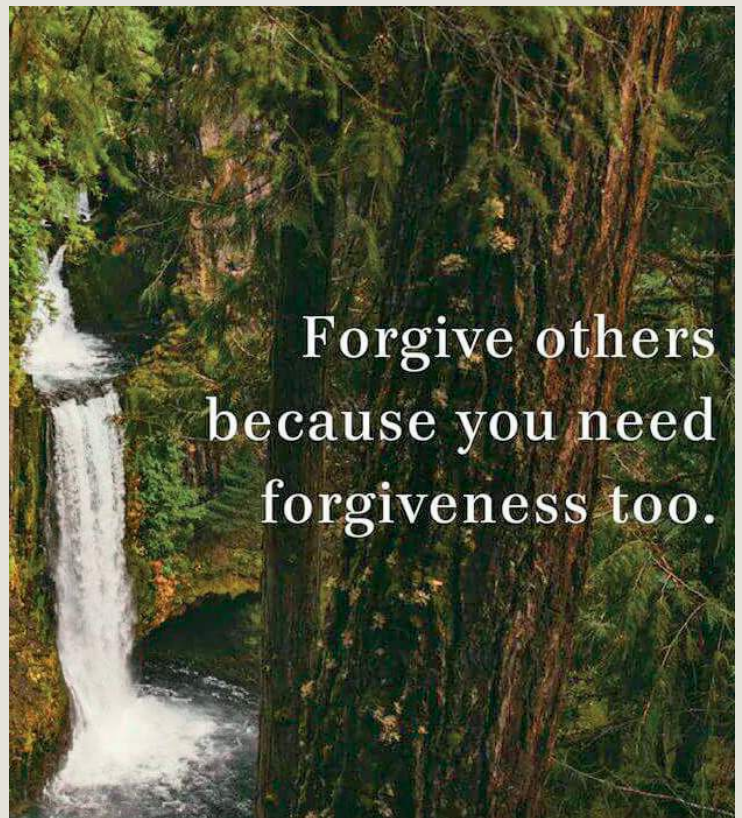

# Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

*His master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?' (Matthew 18:32-33)*

In the community of God's covenant, mercy is shared. Stopping up a chain reaction of mercy is what the debtor does in today's Gospel parable. The debtor owes his master a huge amount, so much so that the master orders the debtor, his family, and all his property to be sold off in payment of the debt. The debtor begs his master for patience. The master is moved to compassion and forgives him the entirety of his huge debt.



Had the debtor shared the same mercy he received from the master with his fellow debtors, how different a story this could have been! Such a great show of mercy could have affected one debtor after another, allowing a wave of forgiveness to fall across the entire community. There could have been forgiveness not seven times but seventy-seven times, as Jesus calls for.

In the community of God's covenant, mercy is shared. Like the intricate configuration of the domino game, God's mercy touches and connects us all. No one lives or dies for oneself; we are the Lord's, redeemed together in his mercy and love. We celebrate this in the Eucharist, the memorial of his great love and mercy.

*The vengeful will suffer the LORD's vengeance, for he remembers their sins in detail. Forgive your neighbor's injustice; then when you pray, your own sins will be forgiven. (Sirach 28:2)*

*Su amo lo llamó y le dijo: "¡Siervo malvado! Te perdoné toda tu deuda porque me lo suplicaste. ¿No deberías haber tenido piedad de tu compañero de servicio, como yo tuve piedad de ti?" (Mateo 18:32-33)*

En la comunidad del pacto de Dios, la misericordia es compartida. Detener una reacción en cadena de misericordia es lo que hace el deudor en la parábola del Evangelio de hoy. El deudor le debe a su amo una cantidad enorme, tanto que el maestro ordena que el deudor, su familia y todos sus bienes sean vendidos en pago de la deuda. El deudor ruega paciencia a su amo. El maestro se conmueve a la compasión y le perdona la totalidad de su enorme deuda.

Si el deudor hubiera compartido la misma misericordia que recibió del maestro con sus compañeros deudores, ¡qué historia tan diferente podría haber sido esta! Una muestra tan grande de misericordia podría haber afectado a un deudor tras otro, permitiendo que una ola de perdón cayera en toda la comunidad. Podría haber habido perdón no siete veces, sino setenta y siete veces, como Jesús pide.

