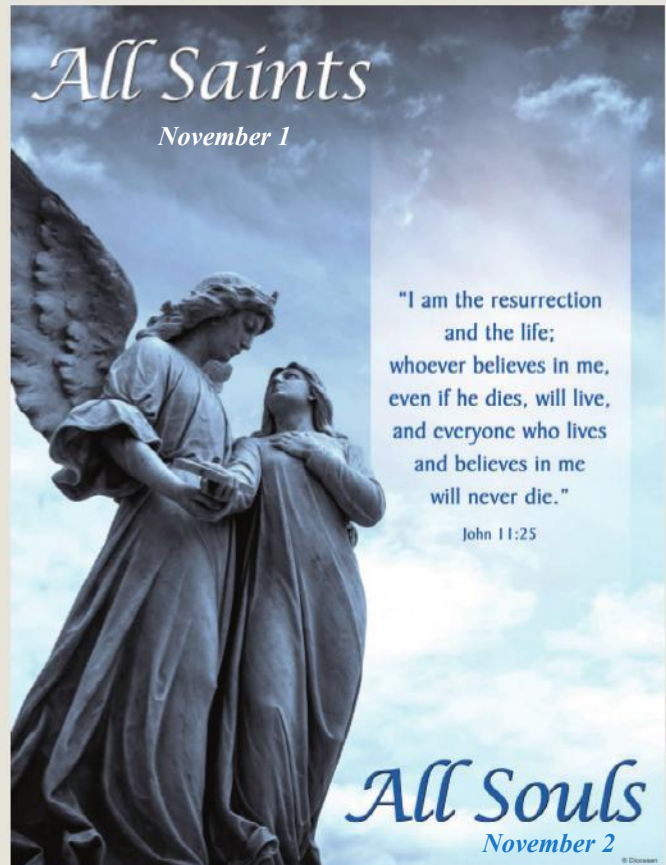

Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." (Matt 22:36-40)



God calls us to profound generosity in our readings today. Loving our neighbor as ourselves takes on specific forms in God's commandments from the Book of Exodus. Note that this is the second commandment Jesus gives. This command follows after the first: *Love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.* This is the greatest and the first commandment. This is where Jesus tells us to begin.

If we are to love our neighbor properly, we must begin by seeking God and God's help first. We must start at the source of all generous love. We must be filled from the eternal font if we are to pour out to others. Our participation at Mass gives us what we need to answer God's call to love others. In the Eucharist, we receive Christ: body, blood, soul, and divinity. We are given Goodness himself; we are recipients of eternal and perfect generosity; we are fed with the love God calls us to extend to others.

Through Christ's Real Presence here with us today, may we be equipped to go forth and love as he loves us!

Whoever loves me will keep my word, says the Lord, and my Father will love him and we will come to him. (John 14:23)

Este mandamiento sigue al primero: *Amarás al Señor, tu Dios, con todo tu corazón, con toda tu alma y con toda tu mente.* Este es el mayor y el primer mandamiento. Aquí es donde Jesús nos dice que comencemos.

Si vamos a amar a nuestro prójimo apropiadamente, primero debemos comenzar por buscar a Dios y la ayuda de Dios. Debemos comenzar en la fuente de todo amor generoso. Debemos ser llenos de la fuente eterna si hemos de derramar a los demás. Nuestra participación en la Misa nos da lo que necesitamos para responder al llamado de Dios a amar a los demás. En la Eucaristía recibimos a Cristo: cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad. Se nos da la Bondad misma; somos receptores de una generosidad eterna y perfecta; somos alimentados con el amor que Dios nos llama a extender a los demás.

A través de la Presencia Real de Cristo aquí con nosotros hoy, ¡que estemos equipados para salir y amar como Él nos ama!

El que me ama, guardará mi palabra, dice el Señor, y mi Padre lo amará y vendremos a él. (Juan 14:23.)

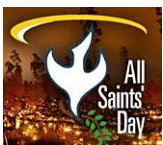

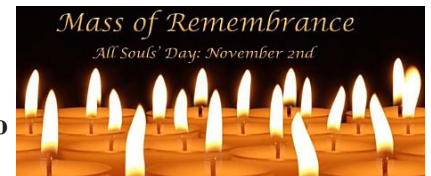

The St. Faustina Bereavement and Consolation Ministry cordially invites you to join us for our All Souls Bilingual Mass at 7:00 pm.

