



Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

Jesus said to his disciples: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him. (John 14:15)

Through it all, Jesus promises that we will not be left alone. In today's Gospel, we are with Jesus and his Apostles in the Upper Room at the Last Supper. With only hours to live, Jesus speaks of the cross, the resurrection, his ascension into heaven and the descent of the Holy Spirit. Nine times in this brief passage of six verses, John the Evangelist uses the word "will" to show all the good that God has in store for us in Christ.





Jesus refers to his ascension that we will celebrate in the Church next Sunday: *In a little while the world will no longer see me*. Through it all, Jesus promises that we will not be left alone or abandoned, for the Advocate, the Holy Spirit of God, will come to us to be our consolation and our strength. This is *the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him. But you know him, because he remains with you, and will be in you...* Jesus was, is and will always be the reason for our hope.

The same Holy Spirit that inspired Philip, Peter, and John dwells in us. This is all part of God's will for us, and he asks us to use our will to choose love for him first, to love him most, and to love him forever, as he loves us.

Beloved: Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope, but do it with gentleness and reverence... (1Pet 3:15)

Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: "Si me amáis, guardaréis mis mandamientos. Y le pediré al Padre, y él os dará otro Abogado para que esté siempre con vosotros, el Espíritu de verdad, a quien el mundo no puede aceptar, porque ni lo ve ni lo conoce. (Juan 14:15)

A pesar de todo, Jesús promete que no nos dejarán solos. En el Evangelio de hoy, estamos con Jesús y sus apóstoles en el Cenáculo de la Última Cena. Con sólo unas horas de vida, Jesús habla de la cruz, la resurrección, su ascensión al cielo y el descenso del Espíritu Santo. Nueve veces en este breve pasaje de seis versículos, Juan el Evangelista usa la palabra "voluntad" para mostrar todo el bien que Dios tiene reservado para nosotros en Cristo.

Jesús hace muchas promesas que cumplirá si solo cumplimos una promesa a cambio: mostrar nuestro amor por él guardando sus mandamientos.

Jesús se refiere a su ascensión que celebraremos en la Iglesia el próximo domingo: *Dentro de poco el mundo ya no me verá*. A pesar de todo, Jesús promete que no nos dejaremos solos o abandonados, porque el Abogado, el Espíritu Santo de Dios, vendrá a nosotros para ser nuestro consuelo y nuestra fuerza. Este es el *Espíritu de verdad, a quien el mundo no puede aceptar, porque no lo ve ni lo conoce. Pero tú lo conoces, porque él permanece contigo, y estará en ti... Jesús fue, es y siempre será la razón de nuestra esperanza.*

El mismo Espíritu Santo que inspiró a Felipe, Pedro y Juan mora en nosotros. Todo esto es parte de la voluntad de Dios para nosotros, y él nos pide que usemos nuestra voluntad para elegir el amor por él primero, amarlo más y amarlo para siempre, como él nos ama.

Amados: Santifiquen a Cristo como Señor en sus corazones. Siempre esté listo para dar una explicación a cualquiera que le pida una razón para su esperanza, pero hágalo con gentileza y reverencia ... (1 Pedro 3:15)

CELEBRATE PENTECOST SUNDAY BY GIV-ING BLOOD---Wear Red, Give Red!!—Our next parish blood drive will be on Pentecost Sunday, May 28, between the hours of 7:30 am and 1:00 pm. For your convenience, the Big Red Bus will be parked right outside the entrance of the church.

Our parish began this bi-monthly blood drive on June 19, 2019. During that time, parishioners and visitors have contributed 396 pints of blood



while saving over 1,188 lives as each donation has the ability to help up to three patients in need. Our drive has met its OneBlood-assigned goal in all but one drive and has surpassed 25 donors three times with our record being 33 pints contributed.

Besides your ability to help those with medical needs, you will receive a wellness check-up, which includes: a COVID-19 antibody test, blood pressure, temperature, an iron count, pulse, and cholesterol screening. OneBlood is also giving away a \$20 e-gift card, a Bonefish Grill coupon, and a water bottle in "thanks" for your donation.



Weekly Reflection

Background Music: Life, Love and Prayer

"I live and you will live," Jesus tells his disciples. You and I are both alive right now, so this seems easy to wrap our heads around. This is life, right? I'm living it right now. Is there more to life?

The fullest life that Jesus reveals is so much more profound than we could have known without His revelation to us: "I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you." Jesus is in the Father, and we are IN Jesus, and Jesus is IN us! The One

Who is the Way, the Truth, and Life itself dwells in us, and we dwell in Him, in the Father. This "mutual indwelling" that is true life is harder to wrap our heads around. But Jesus was very clear that this is the whole point of the Kingdom, and that God's joy is to dwell with us, because He loves us and created us precisely for this.

