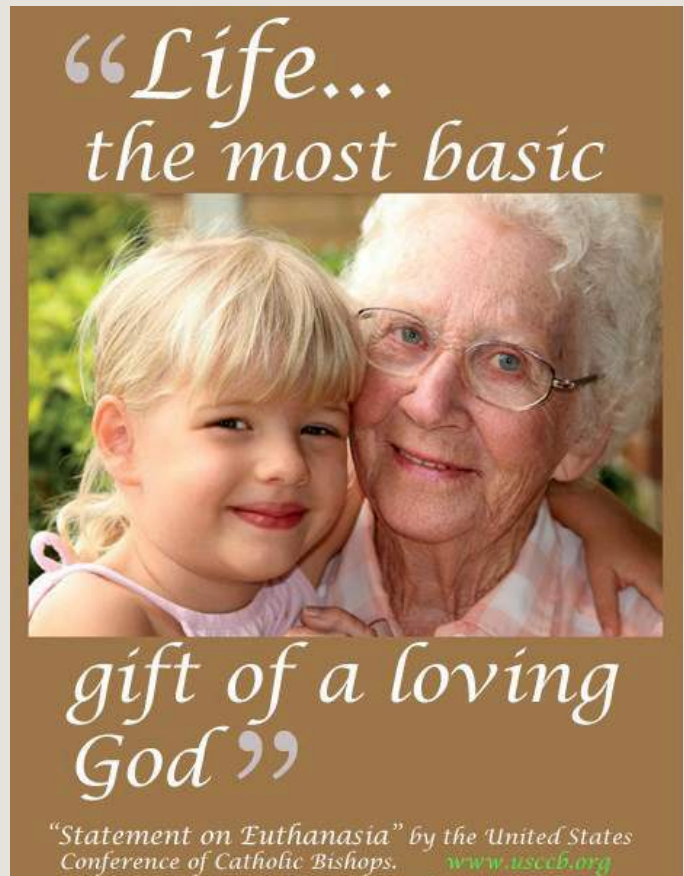

Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

At that he said to them, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

(Matt 22:21)

Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar. These words from Jesus often leave people scratching their heads. What does this even mean? We are told in Genesis that it is *not good for the man to be alone* (2:18). God gives Adam the gift of community in the person of Eve. The family, then, is the first political community. It is where we learn how to live together, care for others, and make a gift of ourselves. But in the story of the Fall, we hear how brokenness enters into even this most fundamental community.



Throughout salvation history, people fail not only to know they belong to God but fail to build good and healthy political structures. As Christians, we are asked to be faithful to our creator and also to care for all of creation which he loves. We are called to make our families and societies the best they can be. We have a right and responsibility to be engaged in our society. This is what is meant when Jesus says *repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar*.

We must strive, with God's help and grace, to build communities of peace, of justice. Beginning with the right order of our own households and moving out to the various local and national communities we live in, Christians have political responsibilities. May God give us the courage, prudence, and grace we need for this labor.

It is I who arm you, though you know me not, so that toward the rising and the setting of the sun people may know that there is none besides me. I am the LORD, there is no other. (Is. 45:6)

Entonces les dijo: "Dad al César lo que es del César, y a Dios lo que es de Dios". (Mateo 22:21.)

Paga al César lo que es del César. Estas palabras de Jesús a menudo dejan a la gente rascándose la cabeza. ¿Qué significa esto? En el Génesis se nos dice que *no es bueno que el hombre esté solo* (2:18). Dios le da a Adán el don de la comunidad en la persona de Eva. La familia, entonces, es la primera comunidad política. Es donde aprendemos a vivir juntos, a cuidar de los demás y a hacer un regalo de nosotros mismos. Pero en la historia de la Caída, escuchamos cómo el quebrantamiento entra incluso en esta comunidad más fundamental.

A lo largo de la historia de la salvación, las personas no solo no saben que pertenecen a Dios, sino que no construyen estructuras políticas buenas y saludables. Como cristianos, se nos pide que seamos fieles a nuestro creador y también que cuidemos de toda la creación que él ama. Estamos llamados a hacer que nuestras familias y sociedades sean lo mejor que puedan ser. Tenemos el derecho y la responsabilidad de participar en nuestra sociedad. Esto es lo que se quiere decir cuando Jesús dice *que devolváis al César lo que es del César*.

Debemos esforzarnos, con la ayuda y la gracia de Dios, por construir comunidades de paz, de justicia. Comenzando con el orden correcto de nuestros propios hogares y extendiéndonos a las diversas comunidades locales y nacionales en las que vivimos, los cristianos tenemos responsabilidades políticas. Que Dios nos dé el valor, la prudencia y la gracia que necesitamos para esta labor.

Yo soy el que os arma, aunque no me conozcáis, para que hacia la salida y la puesta del sol sepan que no hay nadie fuera de mí. Yo soy el Señor, no hay otro. (Isaías 45:6.)

