


### A Message From Father Carlos / Un Mensaje de Padre Carlos

#### My Dear St. Faustina Family,

This weekend's liturgy remembers Jesus the Good Shepherd. Throughout the Universal Church, we celebrate World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

In the first reading of the Acts of the Apostles, Saint Peter openly proclaims that the power of the risen Jesus Christ has healed the paralytic who begged for alms and whom he had healed. Only the Lord can heal and save, which was clear in the apostles' minds. In the second reading, Saint John makes us aware of our great dignity: God has made us his children and heirs of his Kingdom.

This weekend's Gospel brings us the beautiful image of Jesus, the Good Shepherd. This image is a call to conversion for those of us who, in one way or another, shepherd the Christian community.



My brothers and sisters, this description is also a call to fraternal communion among all of us. The Good Shepherd, Jesus says, "I know my sheep, and they know me." It is a two-way relationship. Only from this closeness, this mutual relationship, and this communion of heart does the Good Shepherd share his life with the sheep. We must all walk as a Church toward this communion and mutual relationship, even more so today with everything happening in the world. Without ceasing to be faithful to the Gospel, to our Master, Jesus, we must discover how to walk creatively toward the future. How much do we need? Only believers, filled with the Spirit of the Good Shepherd, can help create the climate of closeness, mutual listening, reciprocal respect, and humble dialogue that we so much need.

Brothers and sisters, let us ask the Lord to continue calling many young people to be shepherds among his people, Good Shepherds like Jesus. We must strengthen our prayer life daily. What will help us the most is the testimony that we give as a community and as a church, starting with my own. We must talk about vocation with our children and in our families. Jesus needs us. Animo!

Mi querida familia de Santa Faustina,

La liturgia de este fin de semana nos recuerda a Jesús el Buen Pastor, y también celebramos en toda la Iglesia Universal la Jornada Mundial de Oración por las vocaciones. La primera lectura de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, San Pedro procla-ma abiertamente que el paralítico que pedía limosna y al que había curado, ha sido curado por el poder de Jesucristo re-sucitado. Sólo el Señor puede curar y salvar. Eso estaba bien claro en la mente de los apóstoles. En la segunda lectura San Juan nos hace tomar conciencia de nuestra gran dignidad: Dios nos ha hecho hijos suyos y herederos de su reino.

El evangelio de este fin de semana nos trae la bella imagen de Jesús, Buen Pastor. Ciertamente, hablando en primera per-sona, es una llamada a la conversión, para quienes de una manera u de otra pastoreamos la comunidad cristiana. El pas-tor que se parece a Jesús sólo piensa en sus ovejas, no «huye» ante los problemas, no las deja solas. Al contrario, está junto a ellas, las defiende, se desvive por ellas, e incluso expone su vida buscando su bien. Tomemos en consideración que esta descripción del Buen Pastor es el mismo Jesús que la hace.

Pero también hermanos y hermanas esta descripción es una llamada a la comunión fraterna entre todos. El Buen Pastor, dice Jesús: "conozco a mis ovejas y ellas me conocen a mí."Es un movimiento de dos direcciones. Sólo desde esta cer-canía, desde este conocimiento mutuo y esta comunión de corazón, el Buen Pastor comparte su vida con las ovejas. Ha-cia esta comunión y mutuo conocimiento hemos de caminar también todos como Iglesia. Y más todavía hoy con todo lo que pasa en el mundo, todo sin dejar nunca de ser fieles a los criterios del Evangelio, ósea a nuestro Maestro Jesús, tene-mos que descubrir como caminar de manera creativa hacia el futuro. ¿Cuánto nos falta? Sólo creyentes, llenos del Espíri-tu del Buen Pastor, pueden ayudarnos a crear el clima de acercamiento, mutua escucha, respeto recíproco y diálogo hu-milde que tanto necesitamos.

Hermanos y hermanas, pidamos al Señor que siga llamando a muchos jóvenes a ser pastores en medio de su pueblo. Pe-ro pastores como Jesús. Nuestra oración tiene que ser cada día más fuerte. Definitivamente lo que más nos va a ayudar es el testimonio que demos como comunidad, como iglesia, comenzando por el mío propio.Atrevamos nos hablar de vocación con nuestros hijos, en nuestras familias. Jesús necesita de nosotros. ¡Animo!



