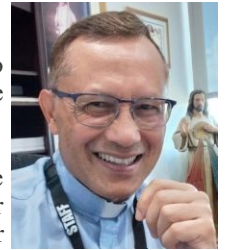

Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last." (Matthew 20:12-16)

We are recipients of the Lord's abundant mercy and generosity. The moral of today's Gospel parable seems so blatantly unfair. The workers who put in a whole day's work and sweat receive the same wage as those who were there for only one hour? It makes us want to ask, "Jesus, what's going on here?"

The point then, it seems, is not about our sense of fairness or justice, but about the behavior of the landowner. He does not act like most owners; his generosity is...well, scandalous. He offers a living wage to all who work for him, even the one-hour laborers. He understands what it takes for these workers to be able to subsist: to care for their families, eat, pay taxes, and have the self-respect and dignity of work.



The landowner is representative of the kingdom of heaven. We get a glimpse of the good Lord who offers salvation. It is salvation available to anyone who enters the vineyard, at any time, and is not diminished for one by its distribution to another. The Lord does not offer "partial" salvation, and it is certainly not salvation that we "deserve." We have no cause to be envious of the good fortune of another, for ours is equal in measure and justice. Rather, we can praise God for his continuous mercy to us. After all, serving in his kingdom is not drudgery; it is love and grace - all that we could ever hope for - all the days of our life.

For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts. (Is. 55:8-9)

Le dijo a uno de ellos en respuesta: "Amigo mío, no te estoy engañando. ¿No estuvo de acuerdo conmigo con el salario diario habitual? Toma lo que es tuyo y vete. ¿Qué pasa si deseo darle a este último lo mismo que a ti? ¿O no soy libre de hacer lo que quiera con mi propio dinero? ¿Tienes envidia porque soy generoso?" Por lo tanto, el último será el primero, y el primero será el último". (Mateo 20:12-16)

Somos receptores de la abundante misericordia y generosidad del Señor. La moraleja de la parábola evangélica de hoy parece tan descaradamente injusta. ¿Los trabajadores que trabajan todo un día y sudan reciben el mismo salario que los que estuvieron allí solo una hora? Nos hace querer preguntar: "Jesús, ¿qué está pasando aquí?"

El punto entonces, al parecer, no es sobre nuestro sentido de equidad o justicia, sino sobre el comportamiento del terrateniente. Él no actúa como la mayoría de los propietarios; Su generosidad es... bueno, escandaloso. Ofrece un salario digno a todos los que trabajan para él, incluso a los trabajadores de una hora. Él entiende lo que se necesita para que estos trabajadores puedan subsistir: cuidar de sus familias, comer, pagar impuestos y tener el respeto propio y la dignidad del trabajo.

El terrateniente es representativo del reino de los cielos. Tenemos una visión del buen Dios que ofrece la salvación. Es la salvación disponible para cualquiera que entre en la viña, en cualquier momento, y no se ve disminuida para uno por su distribución a otro. El Señor no ofrece salvación "parcial", y ciertamente no es la salvación lo que "merecemos". No tenemos motivos para sentir envidia de la buena fortuna de otro, porque la nuestra es igual en medida y justicia. Más bien, podemos alabar a Dios por su continua misericordia hacia nosotros. Después de todo, servir en su reino no es una tontería; Es amor y gracia, todo lo que podríamos esperar, todos los días de nuestra vida.

Porque mis pensamientos no son vuestros pensamientos, ni vuestros caminos mis caminos, dice el Señor. Tan alto como los cielos están sobre la tierra, tan altos son mis caminos por encima de tus caminos y mis pensamientos por encima de tus pensamientos. (Is. 55:8-9)

Our Lady of Sorrows

The Catholic Church designates each month for a special person or event. For January, it is the Month of the Holy Name, February is the Passion of Our Lord, March is for St. Joseph, April is the Month of the Holy Eucharist, May is the Month of Our Lady, June is for the Sacred Heart, July is for the Most Precious Blood, August is the Month of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, September is the Month of Our Lady of Sorrows, October is for the Most Holy Rosary, November is for the Souls and December is the Month of the Immaculate Conception.

