

Pastor's Message / Mensaje del Pastor

He told a parable to those who had been invited, noticing how they were choosing the places of honor at the table. "When you are invited by someone to a wedding banquet, do not recline at table in the place of honor. A more distinguished guest than you may have been invited by him, and the host who invited both of you may approach you and say, 'Give your place to this man,' and then you would proceed with embarrassment to take the lowest place. (Luke 14:7-9)

Every culture has a different understanding of sharing a meal. In first-century Palestine, a culture defined by honor and shame, sitting down to eat with another was an act of acceptance and respect. Meals affirmed the status of the invitee - usually of the same social rank as the host. But in today's Gospel we get the impression that Jesus has been invited with an ulterior motive as the Pharisees were observing him carefully, perhaps trying to trap him in some cultural or ritual infringement.



As the meal progresses, Jesus tells two parables. Just as they were watching him, so was he observing their behavior. Having seen how they jockeyed for the best seats at table, he uses the image of the wedding banquet and its seating arrangements to remind them of the true meaning of humility.

Saint Augustine once noted that pride was the source of all sin. If this is true, then humility is the antidote. Pride is a terminal spiritual illness for which the best medicine is a receptive heart and attentive ear enabling one to hear and reflect on wisdom, whatever its source. May God grant each one of us that receptive heart and attentive ear, that with wisdom and humility we may love one another with a sacrificial love.

My child, conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts. Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God. (Sirach 3:17-18)

Contó una parábola a los que habían sido invitados, notando cómo estaban eligiendo los lugares de honor en la mesa. "Cuando alguien te invite a un banquete de bodas, no te reclines en la mesa en el lugar de honor. Un invitado más distinguido de lo que usted puede haber sido invitado por él, y el anfitrión que los invitó a ambos puede acercarse a ustedes y decirles: 'Dale tu lugar a este hombre', y luego procederías con vergüenza a tomar el lugar más bajo. (Lucas 14:7-9)

Cada cultura tiene una comprensión diferente de compartir una comida. En la Palestina del primer siglo, una cultura definida por el honor y la vergüenza, sentarse a comer con otro era un acto de aceptación y respeto. Las comidas afirmaron el estado del invitado, generalmente del mismo rango social que el anfitrión. Pero en el Evangelio de hoy tenemos la impresión de que Jesús ha sido invitado con un motivo oculto mientras los fariseos lo observaban cuidadosamente, tal vez tratando de atraparlo en alguna infracción cultural o ritual.

A medida que avanza la comida, Jesús cuenta dos parábolas. Así como ellos lo estaban observando, él también estaba observando su comportamiento. Después de haber visto cómo competían por los mejores asientos en la mesa, utiliza la imagen del banquete de bodas y sus arreglos de asientos para recordarles el verdadero significado de la humildad.

San Agustín señaló una vez que el orgullo era la fuente de todo pecado. Si esto es cierto, entonces la humildad es el antídoto. El orgullo es una enfermedad espiritual terminal para la cual la mejor medicina es un corazón receptivo y un oído atento que le permita a uno escuchar y reflexionar sobre la sabiduría, cualquiera que sea su fuente. Que Dios nos conceda a cada uno de nosotros ese corazón receptivo y oído atento, para que con sabiduría y humildad podamos amarnos unos a otros con un amor sacrificial.

Hija Mía, conduce tus asuntos con humildad, y serás amado más que un dador de regalos. Humíllate cuanto más, más grande eres, y encontrarás el favor de Dios. (Sirach 3:17-18)

The preparation class is required for first-time parents or if there is no record of a previous class. A Baptismal date cannot be scheduled before registration for the preparation class is scheduled. Class space is limited; please call Marylu in our office for registration and with questions.

of Holy Matrimony

The sacrament of Holy Matrimony is a serious commitment not to be taken lightly or unadvisedly. It typically takes 6-12 months to complete the required and proper preparation for marriage. Therefore, if this sacrament is a consideration, please contact our office approximately one year in advance and before wedding plans and a date are set.

