

A Message From Father Carlos / Un Mensaje de Padre Carlos

A Message From Father Carlos

On this Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, I would like to focus on the Gospel, a turning point in Mark's story. So far in this Gospel, the deeds of Jesus have shown Jesus to be the Son of God. Yet many, including Jesus' disciples, have not yet realized his true identity. Today, Jesus asks the disciples about what others say about him. He then turns the question directly to the disciples and asks them what they believe. Peter announces that they believe Jesus to be the Christ.

Christ is the Greek translation of the Hebrew word for Messiah, which means "the anointed one." In today's reading, Jesus refers to himself instead as the Son of Man, a term derived from the Jewish Scriptures found in the Book of Daniel and other apocryphal writings. Scholars suggest that the phrase "Son of Man" is best understood to mean "human being."

Now that the disciples have acknowledged Jesus as the Christ, Jesus confides in them the outcome of his ministry: he will be rejected, must suffer and die, and will rise after three days. Peter rejects this prediction, and Jesus rebukes him severely. The image of Christ that Jesus is giving is not the image of the Messiah that Peter was expecting. Jesus then teaches the crowd and the disciples about the path of discipleship: To be Chris's disciple is to follow the way of the cross, a path that meant tremendous suffering and death. This commitment is the kind of radical commitment and sacrifice that Jesus calls us to adopt for the sake of the Gospel. Courage!

Mensaje del Padre Carlos

En este vigésimo cuarto domingo del tiempo ordinario, me gustaría centrarme en el Evangelio, un punto de inflexión en la historia de Marcos. Hasta ahora, en este Evangelio, los hechos de Jesús han demostrado que Jesús es el Hijo de Dios. Sin embargo, muchos, incluidos los discípulos de Jesús, aún no se han dado cuenta de su verdadera identidad. Hoy, Jesús pregunta a sus discípulos qué dicen los demás de él. Luego dirige la pregunta directamente a los discípulos y les pregunta qué creen. Pedro anuncia que creen que Jesús es el Cristo.

Cristo es la traducción griega de la palabra hebrea Mesías, que significa «el ungido». En la lectura de hoy, Jesús se refiere a sí mismo como el Hijo del Hombre, un término derivado de las Escrituras judías que se encuentran en el Libro de Daniel y otros escritos apócrifos. Los eruditos sugieren que la frase «Hijo del Hombre» se entiende mejor como «ser humano».

Ahora que los discípulos han reconocido a Jesús como el Cristo, Jesús les confía el desenlace de su ministerio: será rechazado. deberá sufrir y morir, y resucitará a los tres días. Pedro rechaza esta predicción, y Jesús le reprende severamente. La imagen de Cristo que Jesús da no es la imagen del Mesías que Pedro esperaba. A continuación, Jesús enseña a la multitud y a los discípulos el camino del discipulado: Ser discípulo de Cristo es seguir el camino de la cruz, un camino que significaba tremendo sufrimiento y muerte. Este compromiso es el tipo de entrega y sacrificio radicales que Jesús nos pide que adoptemos por el Evangelio. ¡Ánimo!

Vote No on Amendment 4

An extremely grave amendment has been placed on the November 2024 ballot that seeks to erase pro-life protections by inserting language into the Florida Constitution banning regulation of abortion. This amend-



ment to the Florida constitution would allow abortion up until birth, including when the baby is capable of feeling pain, and would eliminate laws requiring parental consent and safety protocols for women. The Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops is working hard to oppose this dangerous and deceptive amendment and urges all Floridians to vote 'no' on Amendment 4.




host our bi-monthly blood drive from 7:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The Big Red Bus will be parked right outside our front entrance.

Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross By Marylu Mariniello



The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross is celebrated every year on September 14. It recalls three historical events – the finding of the True Cross by St. Helen, the dedication of churches built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulcher and Mount Calvary, and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem by the emperor Heraclius II.

Helen, the mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine, went to Jerusalem in the early fourth century to search the holy places of Christ's life. She was in her eighties at that time. According to tradition, Helen first received the inspiration for this holy mission in a dream. While she was in Jerusalem, she had a second-century Temple of Aphrodite demolished. Many believed that the temple was built over Christ's tomb. During the excavation, workers found three crosses, a

board with Pilate's inscription and the nails which had pierced Jesus' body. The local bishop Macarius had all three crosses touched to the corpse of a dead man and the body of a woman who was dying. One cross brought the dead man back to life and instantly cured the sick woman. This was the life-giving Cross of Christ, which was found on May 3, 326. Then, her son built the Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher on that spot on September 13, 335.

Also, per the historian Rufinus, the identity of the True Cross was confirmed by a miraculous healing after Bishop Macarius recited this prayer:

"O Lord, who by the Passion of Thine only Son on the cross, didst deign to restore salvation to mankind, and who even now hast inspired thy handmaid Helena to seek for the blessed wood to which the author of our salvation was nailed, show clearly which it was, among the three crosses, that was raised for Thy glory. Distinguish it from those which only served for a common execution. Let this woman who is now expiring return from death's door as soon as she is touched by the wood of salvation."

Helen had a true love and zeal for Christ and his Cross. She taught everyone that if we have a strong love for Jesus, then it must also be a desire for his Cross. Helen became a saint, as well as Macarius.

The cross immediately became an entity of veneration. Towards the end of the fourth century, an eyewitness stated that while at a Good Friday celebration in Jerusalem, the wood was taken out of its silver container and placed on a table together with the inscription Pilate ordered to be placed above Jesus' head.

