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A MESSAGE FROM FATHER CARLOS - UN MENSAJE DE PADRE CARLOS

My Dear Family of St. Faustina,

The readings for this Second Sunday of Lent speak of death and life. In the first reading we see the case of Abraham, the faithful and obedient man, to whom God asked for his son and he did not deny him, he was willing to offer him as God asked

him. And because of your faith, God blesses you abundantly. We know that God the Father gave his only Son, the Beloved One, for all of us, and in the story of the Transfiguration the mystery of Jesus' death is hidden.

Last Sunday the Gospel took us into the desert with Jesus. Today it drags us towards a very different scenario: a high mountain, a place that suggests light, the manifestation of God. Every year on the Second Sunday of Lent, the Church places before us the figure of Jesus Christ transfigured, there is Jesus in the midst of Moses and Elijah, in the midst of the law and the prophets. His glorious face serves as encouragement and hope to those of us who try to follow him.



Brothers and sisters, we must put Jesus at the center of our hearts and our faith, Jesus alone, not other gods around us. We have to learn to let ourselves be led by Jesus towards love. Let us not forget that those who listen to Jesus

find him as a source of Love. Those who listen to Jesus are filled with the strength and life that God gives. What a good itinerary for this Lent: to place ourselves close to Jesus, to shape ourselves to his style! I remind you to keep an eye out for our Weekly Challenge. Dare to live this Lent in a different way.

Let us remember our catechumens who are already beginning the countdown of preparation to receive the sacraments of Christian Initiation on the night of the Great Easter Vigil. Let us pray for them who already participated in the Rite of Election last week and next week the Counting begins. Let us pray loudly for each of them. Animo!

Las lecturas de este Segundo Domingo de Cuaresma hablan de muerte y de vida. Su rostro glorioso nos sirve de estímulo y esperanza a los que intentamos seguirle.

Hermanos y hermanas, hay que poner en el centro de nuestro corazón y de nuestra fe, a Jesús, solo a Jesús, no a otros dioses de nuestro entorno. Tenemos que aprender a dejarnos conducir por Jesús hacia el amor. No olvidemos que quien escucha a Jesús lo va encontrando como fuente de Amor. Quien escucha a Jesús se va llenando de la fuerza y la vida que da Dios. ¡Qué buen itinerario para esta Cuaresma!: ¡situarnos cerca de Jesús, para ir configurándonos a su estilo! Le recuerdo estar pendiente a nuestro Reto semanal. Atrévete a vivir esta Cuaresma de manera diferente.

Recordemos nuestros catecúmenos que ya comienzan la cuenta regresiva de preparación para recibir los sacramentos de Iniciación Cristiana la noche de la Gran Vigilia Pascual. 

FATHER WALTER JOSEPH CISZEK, SERVANT OF GOD By Marylu Mariniello

Walter Joseph Ciszek, S.J. was a Polish-American Jesuit priest of the Russian Greek Catholic Church who performed clandestine missionary work in the Soviet Union between 1939 and 1963.

He was born on November 4, 1904 to Polish immigrants Mary Mika and Martin Ciszek in the mining town of Shenandoah, PA.

His father came to the US in the 1890s from Galicia in Austria-Hungary. As a young man, Walter was a discipline problem, becoming a street gang member who challenged his family, teachers and the police. Then he shocked everyone by deciding to become a priest. In 1928, he entered the Jesuit seminary in Poughkeepsie NY. The next year, he volunteered to serve as a missionary to Russia, where the Bolshevik Revolution had taken place twelve years before. Christians were being openly persecuted there, with few having access to a priest. Pope Pius XI made an appeal to priests from around the world to go to Russia as missionaries and Father Walter answered this call.