En la comunidad del pacto de Dios, la misericordia es compartida. Al igual que la intrincada configuración del juego de dominó, la misericordia de Dios nos toca y nos conecta a todos. Nadie vive o muere por sí mismo; somos del Señor, redimidos juntos en su misericordia y amor. Lo celebramos en la Eucaristía, memorial de su gran amor y misericordia.

*El vengativo sufrirá la venganza del Señor, porque él recuerda sus pecados en detalle. Perdona la injusticia de tu prójimo; Entonces, cuando oras, tus propios pecados serán perdonados. (Eclesiástico 28:2)*

**Blood Drive Next Sunday** – Our parish’s bi-monthly blood drive will be held next **Sunday, September 24, from 7:30 am until 1:30 pm.** The Big Red Bus will be parked right outside our front door. While walk-ups account for 90% of our donations, you can secure your spot on the bus by making an appointment at [OneBlood](https://www.oneblood.org).



Yes, all of our drives are important, but this one leads us into October, which the Catholic Church has designated as **BOTH** *Respect Life Month* and also *honors our Blessed Mother* throughout the month. This drive also leads up to the Feast Day of St. Faustina (October 5) as well as our first Ministry Fair at our new home (October 7 & 8).

All that is exciting, but the **BIG REASON** to donate a half-an-hour of your time and a pint of your blood is because, **Giving Blood Saves Lives!!** Since this ministry began on June 19, 2019, our parishioners and visitors have contributed 446 pints of blood while saving 1,338 lives, as each donation has the ability to help up to three patients. We had 26 donations in each of our last two drives (May and July) and are hoping to top that this month (our parish single-drive record is 33 pints donated).

A Spanish-speaking member of the BloodOne team will be present at the drive.

On September, 11, Father Ramon, David and Gloria Russell, Carmelita Flores, and Yolanda Inumerable, departed Miami airport for a direct flight to Barcelona. Arriving the next day, they visited Sagrada Familia, the largest unfinished Roman Catholic church in the world. It has been under construction for 140 years (and we all thought St. Faustina's took a long time!)

Their next stop was to Zaragoza, Spain where they visited our Lady of the Pillar, the very first church in the world dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Legend has it that while she was still alive, and on the wings of angels, Mary was flown to Zaragoza to encourage St. James's mission to spread the Gospel. The Virgin Mary, with the Child Jesus in her arms and standing on a pillar, asked Saint James and his eight disciples to build a church on the site, promising that "it will stand from that moment until the end of time in order that God may work miracles and wonders through my intercession for all those who place themselves under my patronage." We hope to bring some miracles home to you!

The third stop is San Sebastian de Garabandal the site of an alleged Marian apparition to four young girls beginning in 1961. Following a two-night stay, they will pilgrim to Santiago de Compostela in northern Spain. The destination of millions of pilgrims who have traveled the way of St. James across northern Europe to thank God and venerate the relics at the tomb of St. James.

The last stop for this part of the journey is Fatima Portugal to meet with Fr. Jude and purchase the Pilgrim Virgin of Fatima statue for her work of ministry here at St. Faustina. Father Ramon, Carmelita and Yoly leave September 19 while Gloria and David continue to seven more destinations of great Catholic and Marian significance. They will be accompanied by the Pilgrim Statue! Please pray for them!

# Saint Padre Pio of Pietrelcina

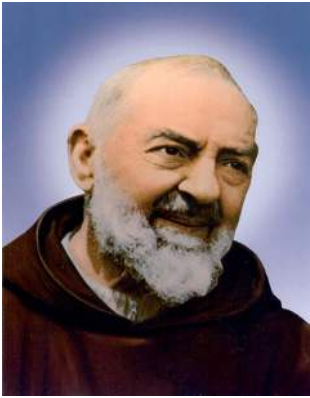

Padre Pio was a Franciscan Capuchin Friar and a mystic.

Francesco Forgione was born to Grazio Mario Forgione and Maria Giuseppa Di Nunzio on May 25, 1887 in Pietrelcina, which was a town in the province of Benevento in the Southern Italian region of Campania. His parents were peasant farmers.