As September is coming to a close, let us look at Our Lady of Sorrows. Mary had seven sorrows. This feast day is commemorated on September 15.

The Prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2:35)

After the birth of Jesus, Mary was obligated to purify for forty days, as was the Jewish custom. Then she and Joseph went to the temple to offer their son to God, as the first born child. There she met Simeon, who held the baby and proclaimed him as the Messiah. He blessed Jesus and told Mary “And you yourself a sword will pierce” Mary was shocked, holding her son close as she walked out of the temple. Joseph was shaken too, but he was thinking of his wife and son. They returned to Nazareth, still pondering Simeon’s words.



The Flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13)

Joseph had a dream. “*The angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, ‘Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt, and stay there until I tell you. Herod is going to search for the child to destroy him’*”

He woke up Mary and told her of his dream. Now she felt the sharp words of Simeon’s prophecy. There was no time to reflect. They had to pack what they could carry and flee to Egypt in the night. Imagine if we had to do the same, leaving our possessions and running away to save our child. The long trip across the desert scared Mary, but she never complained. Was she wondering about enough food and water, the weather, the health of their donkey to get them there or living in a foreign country? Worrying can overshadow everything, but Mary had faith that God would take care of her family.

Loss of the Child Jesus for three days (Luke 2:46, 48).

Mary, Joseph and Jesus took their annual trip to Jerusalem with other relatives. On the way home, Mary thought that Jesus was with the other family members, but soon they realized that Jesus was missing, a parent’s worst nightmare.

Mary and Joseph returned to Jerusalem to find him. After three days, while walking by the temple, Mary heard her son’s voice. They ran inside and found Jesus talking to the elders. These learned men were astounded at the knowledge of a young boy. Mary and Joseph questioned Jesus why he remained in Jerusalem and he told them that he is doing “his Father’s work.”

Mary meets Jesus on his way to Calvary (Luke 23:27-31; John 19:17)

Mary’s life was hidden now. She was a widow living a quiet life. When news of Jesus’ miracles reached her at Nazareth, she was happy but the disturbing information of the tensions mounting about her son made her apprehensive. She went to Jerusalem for the Passover feast, hoping Jesus would be there. Mary was helping with the meal preparation when she was told that Jesus was arrested. She pushed her way through the crowds and saw her son carrying his cross. Her heart was broken and she was powerless to help him. Their eyes met and she knew that she needed to trust, so she walked the Way of the Cross.

Standing at the Foot of the Cross (John 19:25)

Mary saw the cruelty of the soldiers and what they did to her son, but this was all part of God’s plan. Jesus had to suffer and die. John, the beloved disciple, put his arm around Mary, helping her. “My precious child,” she weeps, “heralded at Bethlehem, now suffering an ignominious and painful death!” Jesus looked at Mary and said “He is your son.” Then he looked at John and said “She is your mother.”

The Crucifixion and Descent from the Cross (John 19:38)

Jesus died on the cross and Mary’s spirit died with him. His body was placed in her arms. Even though she was distraught, Mary said “Let it be done according to thy will, Lord

Assisting at the Burial (Luke 23:55)

According to Jewish custom, the women prepared the spices and ointments and gathered the winding sheet and the grave cloth. Mary wanted to help them. They washed the body and wrapped it in long strips of linen, taking care to place the fragrant spices, including the myrrh and aloes which Nicodemus had brought. Mary kissed Jesus one last time and watched as the stone was rolled over the opening. Then John took her home.

Mary always kept her faith, despite her grief, which is a great learning lesson for everyone. There is a daily prayer where a Hail Mary is said before naming each sorrow. Try to say this prayer every day.
