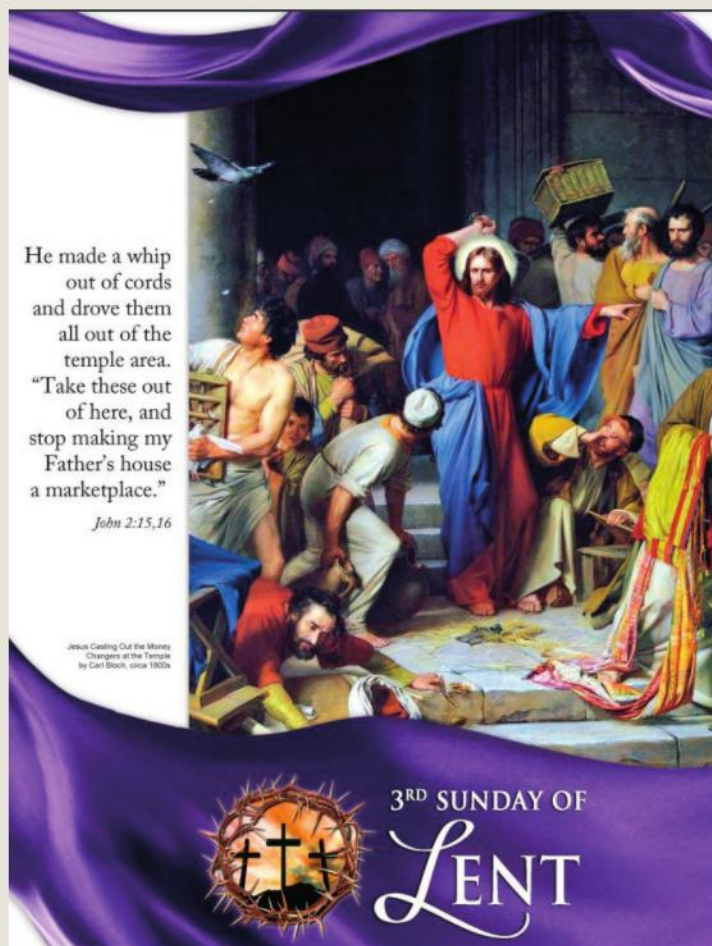

My Dear Family of St. Faustina,

I remind you of the Penitential Act on 19 March. This week's weekly Lenten challenge is Fast from your favorite beverage. And how are you doing with the reflection with the Nail? Brothers and sisters, let's make this Lent a spice! We have no excuses, there are resources at our disposal. All that's missing is our decision.

This Lent we have an opportunity to contribute to the building of the Kingdom, so that others can join in this journey. By supporting our Bishop Noonan's campaign, Our Catholic Call 2024, we reach places and people that may not be within our reach. We contribute to offering to the other that place of encounter with every and only source of salvation and freedom, Christ. With the coming of Christ, the true temple is Jesus Christ. In Him dwells the glory and presence of God. Let us welcome him into our lives. Animo!

This year as we celebrate our Lenten journey together, our Parish is offering a unique way to provide a tangible reminder of Jesus's crucifixion for our sins. JULIA GREELEY, SERVANT OF GOD

Julia Greeley was born into slavery in Hannibal Missouri, somewhere between 1830 and 1840, but the exact date of her birth is unknown. When she was five years old, her right eye was destroyed by a cruel slave master while he was whipping her mother. This disfigurement stayed with Julia for the rest of her life.

She was freed from being a slave in 1865 during the Civil War by Missouri's Emancipation Act. Julia supported herself by serving families in Missouri, Colorado, Wyoming and New Mexico. Fourteen years later, she moved to Denver and became a nanny and cook. Her employer was Julia Pratt Dickerson who later married William Gilpin, the first territorial Governor of Colorado.

Julia converted to Catholicism and was baptized on June 26, 1880 at Sacred Heart Church in Denver. She was especially devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Blessed Mother, attending Mass and receiving Communion daily. Even though she suffered from painful arthritis, Julia walked the city streets distributing literature from the Sacred Heart League to Catholics and non-Catholics alike, which also included every fire station. In 1901, she joined the Secular Franciscans and remained an active member for the rest of her life.



Her needs were simple. She lived in a boarding house and spent most of her time helping others and completing church duties. When Governor Gilpin and his wife died, Julia began working for different wealthy white families. She then decided to give away much of the money she made from her work to people in need. Julia had a red wagon, which she filled with coal, clothing and groceries and walked through the streets of Denver to give these things to poor families of every color or nationality. She went out after dark so she wouldn't embarrass white families who were ashamed to accept charity from a humble black woman.

Julia donated her own burial plot to an African American man who died. He was going to be placed into a pauper's grave, but Julia refused to let this happen. Soon people began calling her the "colored angel of charity" due to her kindness. If she ran out of funds to buy necessary items, she then begged to get the things needed for the poor. Because of all her dedication to families in poverty, Julia was officially named "*Denver's Angel of Charity.*"

Julia died on June 7, 1918. The church was completely full of poor and rich people paying their respects. Julia was a member of the Third Order of St. Francis at St. Elizabeth's church and was buried in the Franciscan habit.

Her funeral was at the Loyal Chapel. She was the first and only layperson to be placed there. Then she was buried in Mount Olivet Cemetery.

In January of 2014, the Archdiocese of Denver began an investigation for her sainthood. That year, she was one of four people who were examined for this honor. Her cause for canonization was opened by Archbishop Samuel J. Aquila in 2016. Her inquiry was accepted and validated in May of 2021 by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints.

Julia Greeley is one of four other African Americans placed into consideration in recent years and is the second candidate. In 2017, her body was moved to the Cathedral Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Denver. She is the first person to be interred there since it opened in 1912.

Julia is now called a Servant of God.

Father Blaine Burkey, Julia's biographer said "She loved others, feeding the poor, clothing the naked, and providing fuel for their homes. If someone was sick, she'd come to the house and help take care of them."

Fellowship of Catholic University Students founder Curtis Martin said that she was "Born a slave, half-blind, poor, the object of racism, and alone, Julia simply lived the Gospel of Jesus Christ and loved.
