

Nineveh will be destroyed." On hearing the warning, the Ninevites expressed repentance, believed in God, ordered a fast, and put on sackcloth. When God saw his works and how a change of heart occurred, he changed his mind and did not destroy the city. His works showed true repentance and a desire to return to the Lord!

In the Gospel we find that it is Jesus himself who makes the invitation to repent, because the Kingdom of God is at hand. Have we accepted this invitation? Do we recognize ourselves as sinners and seek God's forgiveness? This invitation requires discipline, dedication, perseverance—conscious effort on our part. It is then up to us to accept the invitation of total happiness offered to us by Christ, or the invitation of temporary happiness presented to us by the world. Do you dare to be completely happy?

May the Good Lord, in prayer, give us the wisdom to always discover His ways! Animo!



St. Faustina proudly presents Brother Louis Canter, OEF, who will present "Celebrating the Triduum and the gift of the Paschal Mystery" on Sunday, February 18 through Tuesday, February 20th for the parish's Three-Day Lenten Mission. The events of all three nights begin at 7:00 pm in the church.



On Sunday evening there will be a 75-minute concert of song, prayer and stories focusing on the Gospels from Cycle A of the last Sunday of Lent.

Monday features "A Glimpse of Holy Thursday and Good Friday. The topics that will be discussed are prayer, signs, symbols, and purpose of Holy Thursday, and the fulfillment of Jesus' obedience to the Father and its effects for us as a result of Good Friday.

Tuesday night's mission conclusion features prayer and the "Unpacking of the Easter Vigil" as we look at each section and how it reveals our Salvation through God's love and mercy.

Brother Canter, who recently retired from full-time ministry as Coordinator of Pastoral Care for four parishes in the Diocese of Orlando, has spent most of his life as a Pastoral Musician, which has afforded him the opportunity to minister in a wide variety of parishes that had many multi-cultural facets to them. The combination of both Pastoral Musician and Pastoral Ministry makes Louis a great resource in Liturgy and Music. He is currently the Composer in Residence for the Lutheran Franciscans. He is also a Chaplin at Lakeland Regional Hospital.

He is a published composer and author. He continues to do parish missions, retreats and writes for International Liturgical Publications. He is also published by Oregon Catholic Press and World Library/GIA publications. Louis has performed throughout the United States and most recently has performed in Carnegie Hall as a pianist and vocalist for the 'Voices in the Hall' Concert. In September of 2023 he received the 'Mary, Mother of God' Award from Bishop Noon for excellence in Pastoral Ministry.

Ash Wednesday Mass and Service Schedule



Lent begins on, Ash Wednesday, is Wednesday, February 14. The Masses and Service schedule for that day is as follows:

English Mass at 8:00 am
Service with Ashes at 12:00 pm Bilingual Mass at 7:00 pm

ASHES WILL BE DISTRIBUTED <u>ONLY</u> AT THE MASSES AND AT THE SERVICE.

According to the United States Conference of Bishops, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

FASTING is understood as having one normal meal during the day. Water and medications do not break the fast. **ABSTINENCE** is not eating meat or anything with meat by-products (such as soup broth, for an example).

Catholics over 59 are exempt from the full requirements of the traditional Catholic fasting rule. According to the Catholic Church, individuals who are over the age of 60, along with those who are physically or mentally ill, are not required to fast or abstain from eating meat on on days of religious obligation. The law of fasting applies to those from 18 to 59 years of age, but abstinence from meat starting at the age of 14, has no upper age limit.

St. Marianne Cope

St. Marianne Cope, O.S.F. is also known as St. Marianne of Molokai.

Barbara Koob was born on January 23, 1838 in Heppenheim, in the Grand Duchy of Hesse, now a part of Germany.



The family's last name was later changed to Cope. A year after her birth, they all emigrated to the United States, moving to Utica, New York. Barbara attended a parish school there until the eighth grade. Then her father became disabled, causing her to work in a factory to support the family.

When her father died in 1862, Barbara left the factory for the convent, becoming a novitiate of the Sisters of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis located in Syracuse, New York. There she took the name Marianne. Many German-speaking immigrants moved to that part of New York state, so she became a

teacher. Later on she was a principal at a school for immigrant children.

Sister Marianne helped direct the opening of the first two Catholic hospitals in central New York, one of first of fifty general hospitals in the country. She assembled students from the Geneva Medical College in New York to work at the hospital, also stipulating that patients should be able to refuse treatment by them. This was historical because it was a new concept where the right of a patient to refuse treatment was recognized. Sister created charters specifying that medical care was to be provided to all, regardless of race or creed and was also appointed to govern St. Joseph's Hospital, which was the first public hospital in Syracuse, serving there from 1870 to 1877.

By 1883, Sister had become the Superior General of her congregation. Soon she received a request for help from leprosy sufferers in Hawaii. King Kalakaua sent a letter asking for aid in treating patients who were isolated on the island of Molokai. Fifty other religious affiliations had already declined to help. Now known as Mother Marianne, she agreed to assist and left Syracuse with six sisters to attend to the sick. They arrived in Hawaii on November 8,1883.

This was her response to the King:

"I am hungry for the work and I wish with all my heart to be one of the chosen Ones, whose privilege it will be, to sacrifice themselves for the salvation of the souls of the poor Islanders... I am not afraid of any disease, hence it would be my greatest delight even to minister to the abandoned 'lepers.'"

Mother Marianne now managed a hospital on the island of Oahu, where victims of leprosy were sent for triage, but the most severe patients were sent to the island of Molokai. The following year, she helped establish the Malulani hospital on the island of Maui. She stayed awhile, but then went back to Oahu.

There were claims of abuse from the government-appointed administrator. Mother investigated and demanded that the person resign or she would leave. The government dismissed the administrator and placed Mother Marianne as the manager of the hospital. Even though Mother was getting older, her workload increased. Now she was responsible for the orphans of those who had contracted the disease and for the clergy who had become ill while working with lepers. Eventually she was using a wheelchair, but still continued to work tirelessly. With all of her years of assisting leprosy patients, she never contracted the disease herself, which many regarded as a miracle.

Mother Marianne passed away on August 9, 1918 and was buried at the Bishop Home. Following her death, several miracles were reported in her name. In 1993 a woman was cured of a multiple organ failure after praying to Mother Marianne. The woman's recovery was certified by the Church. Mother Marianne was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI on May 14, 2005.

After her beatification, Blessed Marianne Cope's remains were moved to Syracuse, New York and placed in a shrine. An additional miracle happened on December 6, 2011 regarding a woman who was dying, but was healed and survived unexplainably. This was credited to Mother Marianne and was approved by Pope Benedict.

St. Marianne Cope was canonized by Pope Benedict on October 21, 2012. Her feast day is January 23 and she is the patron saint of people with leprosy, outcasts and those with HIV/AIDS.


