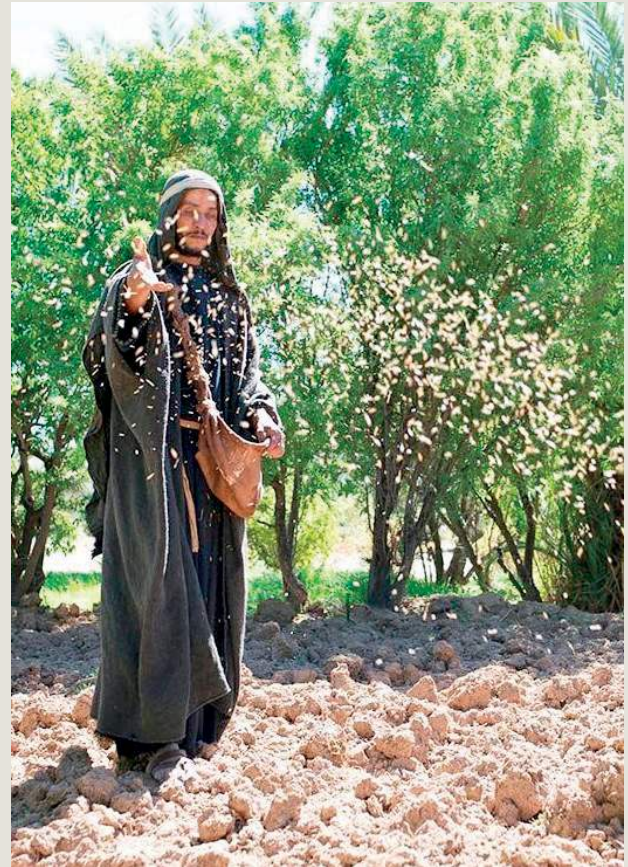

Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

"...But the seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold." (Mt. 13:23)

Have you ever watched a seed grow? Remember that childhood educational activity, where a seed is placed in a clear bag and taped to a window so everyone can marvel at the breaking open and bursting forth of new life? This powerful image runs through our readings today: God's creative power, poured out to bring forth fruit, nourishment, life.

God is both sower and seed, the one who gives water and light, the one who calls forth growth, and the one who yields great fruit. Can we see this work God wants to carry out in our lives? Can we hear his fruitful word? Can we see the Spirit moving like the wind over the water? Can we hear the Spirit's voice calling us to growth?

May we be nourished for the profound work of seeing and hearing God's word. May the Eucharist we celebrate draw us to wonder and attentiveness, to enter into the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven and send us forth to bear great fruit for his kingdom.

We know that all creation is groaning in labor pains even until now; and not only that, but we ourselves, who have the first-fruits of the Spirit, we also groan within ourselves as we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. (Rom. 8:23)

Sabemos que toda la creación está gimiendo en dolores de parto incluso hasta ahora; y no solo eso, sino que nosotros mismos, que tenemos las primicias del Espíritu, también gemimos dentro de nosotros mismos mientras esperamos la adopción, la redención de nuestros cuerpos. (Romanos 8:23)

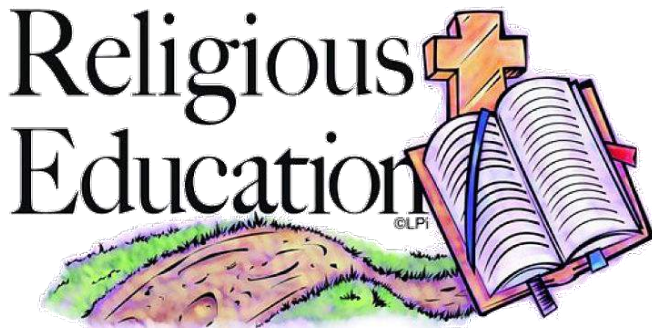

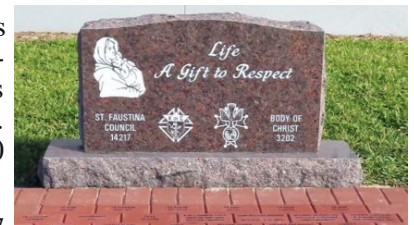

Saint Lawrence of Brindisi

Giulio Cesare de Rossi was born to a family of Venetian merchants in Brindisi on July 22, 1559 in the kingdom of Naples. He was twelve years old when his father died and was educated by the Franciscans and later by his uncle at St. Mark's College in Venice. Cesare was known for his speaking talents and was always chosen to say a short sermon about Christ at the Christmas gatherings. He was six years old when he started doing this.

When he was sixteen, Cesare joined the Capuchins at Verona, taking the name Lawrence. He studied theology,



philosophy, the Bible, Greek, Hebrew and several other languages at the University of Padua. He was an accomplished linguist who could read and speak fluent Latin, Hebrew, Greek, German, Czech, Spanish and French. While he was a deacon, Lawrence preached the Lenten sermons in Venice. Then he was ordained a priest the age of twenty three and began to preach in Northern Italy. At the age of thirty one, he was elected the Superior of the Capuchin Franciscan province of Tuscany.

In 1596, Lawrence became the Definitor General of his order in Rome, a position he was to hold five times. Pope Clement VIII assigned Lawrence to preach to the Jewish people, using his knowledge of Hebrew and then he was sent to Germany to combat Lutheranism. He was accompanied by Benedict of Urbino, who later would be beatified. Together, they founded friaries at Prague, Vienna, Graz and Gorizia. These would later develop into the provinces of Bohemia, Austria and Styria.

Emperor Rudolf II requested an army of German rulers to fight against the Turks, who were threatening to conquer all of Hungary. Lawrence assisted with this effort, became the chaplain and was among the leaders in the Battle of Szekesfehevar in 1601. The victory attained was attributed to Lawrence, even though he only carried a Crucifix into battle.

In 1602, Lawrence was elected Vicar General of the Capuchins but declined his re-election in 1605. Then the emperor sent him to Spain to persuade Philip III to join the Catholic League. While he was there, Lawrence founded a Capuchin house in Madrid. After this, he was sent as a Papal Nuncio to the court of Maximillian of Bavaria to serve as peacemaker in several royal disputes. In 1618, Lawrence retired from worldly affairs to leave for the friary at Caserta, but was recalled at the request of the rulers of Naples to go to Spain to ask King Philip for help to defeat the Duke of Osuna, the Spanish envoy to Naples.

Lawrence convinced the King to recall the Duke to avert an uprising, but was feeling exhausted from the traveling and the heat. He died a few days after his meeting with the King at Lisbon on July 22, 1619, his sixtieth birthday.

He wrote several treatises against Luther and a commentary on Genesis but his main writings are his sermons, placed in nine volumes.

Lawrence was beatified by Pope Pius VI in 1793 and was canonized by Pope Leo XIII on December 8, 1881. He was made a Doctor of the Church by Pope John XXIII in 1959.

St. Lawrence of Brindisi is the patron saint of the city of Brindisi and his feast day is July 21. He is buried at the Poor Clares' Convento de la Anunciada (Convent of the Annunciation) in Villafranca del Bierzo, Spain.