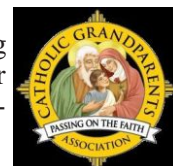

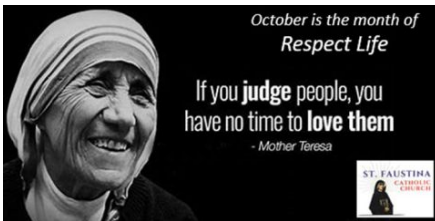
Parish Ministries & Upcoming Events

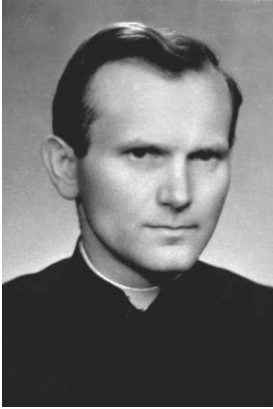

St. Pope John Paul II

Karol Józef Wojtyła was born on May 18, 1920 in Wadowice, Poland to Karol Wojtyła, a lieutenant in the Polish army and Emilia Kaczorowska, a teacher. He was baptized at one month old and made his First Communion at the age of eight. His mother died when he was eight years old and his older brother Edmund, who was a doctor, died of scarlet fever when Karol was twelve. He was an outgoing child, but had a serious side. Karol was an excellent student who loved dramatics, played soccer and lived a disciplined life of religious observance. The family's apartment was located next door to the Catholic church where he regularly assisted Father Kazimierz Figlewicz, his first teacher and confessor. Growing up Karol was athletic, enjoying skiing and swimming. He often played soccer games with teams of Jews and Catholics, many times playing on the Jewish side. In 2005, he recalled "I remember that at least a third of my classmates at elementary school in Wadowice were Jews. At secondary school there were fewer. With some I was on very friendly terms. And what struck me about some of them was their Polish patriotism." This was the time when he had his first serious relationship with a girl, Ginka Beer, described as "a Jewish beauty, with stupendous eyes and jet black hair, slender, a superb actress."



Karol graduated with excellent grades from an all-boys high school in Wadowice shortly before the start of the war in 1938. Then he went to Krakow's Jagiellonian University where he showed an interest in theater and poetry, but the next year the school was closed by Nazi troops during the German occupation of Poland on September 1, 1939. Soon Jews as well as non-Jewish cultural and political leaders, including professors and priests, were killed or deported to concentration camps by the Nazis, who considered the Slavs inferior. All able-bodied males were required to work, so from 1940 to 1944 Karol worked as a messenger for a restaurant, a manual laborer in a limestone quarry and for the Solvay chemical factory in order to avoid deportation to Germany. He was struck by a German army truck and also by a tram, barely surviving both events. He started acting at a local theater, but then decided to study theology and become a priest. As a young man, he helped protect many Jewish people from the Nazis. Also, his father died at this time, leaving Karol with no family.

Karol started classes at a secret seminary run by the Archbishop of Krakow and finished his religious studies at the Krakow seminary after World War II ended. He was ordained in 1946 and then went to Rome, where he spent two years completing his doctorate in theology. He returned to Poland in 1948 and served in several parishes in Krakow. In 1958, he became the Bishop of Ombi and then the archbishop of Krakow six years later. He was highly respected and considered one of the Church's leading thinkers. Archbishop Wojtyła participated in the Second Vatican Council, also known as Vatican II. In 1962, the Council started reviewing church doctrine. There were many sessions held over the course of the next few years. As a member of the council, he helped the church to analyze its position in the world. For this and all of his other contributions to the church, he was made a cardinal by Pope Paul VI in 1967. Poland was now under communist rule, where religion was outlawed, but Cardinal Wojtyła defied them and continued to lead his people in the faith. The communists killed hundreds of thousands of Catholics, but the Cardinal said Mass openly and ministered to his people in spite of the politics.

In 1978, history was made when Cardinal Wojtyła became the first non-Italian Pope in more than four hundred years since Pope Adrian VI in the sixteenth century. He was also the one of the youngest Popes to be elected at the age of fifty eight. He was a prolific traveler, visiting more than one hundred twenty nine countries to spread his message of faith and peace. But in 1981, while in a car in St. Peter's Square, an assassin shot Pope John Paul twice. He recovered, forgave and befriended his attacker, who eventually converted to Catholicism.

Pope John Paul spoke fifteen different languages, including Polish, Latin, Italian, English, Spanish, Portuguese, French, German, Luxembourgish, Slovak, Czech, Serbo-Croatian, Dutch, Ukrainian and Esperanto, nine of which he used extensively as Pope. He beatified 1,344 people and canonized 483 people, more than the all of his predecessors and was the third longest-serving Pope in history. He was very conservative and felt that atheism was a great threat, as well as maintaining the Church's position on abortion, contraception, ordination of women and celibacy. He championed faith and family life, while challenging consumerism and hedonism. He hated communism and worked with President Ronald Reagan to bring down the that empire. He also attempted to improve relations with the Eastern Orthodox Church, Judaism and Islam.

Pope John Paul II died on Saturday, April 2, 2005. Four kings, five queens, seventy presidents and prime ministers and more than fourteen leaders of other religions attended his funeral as well as an estimated four million mourners gathered in and around Vatican City, waiting in line to say good-bye to him. Protestant and Eastern Orthodox leaders, as well as representatives and heads from Judaism, Islam, Druze and Buddhism offered their own memorials and prayers to sympathize with grieving Catholics. After his death, the Israeli government created a commission to the legacy of John Paul II.

On July 5, 2013, the Vatican announced it would waive the usual five year waiting period and that the Catholic Church would declare Pope John Paul II a saint. Both Pope John Paul II and Pope John XXIII were canonized on April 27, 2014 by Pope Francis.

Pope John Paul's feast day is October 22 and he is the patron saint of Poland, Świdnica City in Poland, Trecastelli, Borgo Mantovano and Rivignano, all in Italy, Paradahán, Philippines, Tanza Cavite, Philippine Families and the Archdiocese of Kraków. He is the Co-patron of World Youth Day and World Meeting of Families 2015.
