PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

Then he led them out as far as Bethany, raised his hands, and blessed them. As he blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven.(Lk 24:52)

The Ascension celebrates Jesus' heavenly homecoming and his return to the Father's house. It marks the completion of his earthly mission. He returns to heaven as a Savior, having conquered humanity's greatest enemies - sin, Satan and death - on the cross. He promises he will send his Apostles the Holy Spirit of God and that he will return, at the end of time.

In our human experience, it is easier to say good-bye to someone when we believe we will see them again. It is even better when they leave something behind for us to remember them by. On the Ascension, Jesus does both. News of the coming of the Spirit and the hope of Jesus' return made it much easier for the Apostles to let go of Jesus as he returns to heaven.

Once the Spirit proved to them that Jesus was alive, never to die again, they, too, found themselves willing to go forth and risk their lives to spread the Gospel. Once they were no longer afraid to die, the Apostles became less afraid to live.

In the Acts of the Apostles, the angels ask the Apostles why they are standing around looking at the sky, as if to suggest that time is wasting, get busy, there is a Gospel to preach, a Church to build, and a kingdom to prepare. The task given to them is the task entrusted to us by our baptism - to be his witnesses to the ends of the earth until he comes again.

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a Spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. (Eph 1:17)

La Ascensión celebra el regreso celestial de Jesús y su regreso a la casa del Padre. Marca la finalización de su misión terrenal. Él regresa al cielo como un Salvador, habiendo conquistado a los mayores enemigos de la humanidad - el pecado, Satanás y la muerte - en la cruz. Promete que enviará a sus apóstoles el Espíritu Santo de Dios y que regresará, al final de los tiempos.

En nuestra experiencia humana, es más fácil despedirse de alguien cuando creemos que lo volveremos a ver. Es aún mejor cuando dejan algo atrás para que los recordemos. En la Ascensión, Jesús hace ambas cosas. Las noticias de la venida del Espíritu y la esperanza del regreso de Jesús hicieron que fuera mucho más fácil para los Apóstoles soltar a Jesús cuando regresa al cielo.

Una vez que el Espíritu les demostró que Jesús estaba vivo, para nunca morir de nuevo, ellos también se encontraron dispuestos a salir y arriesgar sus vidas para difundir el Evangelio. Una vez que ya no tenían miedo de morir, los Apóstoles tuvieron menos miedo de vivir.

En los Hechos de los Apóstoles, los ángeles preguntan a los Apóstoles por qué están de pie mirando al cielo, como para sugerir que el tiempo se está perdiendo, que se ocupen, que haya un Evangelio que predicar, que una Iglesia que edificar y que un reino que preparar. La tarea que se les ha dado es la tarea que nos ha confiado nuestro bautismo: ser sus testigos hasta los confines de la tierra hasta que Él venga de nuevo.

Que el Dios de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, el Padre de gloria, les dé un Espíritu de sabiduría y revelación que resulte en el conocimiento de Él. (Efesios 1:17)

Are you a member of the parish's Facebook page? If you are, you have not only received Daily Devotions, Saint of the Day, and other such inspirational and spiritual information, you have also been kept up-to-date with what is going on at our new church construction site at 15551 North Boggy Marsh Road. On April 30 the photo of the construction trailer that was placed on our property recorded 621 views and two shares. On May 5 a drone shot of the property was posted and recorded 950 views with eight shares, and on May 14 photos of the installation of the septic tanks recorded 701 views and nine shares. Expected to come before the end of May is the pouring of the concrete slab/foundation and the delivery of the steel that will be used to build <u>OUR</u> church building.

Photos of the construction will be posted on a daily or weekly basis depending on the progress.

FATHER JOSEPH LAFLEUR

On this Memorial Day, we remember the heroes who gave their lives for our freedom. One truly heroic martyr was Father Joseph LaFleur.



Joseph Verbis LaFleur was born on January 24, 1912 in Ville Platte, Louisiana. He was the youngest of seven children, but they all had a hard childhood because their father abandoned them. Their mother found work where she could and grew vegetables to support her family.

As a young boy, Joseph felt the calling to the priesthood. At the age of fifteen, he entered St. Joseph's Minor Seminary in Saint Benedict and then went to Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans. He was ordained on April 2, 1938 and began serving at St. Mary Magdalen Parish in Abbeville, where he also coached baseball for the parish boys and ministered to all. He was there for three years and then enlisted in the US Army Air Corps in the summer of 1941, becoming a military chaplain, commissioned as a lieutenant.

His training took place in Albuquerque, NM. After completion, he was assigned to Clark Field in the Philippines, where he served the Nineteenth Bombardment Unit. Father Joseph arrived there a few weeks before the bombing at Pearl Harbor. When Clark Field was attacked on December 8, 1941, eight hours after Pearl Har-

bor, he chose to stay with the men instead of escaping. Ninety three men were killed and one hundred forty three were wounded. Father cared for the injured and gave Last Rites to the dying, which earned him the Distinguished Service Cross, the Purple Heart and the Bronze Star for his valor.

Soon his unit was captured by the Japanese, where they were held for two and half years. Father took care of the men, created a "church " from bamboo and wood and named it "The Chapel of St. Peter in Chains," celebrated Mass and took the place of those who could not do hard labor. He visited the sick even though it was against the rules and traded his watch and eyeglasses for food for the prisoners. He refused malaria medicine so others could have it. Almost two hundred POWs converted to Catholicism because of Father Joseph.

The seven hundred prisoners were then moved to various prison of war camps and eventually placed on a POW transport ship, the Shinyo Maru, which didn't have the white POW flag and was torpedoed by US forces on September 7, 1944, causing the ship to sink.

Chaplain LaFleur knew he had to get the men out, but the only one way was through the hatch that he opened onto the deck. He boosted many men out of the hold and up on deck, saving eighty, but didn't make it himself. Those who made it to shore last saw him in waist-deep water, helping others off Sindangan Point, Liloy, Zamboanga del Norte, Philippines. His body was never recovered. The men he saved were the only survivors.

Father LaFleur was posthumously given a second Distinguished Service Cross and another Purple Heart for his acts of bravery on the ship, which is a rare occurrence for someone to receive these honors twice.

His "Cause for Canonization" has opened and he is on the path to receiving the title of saint. On June 17, 2021, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops voted to advance the cause of canonization for First Lieutenant Father Joseph Verbis Lafleur.
