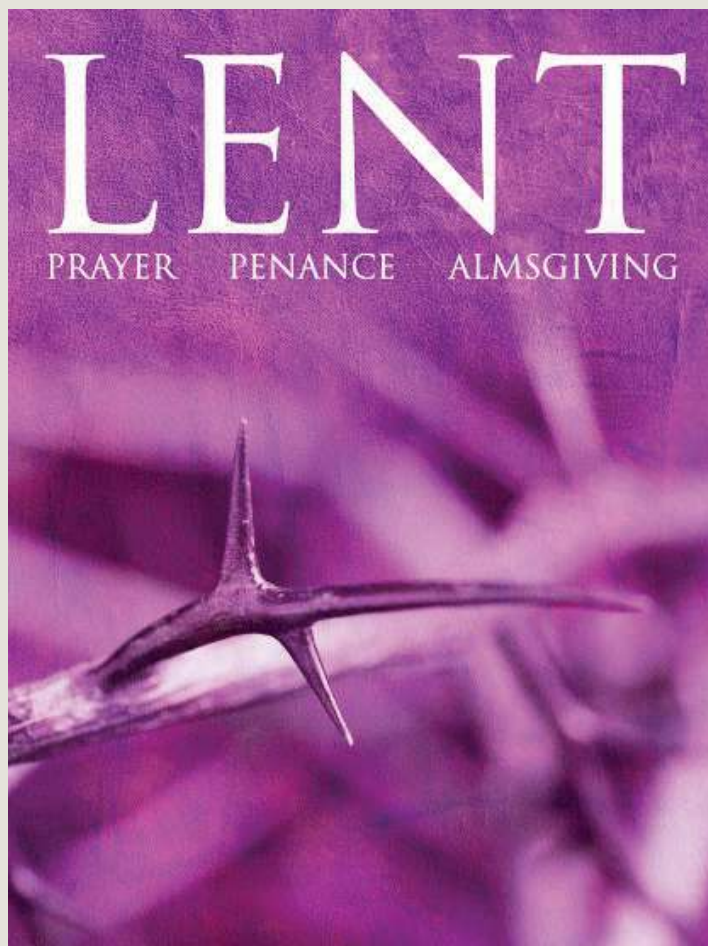

# ***A MESSAGE FROM FATHER CARLOS - UN MENSAJE DE PADRE CARLOS***

My Dear Family of St. Faustina,

With Ash Wednesday, we begin this time of renewal and preparation for Easter, which we call Lent. On this First Sunday of Lent, the Word of God warns us of the danger of temptation. Every time we proclaim the Word of God, we show that man does not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. In the face of humanity's sin, God remains faithful.

God manifests Himself in the beauty of Nature; but, above all, in his love for us. That is why we see in the first reading that he makes a covenant with Noah and his descendants: he promises that a flood will not return and destroy the earth. In the second reading, the apostle Peter reminds us of the victory of the Spirit of the Lord. That Spirit encourages and leads Jesus to proclaim the Good News. We receive that same power from that same Spirit in baptism, it encourages us, and gives us the certainty of the Lord's presence in our journey. Brothers and sisters, like Jesus, let us allow ourselves to be led by the Holy Spirit who speaks to us in the Word of God proclaimed in the Church: "Christ died for our sins to lead us to God".



This weekend's Gospel brings us the brief account of Jesus' temptations. Jesus is torn between choosing the path proposed by the Father or choosing the one proposed to him by the Tempter.

Jesus Christ is the Kingdom of God among men. Those who believe in his words and deeds welcome the Kingdom of God. Let us convert now that we can, put off our sins, and believe in the Gospel as the rule of life, for Christ died for sins once for all, the innocent for the guilty. So when we are tested for love, at the end of life, it will not happen to us as it did to people in Noah's time. Jesus invites us to live consciously, striving not to fall into temptation, welcoming and building his kingdom. May the Holy Spirit awaken our ears to the Lord who tells us: be converted and believe in the Gospel. Animo!