### Blessed Stanley Rother By Marylu Mariniello

Stanley Francis Rother was born in Okarche, Oklahoma, on March 27, 1935. His parents were Franz Rother and Gertrude Smith, who also had three other children, Betty Mae, Tom, and Jim. Betty Mae became a nun, Sister Marita. Stanley was baptized two days after his birth.

The family lived and worked on their farm. Stanley was a strong boy, quite able at his tasks. After finishing high school at Holy Trinity, he became a priest, studying at St. John Seminary and Assumption Seminary in San Antonio, Texas. He was the sacristan, groundskeeper, bookbinder, plumber, and gardener there. After almost six years at the seminary, the staff advised him to withdraw. He then consulted with Bishop Victor Reed of Oklahoma City, who sent Stanley to Mount Saint Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD. Stanley graduated and was ordained a priest by Bishop Reed on May 25, 1963.



Father Rother was now an associate priest in various parishes, including St. William in Durant, St. Francis Xavier, the Holy Family Cathedral in Tulsa, and Corpus Christi in Oklahoma City. 1968 Father requested a reassignment to the Diocese mission in Santiago Atitlán in southwest Guatemala. The people there were the Tz'utujil Mayan Indians. Father learned Spanish and the Tz'utujil language, which was a spoken and not written indigenous language, first recorded by the missionary Ramón Carlín, who served in Santiago Atitlán before Father Rother arrived. Father Carlin supported a radio station located on the mission property, transmitting daily language and mathematics lessons.

By 1975, Father Rother had become the leader of the Oklahoma-sponsored mission effort in Guatemala. Other religious and lay supporters came and went, but Father stayed. Now a prominent figure in the community, he was known for his light complexion and smoking a pipe. There was no Tz'utujil equivalent for "Stanley," so the people called him "*Padre Apla's*" - "Father Francis," his middle name.

In early 1981, Father was warned that his name was on a hit list of right-wing death squads. Friends informed him that he was scheduled as number eight to be killed and also told him that he should leave Guatemala. Father returned to Oklahoma in January, resuming parish duties, but wanted to return to Guatemala to be with his people and also looked forward to celebrating Easter with them. Knowing that the death squads were watching him, he returned to Santiago Atitlán in April. On July 28, 1981, just after midnight, gunmen broke into the rectory. A teenager named Francisco Bocel was in the Church. The assassins forced Francisco to take them to Father's bedroom, threatening to kill him if he did not do this. Francisco led them down a flight of stairs and knocked on the door. Father opened the door, and a struggle ensued. As Francisco fled, Father was shot twice in the head.

Many things changed the year before Father Rother's murder. Forces destroyed the radio station and murdered its director. Some of the catechists and parishioners disappeared. Searchers later found them dead, having been beaten and tortured. Father knew about all of this upon returning to Guatemala. The previous December, he wrote a letter to the faithful in Oklahoma describing the violent situation: "This is one of the reasons I have for staying in the face of physical harm. The shepherd cannot run at the first sign of danger." Father Francis Rother was one of ten priests who were murdered in Guatemala that year. His body was flown back to Oklahoma and buried in Holy Trinity Cemetery on August 3, 1981.

Authorities arrested three men on murder charges within weeks of Father's death. The police also questioned another man and a woman. They admitted to entering the Church to rob and to having shot Father when he tried to stop them. Most people did not believe the confessions and considered the accused men innocent, thinking that it was a cover-up of military involvement in the murder. US authorities pressured the Guatemalan appellate court to overturn the convictions. Authorities did not prosecute anyone else for Father's murder.

On December 1, 2016, Pope Francis approved Father Rother's beatification, confirming that Father was killed "*in odium fidei*" ("in hatred of the faith"). The Church beatified Stanley Rother in Oklahoma City on September 23, 2017. He is the first American-born priest and martyr to be beatified by the Church. A Memorial plaque to Father Rother in Santiago Atitlán states, "Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends."

In 2019, the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City broke ground on the Blessed Stanley Rother Shrine, a new church and ministry complex in Oklahoma City. The Diocese held a dedication Mass on February 17, 2023, to mark the official opening of the shrine. Father is now buried in the chapel located inside. The shrine has a museum, sanctuary, gift shop, and visitor center. It was built in the Spanish Colonial style, mirroring the parish church where Father Rother served and where he was martyred in Guatemala. The shrine was fully funded by Catholic donors and is the largest Catholic Church in Oklahoma.