What is love? How do we love the Lord we cannot see? Jesus tells us that the one who keeps His commandment loves Him. What is Jesus' commandment? To love one another as He loved us. And if we love Jesus and love one another for love of Him, we will be loved by the Father and we will truly know Jesus. Loving one another as Jesus loved us is a tall order – He loved us infinitely, loved us all the way to the Cross and beyond, pouring Himself out

Tomorrow may never come

As that is for God to say

But a mighty gift I have been given

In the form of this very day

I will make the most of it with those that I love
as another may never again come my way
so to honor that which I have been given

I will

love, live, and pray

utterly for us. He "loved me and gave himself for me," as St. Paul says (Gal. 2:20), and continues to take care of me in every single moment.

The world in which we live and the busywork of much of our lives does not easily resonate with the vibration of divine life and love. Sin has obscured this and made it hard to keep in mind. But praying and loving (true, self-sacrificing love) re-tune our hearts and minds so that they again vibrate with the eternal rhythm of the divine, so that it can become the "background music" of all we think and say and do! The Advocate, the Spirit of truth, poured into our hearts remains with us always, and keeps us open to the will of the Father in every circumstance and situation.

How do we attune ourselves to this Holy Spirit? Prayer. In prayer, we are still enough to listen for love and conform our heart to its demands. In prayer, we give the Spirit opportunity and permission to continue and complete His work in us, so that we walk generously in His ways of love. As we advance in loving obedience and true, self-sacrificing love of others, all our thoughts and words and actions will become attuned to the will of the Father, and our lives will at last resonate with the beat of the very Heart of God.

Do you have about five minutes a day to pray a "DECADE A DAY"? This is a program in which 20 people each say one decade of the Rosary every day of the year, for one year. Each member signs up for one decade, and



prays that decade every day. For example, if my decade/mystery was the Visitation, then that is the Decade I would say each day.

The ministry seeks to gather parishioners who would like to commit to praying one decade of the Rosary every day, anywhere you are, whether at home, at work, at recess, in a car, on a trip, walking your dog...anywhere. It only takes three to five minutes of your time.



St. Dymphna

Dymphna was the beautiful child of King Oriel, a pagan Irish chieftain and a Christian noblewoman born in the seventh century. As a child, Dymphna was raised as a Christian and wanted to be consecrated to Christ.

When her mother died, her father was inconsolable to the point of being mentally unstable. He was



counseled to find a new wife and visited many countries for this special woman, but none met his standards. Then he realized that Dymphna resembled her mother, both in beauty and charm and decided to marry her.

Dymphna was devastated at this thought and went to Belgium with her priest, Father Gerebran, who was her tutor and confessor. Also attending with them was the court jester and his wife. They settled in the village of Gheel, where they were welcomed and began to make plans for establishing their home there. Dymphna built a hospital for the poor and sick, using her wealth.

Her father followed them and eventually discovered their location by tracing the foreign money that they used to go to Belgium. He killed Father Gerebran for telling him that mar-

riage with his daughter was wrong and then begged Dymphna to return with him to Ireland to be his wife. She refused so he cut off her head in a psychotic rage. At first their remains were put in a cave, but years later, the villagers went to the cave and found two beautiful tombs carved from stone. The coffin of St. Dymphna was opened and there was a red tile with an inscription stating: "Here lies the holy virgin and martyr, Dymphna."

Her remains were then placed in a small church. People came to pray there and miracles and cures began to occur. She was canonized in 620. Gradually St. Dymphna's fame as the patron saint of victims of nervous diseases and mental disorders was spread from person to person. Many mentally afflicted people were brought to the shrine by relatives and friends from distant countries.

St. Dymphna's relic was applied to the patients and novenas were made, creating remarkable cures. In 1532, the larger and grander Church of St. Dymphna was built on the site where the bodies were first buried. St. Dymphna's relics repose there in a beautiful golden reliquary. Some of her remains are also at the Shrine to Saint Dymphna at St. Mary's Catholic Church in Massillon, Ohio. Father Gerebran was canonized a saint and his remains are buried in Xanten, Germany. He is the patron saint of the Rhineland area.

At the beginning, patients stayed in a small annex built onto the church. Then the patients were placed in the homes of families living in Gheel. From this, Gheel developed into a town who cared for the insane and mentally afflicted. The Sisters of St. Augustine created the Infirmary of St. Elizabeth for the care of patients, ultimately sending them to live with families in Gheel, where they then began to lead a normal life. Generations of experience have given the people of Gheel intimate and tender skills for their charges. They have a great spirit of charity and love for the afflicted, helping to give a regular outlook on life. Many psychiatrists agree with this and say that more patients could leave mental institutions if they could be assured of a sympathetic reception in the world, such as the people of Gheel take pride in showing.

- St. Dymphna is the patron saint of those with neurological disorders, mental illnesses, victims of incest and mental health professionals. Her feast day is May 15 and she is known as the "Lily of Fire,"
 - St. Dymphna is often portrayed wearing green, holding a book and white lilies.