Mi querida familia de Santa Faustina

Con el Miércoles de Cenizas, iniciamos este tiempo de renovación y de preparación hacia la Pascua, que llamamos Cuaresma. En este Primer Domingo de Cuaresma, la Palabra de Dios nos pone en alerta del peligro de la tentación. Cada vez que proclamamos la Palabra de Dios manifestamos que no sólo de pan vive el hombre sino de toda palabra que sale de la boca de Dios. Frente al pecado de la humanidad Dios se mantiene fiel.

Dios se manifiesta en la belleza de la Naturaleza; pero, sobre todo, en su amor por nosotros. Por eso, vemos en la primera lectura que hace una alianza con Noé y sus descendientes: promete que no volverá un diluvio que destruya la Tierra. En la segunda lectura, el apóstol Pedro nos recuerda la victoria del Espíritu del Señor. Ese Espíritu anima y conduce a Jesús a proclamar la Buena Nueva. Esa misma fuerza de ese mismo Espíritu, la recibimos en el bautismo, nos anima, y nos da la certeza de la presencia del Señor en nuestro caminar. Hermanos y hermanas, como Jesús dejémonos conducir por el Espíritu Santo que nos habla en la Palabra de Dios anunciada en la Iglesia: "Cristo murió por nuestros pecados para conducirnos a Dios".

El Evangelio de este fin de semana nos trae el relato breve de las tentaciones de Jesús. Jesús se encuentra entre optar por el camino propuesto por el Padre o elegir el que le propone el Tentador.

Jesucristo es el Reino de Dios entre los hombres. Quien cree en sus palabras y en sus obras acoge el Reino de Dios. Convirtámonos ahora que podemos, despojémonos de nuestros pecados y creamos en el Evangelio como norma de vida, pues Cristo murió por los pecados una vez para siempre, el inocente por los culpables. Así cuando seamos examinados del amor, al final de la vida, no nos pasara como a la gente en tiempos de Noé. Jesús nos invita a vivir de manera consciente, luchando para no caer en tentación, acogiendo y construyendo su reinado. Que el Espíritu Santo despierte nuestros oídos al Señor que nos dice: conviértete y cree en el Evangelio. ¡Ánimo!

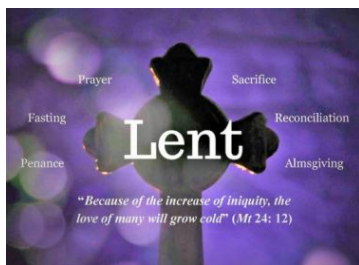

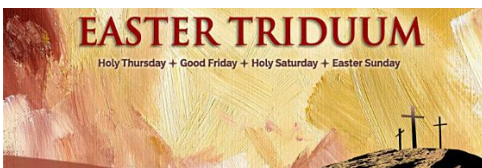
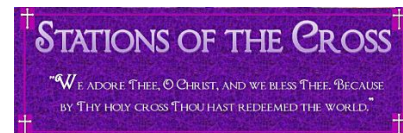

“Celebrating the Triduum and the gift of the Paschal Mystery” will be held on Sunday, February 18th through Tuesday, February 20<sup>th</sup> for the parish’s three-day Lenten Mission. All three nights begin at 7:00 pm in the church. The mission is presented by Brother Louis Canter.

**On Sunday evening** there will be a 75-minute concert of song, prayer and stories focusing on the Gospels from Cycle A of the last Sunday of Lent. **Monday features** “A Glimpse of Holy Thursday and Good Friday. **Tuesday night’s** mission conclusion features prayer and the “Unpacking of the Easter Vigil” as we look at each section and how it reveals our Salvation through God’s love and mercy.

*We invite everyone to join us for this very special Easter Mission.*

According to the United States Conference of Bishops, Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence. *Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.*

**FASTING** is understood as having one normal meal during the day. Water and medications do not break the fast. **ABSTINENCE** is not eating meat or anything with meat by-products (soup broth, for an example).

