

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER CARLOS - UN MENSAJE DE PADRE CARLOS

My Dear Family of St. Faustina,

On this Fourth Sunday of the Lenten Season (Laetare Sunday – Joy), joy is reborn, because God has been great with us; all because greater than our actions or merits is the Love that God has poured out on us through Jesus. What a joy to know that we have almost reached the great feast of Easter, and that is why this weekend the Church makes us reflect on the great love that God has for us. Love that is the main reason for our joy.

The Word of God, in the first reading taken from the Second Book of Chronicles, places us before his exile to Babylon, and his return from captivity. The Israelites had been unfaithful to God and his covenant and had not listened to the prophets. For that reason they lost their temple and their homeland and became slaves. But God, who is merciful, after 70 years gives them back their freedom and they built a temple that is a symbol of God's presence, of his love and mercy. In the second reading, Paul tells us about our salvation. God's love is so great that through Him we are alive with Christ and dead to sin. Faith is a gift from God. Our response to this great gift must be conversion.



The Gospel of John brings us especially close today to the scene of Golgotha. Jesus tells Nicodemus that when the Son of Man is lifted up, all will lay their lives in Him. It uses the simile of the bronze serpent that Moses raised to rid the Jewish people of poison. The Gospel reminds us of that great truth of faith that He, God, loved the world to the point of giving His only Son, so that we might all be saved. That truth of Faith fills us all with Hope.

Brothers and sisters, it would be very good for us to reflect on how we are responding to God's love in the remainder of Lent. Let us respond with faith, surrender and prayer. In these times when everything seems confusing, uncertain and discouraging, nothing prevents each of us from introducing a little love into the world. That's what Jesus did. There's no waiting for anything, let's do it. That builds the Church of Jesus, the Church of love. Holy Week is approaching and the Mystery of the Cross is already opening up close to us. Animo!

Let us not forget to continue to accompany our catechumens with our prayers in this process towards the sacraments of Christian initiation. This week through the weekly challenge we will have the opportunity to evangelize. How? You must invite someone who is far from God and/or His Holy Church to return home. How? More information in the Bulletin...

Mi querida familia de Santa Faustina,

En este IV Domingo del Tiempo Cuaresmal (Domingo de Laetare – Alegría), renace la alegría, pues Dios ha estado grande con nosotros; todo porque más grande que nuestras acciones o méritos es el Amor que Dios ha derramado en nosotros por Jesús. Que alegría saber que ya casi llegamos a la gran fiesta de la Pascua, y por eso este fin de semana la Iglesia nos pone a reflexionar en el gran amor que Dios nos tiene. Amor que es la razón principal de nuestra alegría.

La Palabra de Dios, en la primera lectura tomada del Segundo Libro de las Crónicas nos ubica antes del destierro a Babilonia, y su retorno de la cautividad. Los Israelitas habían sido infieles a Dios y a su alianza y no había escuchado a los profetas. Por esa razón perdieron su templo y su patria y se convirtieron en esclavos. Pero Dios que es misericordioso, después de 70 años les devuelve la libertad y construyeron un templo símbolo de la presencia de Dios, de su amor y misericordia. En la segunda lectura, Pablo nos habla sobre nuestra salvación. El amor de Dios es tan y tan grande que por El estamos vivos con Cristo y muertos al pecado. La Fe es un don de Dios. Nuestra respuesta a ese gran don debe ser de la conversión.

El Evangelio de San Juan nos acerca hoy especialmente a la escena del Gólgota. Jesús dice a Nicodemo que cuando el Hijo del Hombre sea elevado todos pondrán su vida en El. Utiliza el símil de la serpiente de bronce que Moisés elevó para librarse al pueblo judío del veneno. El Evangelio nos recuerda esa gran verdad de Fe que Él, Dios, amó al mundo hasta el extremo de entregar a su Hijo Único, con el fin que todos nos salváramos. Esa verdad de Fe nos llena a todos de Esperanza.

