PASTOR'S MESSAGE / MENSAJE DEL PASTOR

Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up, they filled twelve wicker baskets. (Lk 9:16-17)

As we celebrate this Solemnity of Corpus Christi, or the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we are in many ways like the Gospel crowd. We, too, have come with our hopes and needs to encounter Jesus. Here Jesus creates a Eucharistic world where we can experience his real presence and the hope of something better - for here, too, no lonely hearts go hungry!

Today, and at every Mass, Jesus meets our needs by giving us his unconditional love, nourishing us both physically and spiritually. Here we see why the Church calls the Eucharist "the source and summit of the Christian life" (CCC 1324). It is *source* because Jesus is the source of our faith, and it is *summit* as our faith is ultimately about a sharing in his resurrection and life.

Here we truly receive the same Jesus - his body, blood, soul, and divinity, nourishing us for those lonely moments that are so often part of our human experience, reassuring us that God is always near. Here we are joining the saints and angels in the worship of the One who has loved us without condition. Here in the signs of bread and wine, Christ truly and substantially present meets our most basic needs - to be loved and to be nourished.

For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes. (1Cor 11:26)

Aquí Jesús crea un mundo eucarístico donde podemos experimentar su presencia real y la esperanza de algo mejor, ¡porque aquí, también, ningún corazón solitario pasa hambre!

Hoy, y en cada Misa, Jesús satisface nuestras necesidades dándonos su amor incondicional, alimentándonos tanto física como espiritualmente. Aquí vemos por qué la Iglesia llama a la Eucaristía "la fuente y la cumbre de la vida cristiana" (CIC 1324). Es *la fuente* porque Jesús es la fuente de nuestra fe, y es *la cumbre*, ya que nuestra fe se trata en última instancia de compartir su resurrección y vida.

Aquí realmente recibimos al mismo Jesús: su cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad, alimentándonos para esos momentos solitarios que a menudo son parte de nuestra experiencia humana, asegurándonos que Dios siempre está cerca. Aquí nos estamos uniendo a los santos y ángeles en la adoración de Aquel que nos ha amado sin condiciones. Aquí, en los signos del pan y del vino, Cristo verdadera y sustancialmente presente satisface nuestras necesidades más básicas: ser amados y ser alimentados.

Porque tan a menudo como comes este pan y bebes la copa, proclamas la muerte del Señor hasta que Él venga. (1 Corintios 11:26)

ST. FAUSTINA BLOOD DRIVE CELEBRATES THREE YEARS ON JUNE 26



This month's St. Faustina Blood Drive, being held NEXT SUNDAY, June 26th, from 7:30 am until 12:30 pm. will mark the third anniversary of this ministry.

Since this life-saving ministry started on June 19, 2019, we have donated 305 pints of blood thus saving up to 915 lives. This will be our 17th drive...one was canceled due to

covid...and we have

hit our OneBloodgiven goal in all but one of those drives. This past February

we had 33 parishioners give, a St. Faustina record...surpassing the previous mark of 25, which we hit twice.

OneBlood is once again expected to have two buses in our parking lot to ensure that your contribution takes no more than about one-half hour.



With summer here and visitors coming to Central Florida to enjoy all that the area has to offer, the need for blood is higher than usual. The blood of Jesus saved all of us, we have the opportunity to help save our neighbor. Won't you please prayerfully consider giving.


Fr. James Thoyalil V.C., a Vincentian Missionary Priest from India, will be in our parish on June 25

our page features Daily Devotions, Saint of the Day, and other such inspirational and spiritual information as well as parish news other than the construction.



ST. JOHN FISHER

John Fisher was born in Beverley, Yorkshire, England on October 19, 1469 to a modestly prosperous family. As a young man, he studied at the University of Cambridge, where he received a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1487 and a Master of Arts in 1491. He was elected a fellow of his college and was ordained a priest on December 17, 1491. He was also made Vicar of Northallerton, Yorkshire. In 1494 he resigned and became the proctor of Cambridge and three years later was

appointed Master Debater. Then he became the chaplain and confessor to Margaret Beaufort, Countess of Richmond and Derby and the mother of King Henry VII.