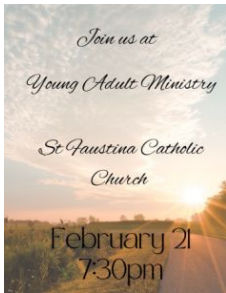


According to the Catholic Church, individuals who are over the age of 60, along with those who are physically or mentally ill, are not required to fast or abstain from eating meat on days of obligation. The law of fasting applies to those from 18 to 59 years of age, but abstinence from meat, starting at the age of 14, has no upper age limit.

# ***SERVANTS OF GOD (PART 2)***

The following holy souls are on the path to sainthood.

**Emil Kapaun** – an Army chaplain priest who served in WW II and Korea and then died in a North Korean prisoner of war camp.

**Helio Koa'elo** - a Hawaiian convert who became a lay missionary known as the "Apostle of Maui." He converted four thousand natives to the Catholic faith.

**Joseph Verbis Lafleur** - a priest in the Philippines in World War II who saved many sailors during a bombing, but died in the process.

**Mary Elizabeth Lange** - a nineteenth century black Catholic nun, who founded the Oblate Sisters of Providence and was the first African American Superior General. She and two other women started a school in Baltimore, later known as St. Frances Academy, still operating today.

**Leonard LaRue** - the captain of the SS Meredith Victory, a US Merchant Marine cargo freighter, who rescued 14,000 refugees during the Korean War, hours before the Communists were advancing. He later became a Benedictine Monk in New Jersey named Brother Marinus.

**Rose Hawthorne Lathrop** - a mother, widow, writer, social worker and Catholic convert who became nun. She founded the Dominican Sisters of Hawthorne and is the daughter of the writer, Nathaniel Hawthorne.

**Mathias Loras** - a French-born priest who became the first Bishop of the Diocese of Dubuque in 1837 in the Iowa Territory, comprising of most of Minnesota and North and South Dakota, east of the Missouri River.

**Vincent J. McCauley** - an Iowa born priest who became the first Bishop of Diocese of Fort Portal in Uganda.

**Mary Virginia Merrick** - a pioneer in American Catholic social reform. She was paralyzed from a fall but was still able to start the Christ Child Society in 1887 to help needy infants, children and families in Washington DC. Today there are forty five chapters in twenty one states and Washington DC.

**Francis J. Parater** - a Seminarian from Virginia who died at the age of twenty while studying in Rome in 1920. He was an extremely devout Catholic who wrote the "Act of Oblation."

**Thomas Frederick Price** - a priest who was the co-founder of the Maryknoll Fathers and Brothers.

**Bernard J. Quinn** - a priest from New Jersey who started the first church for black Catholics in Brooklyn in 1922 called St. Peter Claver, which still exists today. He created a children's choir, which included Pearl Bailey and Lena Horn. In 1928, he established an orphanage for black children in Wading River NY, which was burned down twice by the Ku Klux Klan, but rebuilt.

**James Reuter** - a Jesuit who moved to the Philippines at the age of twenty two who taught at the Ateneo de Manila University. He was a writer, director and producer for theater, radio, print and film. He stressed the importance of prayers, especially the Rosary.

**Charlene Richard** - a devout twelve year old girl from Richard, Louisiana who was diagnosed with acute lymphatic leukemia. When she was told of this, she accepted her fate and began praying for others at the hospital to be healed or to convert, which did happen.

**Blandina Segale** - Rosa Segale was an Italian-born nun and missionary who served in the US frontier in the nineteenth century.

**Paul Wattson** – a convert who became a priest. He was an advocated for ecumenism, which is the idea that Christians of all denominations should work together.

**George J. Willmann** – a priest born in Brooklyn, but spent most of his adult life in the Philippines, where he was granted citizenship. He is known as the "Father of the Knights of Columbus" in the Philippines due to his strengthening the established organization with his leadership.

**Rhoda Wise** - a stigmatist and mystic from Ohio. She saw many visions of Christ and St. [Thérèse of Lisieux](#) in her home. She is also associated with unexplained and sudden healings, including that of Mother Angelica, who had a painful stomach ailment.