In 1934, Father was sent to Rome to study theology, Russian, the history of Russia and liturgy at the Pontifical Russian College, also known as the 'Russicum', a Jesuit-run seminary. This school was established to train priests for missionary work. His fellow seminarians included Alexander Kurtna, a convert from the Estonian Orthodoxy. Father referred to Alexander by the codename "Misha" in his memoirs. Following his expulsion from the Russicum in 1940, Kurtna worked as a translator for the Vatican's Congregation for the Eastern Churches between 1940 and 1944, with only one interruption. During those years, Kurtna also covertly spied for the Soviet NKVD, the secret police, also known as "The People's Commissariat for Internal Affairs." This was devastating for Father and many other priests and faithful. Kurtna was always loyal to the USSR, but he started spying for Nazi Germany in 1943 because he was threatened with being sent to a concentration camp. Kurtna had his revenge by stealing codebooks and passing them to the Soviets. Ironically, Kurtna and Father Walter met one another again in 1948 as fellow political prisoners in Norillag.

In 1937, Father Walter was ordained a priest in Rome in the Byzantine Rite taking the name of Vladimir. The next year he was sent to the Jesuit mission in Albertyn in eastern Poland. World War II began in 1939, which allowed the Soviets to occupy that area and forced Father to close his mission. He then went to Lviv and realized that it would be simple for him to enter the Soviet Union with the other exiles heading there. He secured permission and was able to cross the border in 1940 under the assumed identity of *Wladymyr Lypynski*. He and two of his fellow Jesuits traveled 1,500 miles by train to Chasovoy in the Ural Mountains.

There he worked as an unskilled logger while discreetly performing his ministry for the next year. In 1941 Father was arrested for spying for Nazi Germany and the Vatican. He was astonished to learn that the NKVD already knew his real name, that he was an American citizen and a Catholic priest. Then he was sent to the Lubyanka prison in Moscow, the national headquarters of the NKVD. He spent five years there, with most of them in solitary confinement. Father was routinely tortured and signed a "confession" in 1942 and was sentenced to fifteen years of hard labor in the Gulag. He remained in Lubyanka for four more years. In 1946, he was sent Norilsk, near the Arctic Circle. There he was forced to load coal onto freighter vessels. Later he was transferred to working in coal mines located in the Permafrost. A year later, he was sent to work on the construction of nickel, copper, cobalt, platinum and palladium ore refineries. He worked in mines from 1953 to 1955.

Throughout his imprisonment, Father continued to pray, offered Roman Masses and the Divine Liturgy, heard confessions, conducted retreats and performed secret and illegal parish ministry. He was presumed dead by both his family and the Jesuits. On April 22, 1955, his hard labor sentence ended. He was released with the restriction that he had to live in the city of Norilsk. Then he was finally able to write to his sisters in the US. Father set up a Catholic parish in Norilsk, but was then ordered by the KGB to move to Krasnoyarsk in 1958, where he secretly established several nearby mission parishes. When the KGB learned of this, Father was forcibly transferred to Abakan, ninety nine miles to the south, where he worked as an auto mechanic for four more years. In 1963, he finally received a letter from his sisters in the US. A few months later, the Soviet Union grudg-ingly decided to return Father and an American student named Marvin W. Makinen to the US in exchange for two Soviet agents. Father didn't know that Presidents Dwight D. Eisenhower and John F. Kennedy demanded his repatriation since the arrival of his first letter to his sisters in 1955. He was flown to Moscow and brought to the US State Department. There Father was told that he was still an American citizen and was able to go home. After twenty three years of living under Communist rule, Father came home on October 12, 1963, along with Marvin Makinen. The Soviets received the two GRU agents.

Father began working and lecturing at the John XXIII Center at Fordham University in 1965 and wrote two books, including the memoir *With God in Russia* and served as a spiritual director, but his health went on the decline. Father Ciszek died on the feast day of the Immaculate Conception on December 8, 1984 and was buried at the Jesuit Cemetery in Wernersville PA. In 1985, a Carmelite nun, the Mother Superior of a Ruthenian Rite Carmelite Nunnery which Father Ciszek helped found, began to petition for his formal canonization, which is currently being handled by the Diocese in Allentown, PA. Father Walter Ciszek's current title is *Servant of God*.