Hermanos y hermanas, sería muy bueno que en lo que nos queda de la Cuaresma reflexiones en cómo estamos respondiendo a ese amor de Dios. Respondamos con fe, con entrega y oración. En estos momentos en que todo parece confuso, incierto y desalentador, nada nos impide a cada uno introducir un poco de amor en el mundo. Es lo que hizo Jesús. No hay que esperar a nada, hagámoslo. Eso construye la Iglesia de Jesús, la Iglesia del amor. La Semana Santa se acerca y el Misterio de la Cruz se abre ya cerca de nosotros. ¡Ánimo!

No olvidemos seguir acompañando con nuestra oración a nuestros catecúmenos en este proceso hacia los sacramentos de iniciación cristiana. Esta semana a través del reto semanal tendremos la oportunidad de evangelizar. ¿Cómo? Debes invitar a alguien que está lejos de Dios y/o de Su Santa Iglesia a regresar a casa. ¿Cómo? Mas información en el Boletín...







After being investigated as a Servant of God, the next step is to be called Venerable. The following is a list of Americans who have moved up to this designation.

Eusebio Francesco Chini (1645–1711) - Professed Priest of the Jesuits.

Pierre Toussaint (1766–1853) - Married layperson of the Archdiocese of New York.

Félix Varela Morales (1788–1853) - Priest of the Archdiocese of San Cristóbal de La Habana.

Rafael Cordero Molina (1790–1868) - Layperson of the Archdiocese of San Juan de Puerto Rico.

Frederic Irenaeus Baraga (1797–1868) - Bishop of Marquette.

Samuel Charles Mazzuchelli (1806–1864) - Professed Priest of the Dominicans and Founder of the Dominican Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary of Sinsinawa.

Cornelia Peacock Connelly (1809–1879) - Founder of the Society of the Holy Child Jesus.

Henriette DeLille (1813–1862) - Founder of the Sisters of the Holy Family of New Orleans.

Nelson Baker (1842–1936) - Priest of the Diocese of Buffalo, New York.

Augustus Tolton (1854–1897) - Priest of the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Józefina Dudzik (Mary Therese) (1860–1918) - Founder of the Franciscan Sisters of Chicago.

Teresa Fardella di Blasi (1867–1957) – Widow. Founder of the Poor Daughters of the Crowned Virgin.

Kasimira Kaupas (Maria) (1880–1940) - Founder of the Sisters of Saint Casimir.

Augustin Arnaud Pagès (Nymphas Victorin) (1885–1966) - Professed Religious of the Brothers of the Christian Schools (De La Salle Brothers).

Norbert McAuliffe (1886–1959) - Professed Religious of the Brothers of the Sacred Heart.

María Consuelo Sanjurjo Santos (María Soledad) (1892–1973) - Professed Religious of the Servants of Mary, Ministers of the Sick.

Bridget Teresa McCrory (Mary Angeline Teresa) (1893–1984) - Founder of the Carmelite Sisters for the Aged and Infirm.

Fulton John Sheen (1895–1979) - Bishop of Rochester and Titular Archbishop of Newport.

Celestina Bottego (1895–1980) - Founder of the Xaverian Missionary Sisters.

William Gagnon (1905–1972) - Professed Religious of the Hospitaller Brothers of Saint John of God.

Antonietta Giugliano (1909–1960) - Cofounder of the Little Servants of Christ the King .

Patrick Peyton (1909–1992) - Professed Priest of the Congregation of Holy Cross.

Aloysius Schwartz (1930–1992) - Priest of the Archdiocese of Manila and Founder of the Sisters of Mary of Banneux and the Brothers of Christ.

Mario Hiriat Pulido (1931–1964) - Layperson of the Archdiocese of Santiago de Chile. Member of the Secular Institute of the Schöenstatt Brothers of Mary.

Alphonse Gallegos (1931–1991) - Professed Religious of the Augustinian Recollects, Titular Bishop of Sasabe and Auxiliary Bishop of Sacramento.

They are all on the road to sainthood.