Then "all the people pass through one by one; all of them bow down, touching the cross and the inscription, first with their foreheads, then with their eyes; and, after kissing the cross, they move on."

In 614, the Persian King Chosroes II declared war on the Romans. He conquered Jerusalem and confiscated many treasures, including Christ's Cross. The Byzantine emperor Heraclius tried to negotiate peace but was rejected. Then, he waged war and won near Nineveh, asking for the restitution of the Cross, which was returned to Jerusalem. According to legend, the emperor wanted to carry the cross back into Jerusalem himself, but was unable to move forward. Then, he took off his regal clothing and became a barefoot pilgrim, which allowed him to do the pilgrimage.

The date of this event was placed on the Western calendar in the seventh century.

The Chapel of St. Helena is inside the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, which was built by the <u>Crusaders</u> in her honor. It lies below the Chapel of the Finding of the True Cross, which venerates the site where Jesus Christ was crucified and buried.

The cross is the universal image of Christian belief. Thousands of generations of artists have made the cross into a thing of beauty to be carried in a procession or worn as jewelry. But to the first Christians, it had no beauty. Crosses stood outside many city walls, decorated only with decaying corpses, reminding all that Rome had authority and anyone who defied Rome, including Christians who refused sacrifice to Roman gods, would be crucified. Believers spoke of the cross as the instrument of salvation, but it seldom appeared in Christian art unless disguised as an anchor or the Chi-Rho until after Constantine's edict of toleration.

As the universal symbol of the Christian faith, the cross represents Christ's victory over death. In a deeper sense, the feast also celebrates the Holy Cross as the means of our salvation. It was an instrument of torture designed to degrade the worst of criminals. Now it has become the life-giving tree which has reversed Original Sin.

Jesus said to Nicodemus: 'No one has gone up to heaven except the one who has come down from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life.' For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him (John 3:13-17).

Blessed Dina Bélanger By Marylu Mariniello

Marie-Marguerite-Dina-Adélaïde Bélanger was born on April 30, 1897 in Quebec. Her parents were Olivier Octave Bélanger and Séraphia Matte. Dina was baptized only a few hours after birth. She had two brothers, but one died as an infant. Her mother was very religious and taught her children many religious principles, including attending Mass and saying novenas. As a child, Dina was bored with church attendance and often had temper tantrums if she didn't get her way, but eventually outgrew this.

She began her studies at the convent-school of Saint Roch in 1903, making her First Communion and Confirmation on May 2, 1907. Then she went to Notre-Dame de Jacques-Cartier in 1909 and later entered the Bellevue convent boarding school in 1911, where she became homesick but overcame it. Here, she made a private act of consecration to God. Upon completing her education, Dina lived at home from 1913 to 1916 and started to examine her conscience each night.

In 1913, she asked her parents and two priests if she could enter the Notre-Dame order's novitiate, but the priests told her to wait. Dina studied piano in school, which led to a very high-level certificate and a laureate before she received a teaching diploma. Her parish priest advised her parents to enroll her at the Institute of Musical Art in the US. She went to New York to study in 1916, also learning English, returning to Canada after her graduation in June 1918. She now performed public concerts between 1918 and 1921 but wanted something more.

Dina entered the Religieuses de Jésus-Marie on August 11, 1921 taking the name of "Marie de Sainte-Cécile de Rome." She made her vows on August 15, 1923. Her first mission was at Saint-Michel-de-Bellechasse, where she taught the piano, but she then became sick with scarlet fever, recovering that December in 1923. She tried to resume teaching, but the fever soon deteriorated into tuberculosis. Sister saw this as something which allowed her to deepen her union with Christ. Her Mother Super suggested that Dina begin writing a biographical account of her life. Before this, Dina saw Jesus in a vision, who said to her, "You will do good by your writings." Her autobiographical accounts spanned from 1924 until a few months prior to her death, which gave details of her spiritual encounters with Christ in a series of visions.

Sister Marie became sicker in 1927 and was taken to the medical ward. On April 29, 1929, she was moved to the tuberculosis isolation ward for good.


She died on September 4, 1929, and was buried at the convent. Later, in May of 1990, her remains were moved.

In 1950, her beatification cause opened in Québec. The informative process was held from May 11, 1950 until May 2, 1956 with her parents offering testimonies for the process. The theologians approved her journal entries and other spiritual writings on July 8, 1965, with a supplementary process. An apostolic practice was dispensed, causing the Congregation for the Causes of Saints to validate the previous processes in Rome on January 30, 1987. Pope John Paul II announced her Venerable on May 13, 1989.

The miracle that led to her beatification was the cure of an infant, Jules Chiasson of Brunswick. He suffered from hydrocephalus, which is a condition with a great deal of fluid within the brain, which was now reduced. The miracle was approved, and Dina Bélanger was beatified on March 20, 1993. Her feast day is September 4.

The Salle Dina-Bélanger, the Québec Music Festival Dina Bélanger, and the Collège Dina Bélanger in Saint-Michel-de-Bellechasse are named for her. A musical based on her life was presented as part of the Fourth Centennial of Quebec, including the Forty-Ninth International Eucharistic Congress, which was held there in June 2008.

This is her quote: "In heaven I shall be a beggar of love: that is my mission and I am beginning it here and now. I shall give joy."



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
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
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
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