Francesco was baptized at the Santa Anna Chapel and later served as an altar boy in the same chapel. He had an older brother Michele and three younger sisters, Felicita, Pellegrina, and Grazia (who later became a Bridgettine nun). Two other siblings died at infancy. Padre Pio said that when he was five years old, he had already made the decision to dedicate his life to God and that he had experienced heavenly visions and ecstasies.

Francesco worked on the land up to the age of ten, looking after the small flock of sheep which the family owned. When he had completed three years at the public school, he wanted to become a friar after listening to a young Capuchin who was in the countryside seeking donations. He told this to his parents who inquired what was needed for the priesthood and the reply was that Francesco needed a better education, so his father went to the US to work to pay for private tutoring for his son to enter the Capuchin Order.



After his Confirmation and tutoring, Francesco joined the Capuchin friars at Morcone on January 6, 1903, at the age of 15. On January 22, he took the Franciscan habit and the name of Fra Pio in honor of Pope Pius I, taking the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience. Pio spent most of his religious life in the convent of San Giovanni Rotondo, beginning a seven year course to study for the priesthood, while enduring many health issues. During this time, he was seen levitating and in ecstasy. Even with his health declining, Pio was able to make his profession on January 27, 1907 and was ordained a priest in August of 1910. He was permitted to stay with his family in Pietrelcina while still retaining the Capuchin habit until 1916. On September 4 he was ordered to return to his community life at San Giovanni Rotondo, remaining there until his death in 1968, except for a period of military service. At the start of

World War I, four friars from his community were selected for military service in the Italian army. Then on November 15, 1915 Padre Pio was drafted. On December 6, he was assigned to the Tenth Medical Corps in Naples, but was discharged due to poor health.

After the war ended, people started rebuilding their lives and saw Padre Pio as a symbol of hope.

They began to see that he had many spiritual talents, including the gifts of healing, bilocation, levitation, prophecy, miracles, extraordinary abstinence from both sleep and nourishment, the capability to read hearts, the gift of tongues and conversions and had pleasant-smelling wounds.

Padre Pio converted many to Catholicism, was devoted to rosary meditations and recommended meditation and self-examination twice daily. He was marked by the stigmata in 1918, leading to several investigations by the Vatican, who applied temporary restrictions against him, but his reputation kept increasing, attracting many followers to San Giovanni Rotondo. The Vatican imposed severe sanctions on Padre Pio in the 1920s to reduce publicity about him. He was forbidden to say Mass in public, could not bless people, answer letters, show his stigmata publicly and was prohibited from communication with Padre Benedetto, his spiritual director.

In 1933, Pope Pius XI ordered a reversal of the ban on Pio's public celebration of Mass, saying that "I have not been badly disposed toward Padre Pio, but I have been badly informed." In 1934 Padre Pio was again allowed to hear confessions and was also given honorary permission to preach despite never having taken the exam for the preaching license. Pope Pius XII encouraged devotees to visit Padre Pio and in the mid-1960s Pope Paul VI dismissed all accusations against him.

In 1947, twenty seven year old Father Karol Józef Wojtyła visited Padre Pio, who heard his confession. Padre told Father Karol that one day he would ascend to "the highest post in the church, though further confirmation is needed." Father Karol believed that the prophecy was fulfilled when he became a Cardinal, but years later he became Pope John Paul II.

After Padre Pio died on September 23, 1968, devotion to him continued to spread among believers all over the world. At his death, the stigmata wounds were healed, without any scarring. Over 100,000 people attended his funeral. He is buried in the Church of Our Lady of Grace.

Padre Pio was declared venerable in 1997, was beatified on May 2, 1999 and canonized on June 16, 2002, all by Pope John Paul II. His relics are exposed in the sanctuary of Saint Pio of Pietrelcina, next to the convent of San Giovanni Rotondo, now a major pilgrimage site. His feast day is September 23.

He is known as Padre Pio, but his proper saint's name is St. Padre Pio of Pietrelcina.

His most famous quote is: "Pray, hope and don't worry. Anxiety doesn't help at all. Our Merciful Lord will listen to your prayer."