Convalidations: If you are Catholic and married civilly and would like your marriage recognized by the Catholic Church, the process of receiving the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony is approximately a 6-month process. Please plan ahead and contact our office for more information.



FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION—As is the custom here at St. Faustina, the First Friday Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will be held on Friday, September 2nd following the 8 a.m. Mass (from 8:30 a.m. until 9:30 a.m.). 

El Sacramento del Santo Bautismo

El sacramento del Santo Bautismo generalmente está programado para el tercer fin de semana de cada mes el domingo a las 12:30 PM. Las clases de preparación bautismal generalmente se programan para el tercer jueves de cada mes a las 5:30 PM. La clase de preparación es requerida para padres primerizos o si no hay registro de una clase anterior. No se puede programar una fecha bautismal antes de que se programe la inscripción para la clase de preparación. El espacio de clase es limitado; por favor llame a Marylu en nuestra oficina para registrarse y con preguntas.



El sacramento del Santo Matrimonio es un compromiso serio que no debe tomarse a la ligera o desaconsejadamente. Por lo general, toma de 6 a 12 meses completar la preparación requerida y adecuada para el matrimonio. Por lo tanto, si este sacramento es una consideración, comuníquese con nuestra oficina con aproximadamente un año de anticipación y antes de que se establezcan los planes de boda y una fecha.

St. Ingrid of Sweden

St. Ingrid of Skänninge was a Swedish abbess who became a saint. She founded Skänninge Abbey, a nunnery belonging to the Dominicans, in 1272.


Ingrid was born in Skänninge, Sweden in the thirteenth century. Her father Elof was a nobleman from Östergötland. The family name was *Elofssönernas ätt* and they belonged to the elite of the Swedish nobil-

ity. Ingrid had two brothers, Anders and Johan. Johan was a knight of the Teutonic Order. Kristina Johansdotter was her niece who was the first wife of Birger Persson, who later became the father of St. Bridget of Sweden in his second marriage.

Ingrid was an inspiration to Bridget.

Ingrid married the nobleman Sir Sigge, who died in 1271. Now a widow, Ingrid and her sister Kristina became a part of a circle of holy women who lived under the spiritual directions of the Dominican friar Petrus de Dacia in Skänninge. Petrus de Dacia wrote a letter about the ascetic lifestyle and mystic revelations of one of his "spiritual daughters" in this circle of women, which likely refers to Ingrid.

In 1272, these women formed an informal convent under the leadership of Ingrid, adopting the habit of the Dominicans and practicing its rules. Then Ingrid made pilgrimages to Santiago de Compostela, Jerusalem and Rome. After the death of her sister, Ingrid applied for formal recognition of her convent. This was granted in 1281, a year before her death. The Dominican cloister, located in Skänninge, was named St. Martin. Ingrid was the first Swedish woman to become a nun.



Ingrid died in Skänninge, September 9, 1282, surrounded by an aura of holiness.

After Ingrid's death, many miracles were attributed to her, with people coming to pilgrimages to be near her remains at the convent, but her canonization did not go forward. Her relative, St. Bridget of Sweden was canonized by Pope Boniface IX on October 8, 1391, leading many to ask for Ingrid to become a saint also.

In 1497, her case was reactivated. Soon an application for canonization was made at the Council of Constance. In 1499, Pope Alexander VI agreed to a translation of her remains, which took place in Skänninge Abbey in 1507. But formal canonization never occurred.

Sweden became a Protestant country due to the Reformation which began in 1527 during the reign of King Gustav I of Sweden.

The Swedish Reformation caused the break with the Roman Catholic Church and is considered to be the ending point of the Swedish Middle Ages. This also affected Finland, which was an important part of Sweden at the time.

The canonization process then began, but it was slow and ended at the Uppsala Synod of 1593. The Reformation finally ceased her formal canonization. Even though a Protestant cult came to St. Martin's convent, destroying it and Ingrid's relics, many miracles were still attributed to St. Ingrid.

While she was never formally canonized, St. Ingrid of Sweden is regarded as a saint and is the patron saint of Skänninge.

Her feast day is listed on the liturgical calendar on September 2.