John became a Doctor of Theology on July 5, 1501 and ten days later was elected Vice-Chancellor of the University of Cambridge. He managed Margaret's endowments to both Oxford and Cambridge Universities, promoting the studying of Latin, Greek and Hebrew. He recruited Erasmus to teach. Erasmus said this of John Fisher: "He is the one man at this time who is incomparable for uprightness of life, for learning and for greatness of soul." John was an austere and stern man but was dedicated to his faith and teaching.

In October of 1504, John became the Bishop of Rochester, where he stayed for thirty years. He was also elected the Chancellor of Cambridge University that same year. He was re-elected for this position ten years later, ultimately receiving a lifetime appointment. John then became the tutor of Prince Henry, who would later become King Henry VIII. His first conflict with the new king was over money left from Henry's Grandmother, Lady Margaret. She wanted the funds to go to Cambridge and Henry was opposed this.

Henry had married Catherine of Aragon after her first marriage to Henry's brother Arthur ended. Arthur died before the marriage was consummated. Catherine was Queen of England from June 1509 until May 1533 with Henry. After eighteen years of marriage to Catherine with no male heir and his new attraction for Anne Boleyn, Henry decided that his marriage was cursed because of the Old Testament ban on marrying the widow of one's brother. He felt that he had no sons because of this curse and started thinking about an annulment in 1528. In 1530, Henry asked Pope Clement VII for the annulment,

which the Pope denied. John opposed the annulment by being Catherine's ally at the Legates' court and supporting the supremacy of the Pope. John declared that he was ready to die over this issue the same way that St. John the Baptist felt on behalf of the indissolubility of marriage when John the Baptist opposed Herod's marriage with Herodias, who had been married to his brother Phillip.

Henry was taking money from Catholic institutions which caused John, along with the Bishops of Bath and Ely, to complain to the Pope. Henry then banned any further appeals and the three Bishops were arrested but released shortly. John started secret activities to overthrow Henry. As early as 1531 he began covertly communicating with foreign diplomats. In May 1532, Sir Thomas More, who also could not condone the annulment and break with the Church, resigned as Chancellor and in June, John preached publicly against the annulment.

Thomas Cranmer secretly married Henry and Anne on January 25, 1533, even though Catherine was still Henry's wife.

In March of 1533, Thomas Cranmer was made the Archbishop of Canterbury. John was arrested to prevent him from opposing the divorce from Catherine which Cranmer pronounced on May 23, 1533 and the coronation of Anne to queen which followed on June 1. John was then released after a few weeks. In September 1533, John secretly communicated with the imperial ambassador to encourage the Holy Roman Emperor Charles V to invade England and depose Henry as King, but this never happened. Over time, John was condemned to forfeit all of his personal estate and to be imprisoned but was given a pardon when he paid a fine of 300 pounds.

On March 23, 1534, Parliament passed the Act of Succession. Henry wanted all clergy to sign this document acknowledging that Anne was the queen and that her children would be the legitimate heirs to the throne. All signed except John, who was defrocked, removed as a bishop and was imprisoned in the Tower of London on April 26, 1534, where he stayed for over a year. Sir Thomas More was also at the Tower with him. Henry then became the head of the Church of England on November 3, 1534 through The Act of Supremacy.

In May of 1535, Pope Paul III made John a Cardinal, which infuriated Henry causing him to accuse John of treason. John was beheaded on June 22, 1535.

John Fisher, Thomas More and fifty two other English martyrs were beatified by Pope Leo XIII on December 29, 1886 and St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More were canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 19, 1935. Their feast day is June 22.

St. John Fisher is credited with writing twenty six works, most of which are treatises. He is the patron saint of Rochester NY, the Catholic Foundation and many parishes and universities which are named for him.


