# PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." (Jn 20:23)

Pentecost is celebrated as the birthday of the Church. When the Apostles were gathered together, the Holy Spirit came to them as a strong wind, descending upon them as tongues of fire. Inspired and empowered by the Spirit, Peter and the others began *And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you* preaching the word. About three thousand persons were baptized that day. The Church was born. Over 2,000 years later, Jesus is still alive in the world and the Spirit continues to work through us, his followers.

Birthdays are often an occasion for gift-giving. Pentecost is no exception. The Holy Spirit bestows abundant spiritual gifts on believers. These gifts may not come in a brightly wrapped box, but their worth is beyond measure. They give us strength when we are weak and courage when we are afraid: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, fear of the Lord, knowledge and piety to devote ourselves to God and open ourselves to his will.

These gifts are freely given and provide all we need to live as children of God. We are called to use these gifts to fortify our faith and serve the Father. These gifts are not meant to be kept hidden or to be used only for our own needs. They are meant to be shared. They are meant to inspire others and invite them to join us in the family of God.

For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, slaves or free persons, and we were all given to drink of one Spirit.(1Cor 12:13)



# CELEBRATING THE FEAST OF PENTECOST

(This article is reprinted from the Catholic News Agency website) This weekend, the Church celebrates Pentecost, one of the most important feast days of the year that concludes the Easter season and celebrates the beginning of the Church.



Here's what you need to know about the feast day:

#### The timing and origins of Pentecost

Pentecost always occurs 50 days after the death and resurrection of Jesus, and ten days after his ascension into heaven. Because Easter is a moveable feast without a fixed date, and Pentecost depends on the timing of Easter, Pentecost can fall anywhere between May 10 and June 13.

The timing of these feasts is also where Catholics get the concept of the Novena - nine days of prayer - because in Acts 1, Mary and the Apostles prayed together "continuously" for nine days after the Ascension leading up to Pentecost. Traditionally, **the Church prays the Novena** to the Holy Spirit in the days before Pentecost.

The name of the day itself is derived from the Greek word "pentecoste," meaning 50th.

There is a parallel Jewish holiday, Shavu`ot, which falls 50 days after Passover. Shavu'ot is sometimes called the festival of weeks, referring to the seven weeks since Passover.

Originally a harvest feast, Shavu`ot now commemorates the sealing of the Old Covenant on Mount Sinai, when the Lord revealed the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai. Every year, the Jewish people renew their acceptance of the gift of the Torah on this feast.

#### What happens at Pentecost?

In the Christian tradition, Pentecost is the celebration of the person of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room.

A "strong, driving" wind filled the room where they were gathered, and tongues of fire came to rest on their heads, allowing them to speak in different languages so that they could understand each other. It was such a strange phenomenon that some people thought the Christians were just drunk - but Peter pointed out that it was only the morning, and said the phenomenon was caused by the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit also gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfill the great commission - to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations. It fulfills the New Testament promise from Christ (Luke 24:46-49) that the Apostles would be "clothed with power" before they would be sent out to spread the Gospel.

#### Where's that in the bible?

The main event of Pentecost (the strong driving wind and tongues of fire) takes place in **Acts 2:13**, though the events immediately following (Peter's homily, the baptism of thousands) continue through verse 41.

#### Happy Birthday, Church

It was right after Pentecost that Peter, inspired by the Holy Spirit, preached his first homily to Jews and other non-believers, in which he opened the scriptures of the Old Testament, showing how the prophet Joel prophesied events and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

He also told the people that the Jesus they crucified is the Lord and was raised from the dead, which "cut them to the heart." When they asked what they should do, Peter exhorted them to repent of their sins and to be baptised. According to the account in Acts, about 3,000 people were baptised following Peter's sermon.

For this reason, Pentecost is considered the birthday of the Church - Peter, the first Pope, preaches for the first time and converts thousands of new believers. The apostles and believers, for the first time, were united by a common language, and a common zeal and purpose to go and preach the Gospel.

# SAINT CHARLES LWANGA & COMPANIONS

Charles Lwanga was born on January 1, 1860 in the Kingdom of Buganda, now part of modern Uganda. He was part of the Baganda tribe. As he grew older, he served as the chief of the royal pages and then as a major domo in the court of King Mwanga II of Buganda, who was a violent ruler and also a pedophile. Charles was interested in Christianity and wanted to convert.



The Society of Missionaries of Africa, known as the White Fathers, came to Uganda six years before and built up a community of converts whose faith would outshine their own. Many of the converts lived in Mwanga's court. Charles learned about Christ from two of them and became a catechumen.

Joseph Mukasa was the chief steward of the court and a Catholic, leading a small community of two hundred Christians. Charles was the assistant to Joseph Mukasa. Joseph told the young pages to resist the advances of Mwanga and also challenged the king for killing an Anglican, which got him killed. As the executioners started to tie Joseph's hands, he told them, "A Christian who gives his life for God is not afraid to die." He forgave Mwanga with all his heart but made one final plea for the king's repentance before he was beheaded and then burned on November 15, 1885.

This encouraged Charles to move further and at the age twenty five, he was baptized on the same day, November 15, 1885 by Pere Giraud. Charles protected many young boys from the king and taught the faith to them as well as resisted the king himself. Mwanga told all converts to abandon their new faiths because he thought the Christian ways would undermine his authority as well as his immoral ways. This led to many executions between 1885 and 1887, which included judges, catechists, soldiers and teen age pages.

On May 25, 1886, Mwanga convened a general assembly of the court to condemn two pages to death. The next day, Charles secretly baptized many young men in his charge, even though they were still catechumens. He inspired them to remain chaste and keep their faith. Later on, Mwanga had all of the pages attend court and asked them to renounce their new faith, which they refused. This caused the king to sentence them to death. Their executions took place on June 3, 1886 in Namugongo.

Twelve Catholic boys and men as well as nine Anglicans were burnt alive. Another Catholic man was clubbed to death and thrown into the furnace. Part of Mwanga's anger at the Christians was their refusal to submit to him, as well as their strong faith.

A secondary motive was to avoid foreign threats to his kingdom, as he felt that the Christians would overtake his country. As Charles was being burnt, he said to the Guardian, "It is as if you are pouring water on me. Please repent and become a Christian like me." In all, twenty two Catholics were martyred by the king.

Charles Lwanga and the others also killed were canonized on October 18, 1964 by Pope Paul VI during the Second Vatican Council. When Pope Paul VI canonized the twenty two martyrs, he commended the Anglican pages who were also martyred. "To honor these African saints, Paul VI became the first reigning pope to visit sub-Saharan Africa when he toured Uganda in July 1969, a visit that included a pilgrimage to the site of the martyrdom at Namugongo."

The Basilica of the Uganda Martyrs was built at the site of the executions, which also serves as their shrine.

The Brothers of St. Charles Lwanga (Luganda: Bannakaroli Brothers) were founded in 1927. This is a native religious congregation of Ugandan men committed to educating the disadvantaged youth of their country.

St. Charles Lwanga and Companion Martyrs are the patron saints of the African Catholic Youth Action, converts and torture victims.