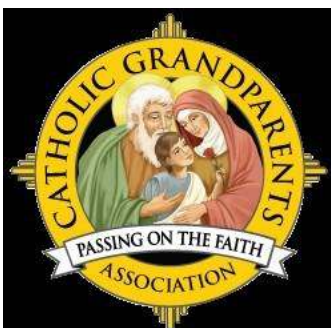
During the Mass we will honor your loved one as well as other members of our parish community who have entered into Eternal Life during the past year.

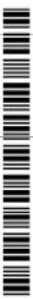

The Path to Sainthood

This week we celebrate All Saints Day, where we remember all of the good people who died and are in Heaven, but we don't know them by name. We are all called to be saints, whether officially formally canonized or not. There are also named saints from olden days and recent. Every day more souls are added to the list of future saints, who offered their lives to serving others or were martyred for the faith.

The first step to sainthood is to be declared "A Servant of God." This is for people who are being investigated on how they led their lives and the works that they did.

They are posthumously declared heroic in virtues as they are being examined.

This process opens the door to canonization. A Servant of God is someone who is called or chosen to serve and who is loyal and obedient to God, even when it is not convenient. Christ was our example regarding servanthood, through his humility.

A Servant of God is a term for someone who sets himself or herself apart to minister the word of the Lord to people, dedicating their lives to be faithful to God alone.

Most of the time they are involved in leadership roles, helping others. He or she puts the Lord first and applies Christ's commands of loving God and neighbor. Often, there are great sacrifices in that person's life, including death. Many times others will berate the good being done, even in their own families. A Servant of God helps to spread the gospel to the untrained souls, making them disciples and teaching them about the Lord. He or she knows that life doesn't revolve around themselves, but that of serving God alone. Time, resources, energy, money and expertise are given to glorify God. These are the virtues that are scrutinized which lead to becoming a Servant of God. An example of this is Father Walter Ciszek, an American priest who went to Russia to preach and serve the Catholic community and was imprisoned by the communists for over twenty years, serving hard time.

The next steps are being declared Venerable, Beatification and then Canonization to sainthood. *Servant of God* is not a canonical title in the Catholic Church, but a technical term used in the process of canonization. Venerable and Blessed are canonical titles.

Venerable, upon a decree of heroism or martyrdom, is next honored. It is considered likely that the person is in heaven, but could also be in purgatory. The Pope has to declare that the person lived a life which was "heroic in virtue." This means that he or she followed the virtues of faith, hope and charity as well as the cardinal virtues of justice, prudence and fortitude.

Bishop Fulton J. Sheen has the title of Venerable. He was a parish priest who rose to fame by first preaching on the radio and then moved over to television, between 1930 and 1968. He made a great deal of money from this and was also the leader of Society for the Propagation of the Faith, where he donated ten million dollars of his earnings. He was a leader in the NY churches and a very devout person. This is one of his many quotes: "*God writes his name on the soul of every man*"

The next step is beatification, which requires a miracle by the intercession of the candidate. Then the person is referred to as "Blessed." The blessed declaration suggests that the person is in Heaven, experiencing the beatific vision, but is not a requirement. Blessed Carlo Acutis was an Italian teenager who could be the first millennial saint. He died at the age of fifteen in 2006. In 2013, a mother from Brazil prayed to Venerable Carlo for the cure for her son, who had a severe pancreatic disease where he could not eat solid food. Her prayers were answered when her son was able to eat regular food. This miracle led to the beatification of Carlo to Blessed.

Canonization is accomplished when the person intercedes in a second miracle or is martyred and is declared a saint. This was the path for Maximilian Kolbe, a German-Polish priest who defied the Nazis in Poland and published documents condemning Nazism and openly helped Jewish people. He was arrested and sent to a concentration camp, where he ministered to all of the people. A man was scheduled to die, but cried for his family, so Maximilian offered to take his place. Food and water were withheld for two weeks, but when Maximilian didn't die, he was given a lethal injection. Pope Paul VI venerated Maximilian on January 3, 1969 and beatified him on October 17, 1971. St. Maximilian Maria Kolbe was then canonized by Pope John Paul II on October 10, 1982.

Exceptional canonizations also exist. The declaration of sainthood can take place when the Church claims the person died in the state of grace and already enjoys a beatific vision. Popes John XXIII became a Servant of God on November 18, 1965. He and John Paul II were both declared venerable by Pope Benedict XVI in December 2009. Pope John XXIII was beatified on September 3, 2000 and Pope John Paul was beatified on May 1, 2011. Both were declared saints on April 27, 2014 by Pope Francis.

We have the capability of taking these paths. It is a beautiful journey.
