastern Catholicism, even if it falls during Easter. When Easter and the Feast of the Annunciation fall on the same day, it is called Kyriopascha.


The Annunciation is narrated in the Bible in the Book of Luke Chapter 1, from verses 26 to 38. According to the Bible, the angel Gabriel was sent to meet Mary, a virgin in Nazareth, Galilee. Mary was betrothed at the time to a man named Joseph.

Angel Gabriel hailed Mary and told her not to fear because she had found grace with God. He told her she would give birth to the Son of God. When she replied that she was a virgin, he reassured her that the Holy Ghost would come upon her. He also informed her that her barren cousin, Elizabeth, would conceive a son as well, even in her old age. Mary responded, "be it done to me according to thy word." Joseph also received an annunciation later, as detailed in Matthew 1:18.

The Feast of the Annunciation celebrates God's entrance into the human world through Jesus and Mary's willingness to accept God's command. (article by National Today)

Blessed Jane of Toulouse

On March 31, we commemorate the feast day of Blessed Jane of Toulouse, the first lay associate and founder of the Carmelite Tertiary Order, which is also known as the Third Order.



Jane was born to a noble family in the kingdom of Navarre sometime in the thirteenth century. A Carmelite monastery had been established in Toulouse, France in 1240. Jane was extremely interested in the monastery and the Carmelite lifestyle. She was very spiritual, with a devotion to the Blessed Mother. This affected her to live her life as an anchorite near the Carmelite monastery, which is a person who withdraws from the secular world to lead a prayer focused life.

Simon Stock was an English monk, an early prior and a reformer of the Carmelites. He arrived in Toulouse in 1265. Jane met him and asked to be associated with the Carmelite order. Simon approved this and Jane became a Third Order Carmelite, receiving the habit from him and making a vow of perpetual chastity. She then applied herself completely to the Carmelite Rule.

Simon Stock became a saint, most affiliated with the brown scapular. The Blessed Mother appeared to Simon on July 16, 1251 when the Carmelite Order was being oppressed. She gave a scapular to him, saying "Receive, my beloved son, this scapular of thy Order; it is the special sign of my favor, which I have obtained for thee and for thy children of Mount Carmel. He who dies clothed with this habit shall be preserved from eternal fire. It is the badge of salvation, a shield in time of danger, and a pledge of special peace and protection." This led to the devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel and

her feast day on July 16.

Jane was a gentle woman who was very pious. She spent her days praying and caring for the sick and elderly. She attended daily mass and encouraged the young boys of the town to help assist the poor. Jane also worked with the boys to see who wanted to become a Carmelite. She carried a picture of Christ when he was crucified, studying the image as though it were a book. Each time she looked at this picture, she gained a new and wonderful insight into Christ's love.

Jane was not only the first Carmelite tertiary but also the foundress of the Carmelite Third Order, following the rule of St. Albert of Jerusalem.

The Carmelites are one of four mendicant orders, which are those who beg for alms. The beginning of this order can be traced back to Mount Carmel in Israel where pilgrims and crusaders established the community. Their rule was written sometime between 1206 and 1214 by St. Albert, the Latin patriarch of Jerusalem and was approved by Pope Honorius III in 1226.

Jane died in 1286.

Jane of Toulouse was the first female Carmelite to be called Blessed. Pope Leo XIII beatified her on February 11, 1895.

This is her prayer:

Hear us, God our Savior, that, as we rejoice in commemorating the Virgin blessed Jane, we may be instructed by her loving devotion. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

And this is the Carmelite Rule, number 20:

"Faith must be your shield on all occasions, and with it you will be able to quench all the flaming missiles of the wicked one: there can be no pleasing God without faith; and the victory lies in this – your faith."


